Safe Town Enrollment

Safe Town is an early childhood safety education program and is designed for children entering pre-Kindergarten, Kindergarten or First Grade in the fall of 2018. Children learn all aspects of safety through projects, songs, games and presentations and plays.

Part of each day is spent "In the Town" with some of the children being pedestrians and some as the drivers (of 14" or 16" two wheel bikes with training wheels). PLEASE HAVE YOUR CHILD BRING IN THEIR HELMET WITH THEIR NAME ON IT.

This program teaches bus safety, electricity and water safety, dog safety, stranger safety, bike safety and much more. Presenters come each day, crafts supporting the daily theme are completed and children get important information about starting school.

The sessions meet for one week for 4 hours per day. Children should bring their own lunch (nut-free) with a beverage each day.

KINDERGARTEN ORIENTATION

A Kindergarten Orientation will be held on Saturday, February 17, 2018, from 10:00 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. at the Hartland Educational Support Service Center, 9525 Highland Road.

The orientation will provide parents an opportunity to hear from kindergarten teachers about a "typical" school day and the kindergarten curriculum. In addition, administrators will be on hand to talk about school safety, transportation, school attendance areas, student nutrition, and answer questions. This will be a family-oriented event and you are encouraged to bring your kindergarten child(ren).

Hartland Consolidated Schools will be accepting kindergarten enrollment packets beginning **February 1, 2018** at the Board of Education office and each elementary school office during office hours. Enrollment packets can also be downloaded from our website at www.hartlandschools.us.

In addition to the enrollment packet, the following documents must be presented when registering:

- Original birth certificate with seal, plus a copy for school records
- Immunization records with proof of DTP, Polio, MMR, Hepatitis B, Chicken Pox vaccines (or proof of having illness), and vision screening, plus copy of same for school records
- Proof of residency using one of the following: certificate of occupancy, purchase agreement, builder's permit, rent receipt or agreement, mortgage statement/receipt, voter registration cared, utility bill, driver's license

Children are eligible for enrollment in kindergarten in August 2018 if they will have their fifth (5th) birthday on or before September 1, 2018. A child who turns 5 after September 1st and before December 1, 2018 may enroll if parent/legal guardian signs a waiver and is supported by the school district.

A full-day Junior Kindergarten program may be offered. A minimum number of students are required for the program to be made available. Parent may need to provide transportation in order to participate. The age requirements for Junior Kindergarten are the same as for the regular Kindergarten program. 

Loading and Unloading Safely

- Students are expected to be at their designated stop 5 minutes prior to the scheduled stop time.
- STAY on your own side of the road -10 feet off the roadway, in a single row.
- WAIT until the bus has come to a complete stop, the red overhead lights are activated, and the DRIVER DISPLAYS

Danger Zones Around the School Bus

- The "Danger Zone" is the area surrounding the bus where it's difficult to see children in the bus mirrors.
- 20 feet in front, 10 feet behind and 10 feet on each side of the school bus.

THE YELLOW SAFETY SIGNAL **BEFORE APPROACHING THE BUS.** When crossing the road, CHECK traffic both ways – then check again and walk 10 feet in front of the bus. The bus driver needs to see the student and the student needs to see the bus driver.

All Seniors Are Encouraged To File For Financial Aid

Hartland High School is aiming for the senior class to have a 100% completion rate of the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). It has been proven that students who fill out the FAFSA are more likely to follow through on their post-secondary plans, and many schools no longer give out merit scholarships to students who do not apply for financial aid through the FAFSA.

If you have not yet applied for financial assistance, it's not too late. Students/parents should go to www.fafsa.gov to complete their application. The process is free and can make a tremendous difference in your child's ability to pay for their postsecondary education. In order to encourage FAFSA completion, the high school Counseling Office has partnered with Buffalo Wild Wings. Any senior who has completed their FAFSA is eligible for free wings! Seniors should stop by the Counseling Office for more information.

Parents who are looking for additional resources to help pay for their child's post-secondary education should know that the HS Counseling Office publishes a monthly scholarship newsletter called the Scholarship Gazette. The newsletter contains all of our current scholarship applications and contains a list of sites that will help you conduct scholarship searches. 



Normally my monthly column is about parenting or raising kids but this time it is about something just as important – YOU!

I tell parents "Karate is even better for adults than kids!" Why? In short first - we all need a way to keep living our life on the "edge" instead of just feeling like we are going through the motions every day. Second - we need a vehicle to grow then feel strong and alive. Third - we all need a "purpose" in our life and a "tribe" to share it with.

What prompted me was this recent email:

"After my son, Noah, started at the dojo I thought about doing karate myself. It took a few months but I started! I was SO nervous the first day, but quickly discovered this was a safe place to learn and make mistakes. Where else does this happen in the world of being an adult? I have found my new "tribe" of some of the most kind and caring people I've ever met. Karate has quickly become a new way of life for me. My past had included some challenging times where I was made to think and feel by others that I wasn't strong. I had once been a strong, fierce young woman but I realized I had become a woman who felt helpless and had lost the fierceness.
