Welcome to the new year! There are many exciting developments district staff are currently working on. One development that may impact the school community going into the 2018-19 school year is starting school prior to Labor Day. There has been much discussion across the state regarding this calendar change. Livingston County schools are moving to a pre-Labor Day start, which will necessitate a change in Hartland to ensure that our students do not miss out on educational opportunities. **The district**




is planning to start school on August 28, 2018. This will require a Labor Day Holiday on Friday August 31, 2018 and Monday, September 3, 2018. In 2019-20, school will start a week earlier. The rationale for an early start to the school year is as follows:

- An earlier calendar start will greatly enhance instructional time prior to students sitting for the state assessments and college entrance exams in the spring.
- In 2019-20 students will finish first semester before the Holiday Break, starting the new semester when they return.
- The calendar would align with program enhancements across the county, including college and career technical education programs in which high school students are involved.
- The school year would end during the last week of May or the first week of June if we do not have to make up severe weather days.

Did you know that the Hartland community is continuing to connect our past to how we work now and in the future? The Hartland Area Project envisioned by J. Robert Crouse in 1931 continues with the "Partners for Progress" collaborative. Partners for Progress builds on the idea that the Hartland community is one that embraces a collaborative culture. Hartland Schools, Cromaine Library, Hartland Township, and the Hartland Area Chamber of Commerce meet regularly in an effort to ensure that collaboration is embraced as we share what people gain when they choose to live in the Hartland area.

Each year, during parent teacher conferences, the district surveys parents about their perceptions of how we are doing. This year, parents again rated the schools very well. The data below shares how our parents rate their schools compared to how parents across Michigan and the nation rate their schools.

In the fall of 2003, Steve Assenmacher asked if I would like to come to Hartland's Alternative Education program (aka Genesis/LEGACY) a couple of days per week as Assistant Student Coordinator in the Career Center. This ended up being a full time position as Student Coordinator. Having known and worked with Steve over the years at the county Level, I was happy to join his team and have been implementing and coordinating programs and working with Hartland's at-risk students ever since.



I am originally from Fowlerville and graduated from Fowlerville. I moved to Howell in 1982. I began working for Fowlerville Community Schools in 1973 and retired in 2003. I have two children (son & daughter), 2 granddaughters, and was surprised in January 2017 with the blessing of a grandson – after 14 years a new "little one" arrives on the scene!

Through my 40+ years in the work force, I have not only worked with students and employers but also on the business side of education. I retired from Fowlerville Community Schools after 30 years. While in Fowlerville, I wrote, submitted, implemented, and managed State, Federal, and private grants that resulted in hundreds of thousands of dollars for the school district.

This funding aided the at-risk student population in making career choices and prepared students for life after high school. I have worked with various Department of Labor programs both at Fowlerville Schools and Hartland, providing services for "Younger Youth", funded through the Federal Work Force Development Program/Workforce Investment Opportunity Act. We strive to give our at-risk students the services they need to be successful upon completion of high school.

I have been very fortunate over the years to have excellent educators, mentors, and lead administrators supporting me and our program. Having a great career center staff that wants the best for students to help them succeed not only while enrolled in school but after they leave us.

I believe that the Hartland Consolidated Schools is an excellent school district and I am so glad to be a part of a team that cares, educates, and provide service for the betterment of all students.

KINDERGARTEN ENROLLMENT 2018-2019

Kindergarten Enrollment Packets will be available beginning **February 1, 2018**



KINDERGARTEN ORIENTATION

A Kindergarten Orientation will be held on Saturday, February 17, 2018, from 10:00 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. at the Hartland Educational Support Service Center, 9525 Highland Road.

The orientation will provide parents an opportunity to hear from kindergarten teachers about a "typical" school day and the kindergarten curriculum. In addition, administrators will be on hand to talk about school safety, transportation, school attendance areas, student nutrition, and answer questions. This will be a family-oriented event and you are encouraged to bring your kindergarten child(ren).

Hartland Consolidated Schools will be accepting kindergarten enrollment packets beginning February 1, 2018 at the Board of Education office and each elementary school office during office hours. Enrollment packets can also be downloaded from our website at www.hartlandschools.us.

In addition to the enrollment packet, the following documents must be presented when registering:

- Original birth certificate with seal, plus a copy for school records
- Immunization records with proof of DTP, Polio, MMR, Hepatitis B, Chicken Pox vaccines (or proof of having illness), and vision screening, plus copy of same for school records
- Proof of residency using one of the following: certificate of occupancy, purchase agreement, builder's permit, rent receipt or agreement, mortgage statement/receipt, voter registration cared, utility bill, driver's license

Children are eligible for enrollment in kindergarten in August 2018 if they will have their fifth (5th) birthday on or before September 1, 2018. A child who turns 5 after September 1st and before December 1, 2018 may enroll if parent/legal guardian signs a waiver and is supported by the school district.

A full-day Junior Kindergarten program may be offered. A minimum number of students are required for the program to be made available. Parent may need to provide transportation in order to participate. The age requirements for Junior Kindergarten are the same as for the regular Kindergarten program. School Bus Safety Running Late to the Bus

Never assume the bus driver can see your student unless they are at the bus stop before the bus approaches. The bus driver does not know your student is running late or has missed the bus.

It is required that you should either:

- Transport your student to school
- Call Transportation at 810-626-2175, allowing dispatch to communicate with the driver so they know where to expect your student, and get you ahead of the bus to keep your child out of the "danger zone"

Communication with the bus driver is critical in this situation.

Students were able to mix polymers and see the heat-producing reaction, dress it up, and take it home with them.



Why the small things matter

It starts with your shoes

We do something very odd and unique at our karate school-we take off our shoes. Did you ever wonder why?

Well some of it is because of tradition. Another reason might be because it helps keep the dojo floor clean. But I think there is an even more powerful reason we take off our shoes and I would like to share it with the sincere hope it changes how you think and what you do. In the end, I think you will discover, this one seemingly simple task can profoundly change your child.

Okay, so why all this fuss and bother over shoes?

A good way to answer this is with some advice Navy Seal Admiral William McRaven gave as the 2014 commencement speaker at the University of Texas. The video of his speech went viral and you can easily view it on YouTube. Many say it was one of the best graduation speeches ever given. In it he shared the 10 life lessons he learned as a Navy Seal. The very first lesson was:

1. "If you want to change the world, start off by making your bed!"

The reason - this is the very first thing you do each day. He went on to say "If you can't do the little things right, you will never do the big things right." To change the world and be a leader you have to be able to do the small repetitious mundane things well.

Back to the karate school. We are here to help you develop the attitudes and character traits of the highly successful in your child. You can talk to your child until you are blue in the face. You can teach or show them what to do but most will never develop or embody these attitudes and character traits unless they experience them. Kids can only learn by doing. Can you imagine your child focused, intentional and driven to do everything, and especially the small things, perfectly every time? You get them started strong at the dojo and we will do the rest. After their class, hold them to a high standard in how they leave. No throwing their uniforms at you! No lost belts or gear! Remember the last thing you do at the dojo – put on your shoes!

How can you develop this "small things" lesson at home? How anyone

starts their day is huge. Is your home where everything goes like clockwork all the way until you kiss them good bye in the morning. Or, does your morning start with you having to nag them repeatedly to get up? Do they complain or struggle as they get dressed and ready? Is it a challenge to get them to eat breakfast? Are you looking for lost things? Are you typically in a state of stress as you realize they are going to be late for school or the bus? Have you ever had a child that just starts the day badly and this same energy/emotion stays with them the rest of their day?

So, back to what you can do. Do they make their beds? One of my pet peeves is waking themselves up for school. Get them their own alarm clock. Teach your child the process and routine of starting strong. Do the small things well. Is this hard work on your part? Yes it is!

How about school? Ask your child or their teacher – what are the small repetitive but important things my child needs to do especially at the start of their school day? What are your routines and procedures for homework/reading at home?

In your child's karate class we do new things but if you notice we do many, many small things over and over the same way in almost every class. There is a method to our madness. Do you know another word for these simple mundane tasks done repeatedly over time? They are your "HABITS"! . . . What habits are our child developing?



Hartland Middle School Wins Region 5 Red Ribbon Photo Contest!

National Family Partnership (NFP) provides drug awareness by sponsoring Red Ribbon Week. This week is a catalyst to mobilize communities to educate youth and encourage drug prevention activities. STAND and EBCE sponsored this week at the middle school from October 23rd through October 31st.
