# Superintendent's Message Chuck Hughes, Superintendent

Here's wishing everyone in the community a wonderful Holiday Season and Happy New Year! All I ask is that you take the time to be empathetic to the situation others find themselves in and reach out where you can. During my 18 years in Hartland, I have found that time and time again, this community rises up to take care of those who could use a helping hand.



## **Sinking Fund Update:**

I am happy to report that the district is moving forward to address upgrades and improvements to facilities and the passage of the Building and Site Sinking Fund in May will be extremely helpful. While we will not be collecting the millage until the winter tax collection cycle, we are continuing to address facility components that need to be done now.

Since June, we have resurfaced the Creekside and Round parking lots in an effort to get a longer life out of them, updated our portable building at Round, replaced lighting on the youth field at the Hartland Educational Support Service Center, updated a restroom near the Senior Center to ensure that it is more handicap accessible, and have begun engineering work on an exterior wall at Lakes that is experiencing some structural deficiencies.

My plan is to continue sharing the work being done as we start utilizing sinking fund dollars for upgrades and improvements such as these. Unfortunately, many of the upgrades and improvements that are slated to occur may not be noticed by the public, such as replacement of water lines, boilers, and roofing.

Technology is also a part of the equation, and right now the first thing that we will be addressing is replacement of the sound systems in our elementary schools and Farms Intermediate.

This work will center on the individual classroom sound amplification systems so that teachers can be heard by all students.

# Hartland Schools Person of the Month

Glynn McHugh is Hartland's Network Administrator, as well as one of our computer technicians. He began his career here in 2014 as a computer tech and has become invaluable in essentially "everything technology-related". He has an Associates Degree in Network Administration from Mott Community College, VMware VCP Training, and various CompTIA Certifications; working in the technology field for the past 13 years. He began his career at the age of 17 working at a local computer store in Flint called ATR Computers. He then worked at Carman Ainsworth Schools in Flint for two years as a Computer technician prior to joining the Hartland Technology Team.



Since beginning his career in Hartland as a computer technician, his role has changed drastically. He is now a Network Administrator / Computer Tech and his daily activities include maintaining / updating HCS Servers, switches, VDI virtual computers, close help desk tickets, working with the tech students at the high school (favorite part) and dealing with most technology emergencies that happen throughout the district. He also works with the LESA Network Engineer, Dave Larson, learning how other districts are operating and how to implement new systems and technology into our district.

A little of Glynn's life, history and thoughts in his own words: "I was born in Flint and graduated from Kearsley High School. I currently reside in Fenton where I live with my beautiful girlfriend, Tyler, and my cat, Leith. We like to explore the town and go to new places we have never been before on our weekends. I also like to play games, hang out, and catch some TV / Netlfix. I have been working at the Hartland PDC auditorium for the past two years, where I run sound, lights, setup, and manage events that are held at the SSC. I also helped start a program at the High School where we train students to help with the tech department. I currently have four students that help out on a daily basis and after school."

"Every day in technology is a memorable moment, however, it is especially rewarding when the tech students graduate from high school. It has become a tradition to meet them on each floor as they walk through the building on their graduation walk and then take a selfie with the seniors. Many of these students start as Freshman and work in technology throughout their time at the high school. It is a fun way to celebrate how much they have learned and evolved throughout their years at the high school."

"I am still at Hartland because I love the people, the area, and the variety of what I do. Each work day is rarely the same as the day before. I get to work in different buildings with various projects and people. I get the biggest kick out of working with the tech students. It feels so amazing when you see a student grow out of their comfort zone, learning new skills and adapting them in their everyday life. I wouldn't trade it for anything!"

"I have visited many school districts in my time in technology and no school has made me feel at home as much as Hartland. I have made more friends in my four years here than in my whole life! The staff and students go out of their way to make me feel appreciated. But most of all, I work with the best team in technology! My success is thanks to them."



With the winter months upon us it is always good to review bus stop safety tips to ensure a safe and pleasant trip to school.

### At the Bus Stop

- Allow extra time in the morning to get to your bus on time.
- Wear bright clothing so the bus driver and other motorists can see you in the early morning and late evening
- Stand away from where the bus stops. Buses need extra room to stop when there is snow and ice.
- Dress properly. Winter clothing, hats, mittens and boots will help keep you warm.

### Waiting at the Bus Stop

- Don't play in the snow while waiting for the bus.
- Don't throw snowballs at the bus or others.
- Don't slide on the snow or ice patches in driveways or on the street. You could slide under the wheel of the bus or onto the street and get hurt.
- Don't push or shove around the bus. Someone could fall down on the ice and get hurt.

### **Boarding and Exiting**

Do use the handrail when boarding or exiting the bus to prevent slipping and injuring
yourself on icy road surfaces or steps.

### Running Late in the Morning

Don't try to catch the bus at another stop with your vehicle if your students miss their pickup. Take them all the way to school. The bus driver may not see the car in back of the bus
and as the students attempt to run along the side of the bus to board, they may fall
underneath the wheels and be injured.

### What You Need to File the FAFSA

- 1. Go to the right website!
  - The FAFSA application can be found at <a href="www.fafsa.ed.gov">www.fafsa.ed.gov</a>. The FAFSA is the FREE Application for Federal Student Aid. If you are on a website that tries to charge you, it is a scam.
  - For special circumstances, there is a paper FAFSA that can be printed out and completed; however we do not suggest you file on paper because it takes several weeks to process and is harder to complete.
- 2. Set up your FSA ID before you file
  - Students and one parent (for dependent students) will need an FSA ID, which includes a user name and password, in order to file a FAFSA. This is used both to log in and as your electronic signature on the FAFSA.
  - Make sure to keep this information in a secure location or choose something that you will
    easily remember as you will need it to make any changes on the FAFSA, file the FAFSA in the
    future, and fill out information to receive loans at www.studentloans.gov.
  - It generally takes 1-3 for the FSA ID to become fully operational, so it is a good idea to do
    this process at least a few days before starting the FAFSA.
  - Please note the that the FSA ID has replaced the PIN number on all federal websites

There are many things you will either need to know or need in-hand in order to fill out the FAFSA and to create your FSA ID. This will include:

Social security number (both student and parent[s])
Driver's license (if any) or state ID
Permanent resident receipt card (If applicable)
W-2 forms and other 2016 records of money earned
2016 income tax return

Records of child support paid

Records of taxable earning from Federal work study or other need-based work programs

Records of student grant, scholarship, and fellowship aid, including

AmeriCorps awards, that was included in student or parent AGI

Current stock, bond, and other investment records

Current business and farm records

Current bank statements

Many students will not need all of these documents. What exactly is needed for each individual student depends on income and other factors, <u>but all students will need social security numbers</u>, W-2s, and tax forms.



# Is Your Child Strong Enough?

**Raising Strong and Kind Children** 

We recently congratulated 24 new junior black belts after their day long Black Belt Camp. At the ceremony their parents received a symbolic black belt keychain to remind them – "Behind every black belt child are black belt parents!". At the end I reflected with all the parents why we were there and why we do this crazy thing called karate for so long. I said after many years working closely with parents and educators one thing has really struck me more and more with time – We need to develop much STRONGER kids!

And, don't mean physically stronger. The world is changing. And, the rate of change is increasing rapidly. Today's children are much different than we were at their age. They are under more stress and anxiety. But on the flip side, mainly due to technology and parents unknowing over protecting them, they are getting everything too quick and too easy. We come to their rescue and do everything for them including solving their problems and doing the work they should do. We are shielding them from all the good stresses they need to be success and happy adults. And who can blame us. We want the best for our children. But listen to and remember this "You want your child to live a good life, but not an easy life."

Two recent changes in today's children illustrate this point. First, did you know many teens and even young adults in their 20's do not want to get their driver's license or drive? Remember when we could not wait to get this freedom! Teens today do not want to drive for two reasons: It is too hard and stressful, and they already have their parents driving them around anywhere they want. Something happening similar to this is increasing trend for children to continue living at home well into adulthood.

The second change could be titled "Where are all the paperboys?" Remember when the newspaper was delivered by young boys wanting to work and earn money? We have become so afraid and paranoid our children will be abducted. Kids today are not playing outside anymore. Many stay inside their homes or backyards. Parents have to arrange "play dates" to bring children together outside of school. Here is probably one of the most eye-opening trends. Remember when teens used to hang out in the malls? They do not anymore. Instead the way teens socialize is in their bedrooms on their smartphones?

So back to the black belt camp ceremony. I told the parents, we (both the dojo and them as parents) are on a mission. We need to develop stronger kids. They need to be able to do hard things and endure setbacks. They need to stick with things and get right back up after being knocked down. They need to learn to never give up and never be afraid to try something new or hard. They need to experience the good stresses of fear, boredom, hardship and failure daily. This is the only way we can have kids that are ready to succeed in today's new world. We need to let them skin their knees and eat dirt. It is not only okay but it is good for them!



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
