#### Hartland Schools Person of the Month: Katie Butzier

Katie Butzier is a 2nd grade teacher at Village Elementary School. She attended Central Michigan University and earned a Child Development Major with a Math and Reading Minor in 2003. She received her Master's Degree from Marygrove College in 2007. Katie has taken many continuing education courses throughout her career and is currently a part of the 2nd cohort for Assessment Literacy Training, participated in the Math curriculum team, ICT and is the Social Emotional Learning Co-Chairperson at Village. Following is Katie's "story" in her own words.



I started working at the Hartland Community Education Childcare center during my college years and began teaching in Hartland in August 2004 at Village Elementary. This is my 14th year of teaching.

My family moved to Hartland in 1988 from Westland. It was an adjustment to move from city life to the country. I started attending Hartland Schools in the 4th grade and graduated in 1999. Hartland has sure changed since I graduated! I remember the high school being next to a corn field and Hartland consisted of a Food Town, Bucky's Pharmacy, and the Oasis truck stop. I have been married to my husband, Paul, for 14 years. He teaches math at Hartland High School. We have 2 boys, James, who is 12, and Cullen, who is 7. We also have a black Great Dane named Darby. We spend a lot of our time at the baseball, soccer, and football fields, as well as the wrestling mats with our 2 boys. They are both very active.

One funny moment was my first year of teaching, which was Junior Kindergarten. I was sitting at a table and had a set of twin boys in my class. I was sitting between them and one was saying something and I responded with "you are pulling my leg". The brother got out of the chair and looked under the table and said, "pull her leg, pull her leg". I just laughed. Little ones often do not understand sarcasm. I had so many funny moments that first year of teaching, and I continue to teach because of the small moments that happen every day. I can pinpoint a million events, but it is the events that happen in a split second, that if you blink you will miss. These are the moments that remind me of why I picked the teaching profession.

I still enjoy working in Hartland because of the students. They are the reason that I go to work each day, ready for a challenge. Each day is unexpected and different. I also enjoy the people that I work with. I work with an amazing staff. The collaboration, the teamwork, and the friendships are incredible. I could not do my job without those people. They have helped shape me into the teacher I am today.

I believe in what Hartland and Hartland Schools offer for a family – a strong sense of community. We live here, work here, and our children are involved in many different activities offered throughout the district. As I was preparing to graduate from college, I knew this was the town I wanted to come back to and raise my family. I work with amazing students and staff each day. Hartland is home

#### Meet the 2018 Grand Marshal of the Hartland Memorial Day Parade

The Hartland Area Community Council is honored to introduce the Grand Marshal of the 2018 Memorial Day Parade, Raymond R. Blush Sr.

Ray was born in Detroit in 1922. He was a graduate of St. Phillip Neri High School in Detroit where he lettered in football and baseball. He was also a competitive bowler. He married his wife Evelyn in December 1943, while he was serving in the United States Army. Evelyn passed in early 2000.




Ray served in the US Army from 1943 to 1946. He served initially in California, followed by Colorado Springs and finally in the Philippines. The Battle of Leyte in the Philippines lasted over two months, beginning with the amphibious invasion of the island. It ended when the US Army with the help of Filipino guerrillas wrested control of the island back from the Japanese. The Japanese controlled the island for several years before the battle started. This was under the command of General Douglas MacArthur who kept his promise of "I shall return" when the island was taken early in the war by the Japanese.

Prior to his military service, Ray attended Wilber Wright Trade School, and was employed by LaSalle Machine Tool working first as a tool and die maker. The company expanded to include a Fenton Division, where Ray was named Vice President and General Manager. It was at this time that Ray and his family moved from Detroit to Hartland. He was one of the first residents on Long Lake in 1970. He helped establish the Long Lake Preservation Association for the environmental protection of Long Lake. He has been an active member of St. John Catholic Church in Howell, where he served as an usher for 41 years. Annually he and his grandchildren place American Flags on the grave sites of veterans at the Parish Cemetery. He is a member of the American Legion Post 415 of Hartland and looks forward to their weekly breakfast at the Hartland Big Boy. Ray is a member of the 69ers Club and the Hartland Senior Center. Ray has one son, Raymond Blush Jr. who resides in Brighton. Rav's four grandchildren and 10 great grandchildren gather annually at Ray's home on Long Lake each summer to enjoy the fireworks.

Ray wants to express his gratitude for being selected this year's Grand Marshal. He

also wants to express his thanks to the Hartland Area Council, the sponsors and organizations, clubs, volunteers etc. who dedicate their time and enthusiasm to make the Hartland Memorial Day Parade and activities possible every year. Ray has marched in many previous Hartland Memorial Day Parades as a veteran. He always loves and remembers the children's smiles as the parade passes by.

Ray, our country and community owe YOU the thanks. Author/journalist Tom Brokow has described your generation as "The Greatest Generation". You and your entire generation lived through the Great Depression, fought in World War II or labored at jobs at home to win the war. Without those efforts, we may not be celebrating the holiday of Memorial Day each and every year.

## If punishment does not work, what does? Catch them doing something right

As I promised in my article from last month "You cannot punish a child into good behavior" here is my follow up– <u>REWARDING APPROXIMATIONS OF SUCCESS</u> and <u>CATCH THEM DOING SOMETHING RIGHT.</u>

Before I reveal more about these two techniques it might be good to first tell you the reasons most parents do not use them.

First, when we approach our jobs as parents like we are teachers or trainers we naturally tend to gravitate toward "correcting" them. We fall into a habit of waiting until they do something incorrectly then step in and show them the right way. Isn't this what teaching is all about?

Second, just correcting is easier. You only have to watch for those few times they make a mistake and quickly give them feedback.

Rewarding Approximation of Success and Catching Them Doing Something Right will take hard work, patience and consistency.

Two "Approximation of Success" stories...

Do you remember when your first child took her/his first steps? She first tried to stand up and fell but you just kept encouraging her to try again. Finally after many attempts she takes her first two steps then tumbles to the ground. You run up with tears in your eyes, hugging and kissing your child. So, proud of her trying and succeeding! What if instead when she stumbled after her first step you said "Oh no! What is wrong with you! Get up! All the other kids can walk?!"

Do you know how they train dolphins to do those spectacular jumps over a rope 20 feet in the air? Initially the trainer places a rope at the bottom of the tank, after they give the command and the dolphin goes over the rope they get a treat. Then slowly over weeks they raise the rope until it is out of the water. But what if instead the trainer started with the rope 20 feet out of the water and punished the dolphin when did not jump?



In both cases, would the baby try to walk again or the dolphin even want to get near that rope? Yet this is what we often do once a child is older. We suddenly expect so much so fast. Particularly at the beginning of something new we forget to reward incremental improvements along the path of learning. You will instill a "growth mindset" by learning to reward approximations of success by praising and rewarding effort, choices and the process a child uses instead of simply the end result. This will develop their desire to learn and motivation to always give it their best.

Catching them doing something right goes right along the same lines. Do you remember from last month's article what always breaks my heart to hear from a struggling child? "Sensei, everybody is always yelling at me?"

It seems to them like they can't do anything right? It might make more sense I will relate this to you at work. Let's say you have a great day and do nine things really well and your boss lets you know he is happy. But you have one simple task near the end of the day you mess up on and the boss is mad. Even though you did those nine good things what is the only thing you remember? It takes 20, 30 or 40 good things to erase the bad thing. It is the same for your child.

A child may do something well 9 out of ten times. Or, do something correctly 90% of the time but what do we spend most of our time focusing or criticizing them about? The one time or the 10%. So try this instead. Go out of your way to recognize and catch the nine times or the 90%.

Watch for them doing something right and I bet that 90% goes up!

#### If You Own a Puppy or Dog, You Need a License!

The State of Michigan requires all dogs aged **four months and older** to be licensed. Hartland Township processes county dog licenses as a service to its residents, either in person at Township Hall, or by mail.

For requirements and pricing, go to **www.HartlandTwp.com** and type **'Dog'** in the search box. The cost is reasonable, and service dog licenses are free. *Helpful reminders from the Treasurer's office*:

- Make sure you bring (or mail) a copy of the actual rabies certificate signed by your vet, and NOT just the office receipt.
- Bring proof that your dog has been spayed or neutered the license will be less expensive!
