

How can parents help students have a great year?

Last year, 221 Hartland students accumulated more than15 absences from school for a variety of reasons. The federal government labels this "chronic absenteeism." While district personnel understand that medical and family issues arise, the reality is that very few of the 221 students encountered such issues. In the event that medical and/or family issues do arise, we ask that parents communicate this with the school office staff so that teachers and support personnel can help support the child throughout the ordeal. Support might include guiding the parent through the process of documenting the illness or family crisis and creating a plan for catching up on missed work.

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The research on chronic absenteeism clearly indicates achievement issues for those students missing large amounts of instruction time for any reason, whether it be family vacation time, illness, school suspension, etc. School administrators will work closely with families when students are missing school.

Intervention will include letters from the school informing parents about a pattern of absences and, if not corrected, intervention with administration, the district security officer, and potentially the county truancy officer. As a school district, we want the best for our students and will work hard to plan engaging learning opportunities. The expectation is that the students are present to benefit from this effort.


2017 National School Bus Safety Week October 16 – 20, 2017

The MiStar Parent Portal provides each parent access to his or her child's student data including attendance, academic records, progress reports, lunch account, and more.

Each parent may request his or her own PIN and password to access the portal.

After you have registered your child, you should automatically receive an email within 24 hours containing your Parent Portal PIN and password. In the event that you do not receive this email, please follow the instructions below.

Send an email to pc@hartlandschools.us preferably from the email account you provided Hartland Schools upon registration of your child.

In the subject line, type Parent Portal PIN & password request.

List all your children currently enrolled in Hartland Schools, by their legal name.

After each child's name, indicate the building in which he or she is enrolled. Be sure to indicate your legal name as the parent making the request. Send the email.

A personal PIN and password will be emailed to you within 48 hours. We recommend you keep the PIN and Password in a safe place. You have the ability to change your password so that it is something easier for you to remember. If you forget your password, simply submit another email to pc@hartlandschools.





Do You Have A Senior?

By the end of October your senior should have completed an application to one post-secondary institution, applied for at least one scholarship and completed the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Counselors and teachers at HHS will be giving your student a tremendous amount of support with these daunting tasks. Senior English teachers are currently helping students write their application essays and will be helping students write scholarship essays. The Counseling Office is hosting Michigan Application Month throughout October. This program includes a variety of events, including application assistance for all seniors during the week of October 16th.

TARDY TO SCHOOL POLICY


Please help your child do his or her best. Attendance is a crucial factor for student academic success.



Ms. Erehart will be teaching 2nd grade. She hails from Missouri and recently returned for a yearlong teaching assignment in Korea.


Mrs. Barker will be teaching kindergarten. She taught several years in Utah and is happy to return to the teaching ranks.

E.A.G.L.E.S.

Social emotional learning is an area that each school in Hartland works on developing with our students. Social emotional learning involves helping teach students how to understand and manage emotions, set and achieve positive goals, feel and show empathy for others, establish and maintain positive relationships, and make responsible decisions. These are what we consider important life skills. One goal of the entire Hartland district this year is to implement a common language for all staff and students to use throughout the district. In the past, Lakes has used the 7 Habits language as a way to help build a school culture that promotes social emotional growth.



Starting this year, every school in the district is using the

same common language based on the E.A.G.L.E.S. concept. Students and staff will be working throughout the year on learning the new common language that I've outlined below. Lakes will continue to meet with our family groups, provide leadership opportunities for our students, and begin to embed this new common language throughout the classroom and school in an effort to have each of our students gain these valuable skills. Principal Howerton will be sending out updates throughout the year on our work in this area.

E=Empathy—The ability to understand and share the feelings of another.

A=Achievement—A thing done successfully, typically by effort, courage, or skill. G=Grit—Perseverance and passion for a long term goal.

L=Link—A relationship between two things or situations, especially where one thing affects the other.

E=Empower—Make someone stronger and more confident, especially in controlling their life and claiming their rights.

S=Serve—To be worthy of reliance or trust. To help persons and be favorable, opportune, or convenient.

LOC Student Run Credit Union

In 1995, LOC Federal Credit Union opened its first student-run credit union in Farmington Hills. Today, LOC is a proud partner with Farmington Public Schools, Hartland Consolidated Schools, and the Howell Public School District and operates 21 in-school branches. Our in-school program and this community partnership strengthen student advancement as a result of exposure to positive community role models.



Lakes student-run credit unions are managed by 4th grade students with the supervision of an LOC employee. Student employees gain hands-on experience

on how to run a branch and they perform duties of the various positions available at a financial institution. They are also taught real-life work skills.

Not only does this program teach valuable skills to students working the credit union, this also gives all students real-life lessons in savings and finance. All students, staff, and parents at Lakes are eligible to open an LOC account through the student-run credit union.

Lakes Student Run Credit Union is open Thursday mornings from 10:00 a.m. – 10:30 a.m. and operates under the direction of Stephanie Cole, Youth & Community Development Coordinator at LOC. More details to follow.

IS YOUR CHILD BEING BULLIED?

PARENTS OFTEN NEVER KNOW!

Dear Fellow Parents,

Bullying can range from severe physical abuse to very mild "silent treatment" or exclusion by friends. Both can have long lasting and devastating affects on children. Many parents never know about the mild and moderate bullying of their child.

According to the book Bullies and Victims in Schools; 96% of children will be bullied at least once in their lifetime. 46% of those children will suffer poor grades or will abstain from extra curricular activities because of the bullying. 2% of those children will commit suicide because of constant harassment from classmates.

Is your child being bullied? Look for these signs in your child:

1. Bruises, cuts, scratches, torn clothing that cannot be explained and complaints about not feeling well.

2. Reluctance to go to school or requests to change school.

3. Books, money, lunch or belongings stolen, damaged, scattered around or "lost".

4. Excuses to avoid going to school, or insistence that you take him/ her to school even though you live close by.

5. Insomnia or bed-wetting.

6. Frequent requests for money.

7. A sudden, unexplained deterioration in class work, and/or homework.

8. Lack of participation in school activities, staying near the teacher during breaks.

9. Anxiety, insecurity, distress, unhappiness, secretiveness, mood changes and anger.

10. Claims of "I'm okay" when questioned about obvious unhappiness. 11. Low self-esteem.

12. Unhappiness at the end of weekends or school vacations.

13. Few friends or no friends in class and is not invited to birthday parties or other social activities.

14. Teasing or being laughed at by his/her peer group.

Bullying is a very difficult problem to stop. Our mission at Ohana Karate is to ensure every child has the right to feel safe and develop to their full potential. I feel that it is our responsibility to be a community leader and center for the fight against bullying. Can this crisis be stopped?

First, we must develop an ethos in which bullying is always unacceptable and will not be tolerated. Second, it takes a whole community to save our children. We must arm the victim, bully, bystander, parents, schools and community with the anti-bullying tools and systems. Please contact us if we can help you or your family.


