The end of the school year is fast approaching. Please take the time to talk to your seniors about their next steps and to your school age children about plans for summer break. I would like to remind you that school is scheduled to start on August 28, 2018 this year and roughly one week earlier in 2019. The plan is to ensure that our schedule is consistent with the county Career Technology Education program and with the colleges, where many of our students take courses.



Thank You Hartland Community: It is a great feeling to know that the Hartland Community supports education. Your votes to renew and increase the 18 mill Non-homestead Tax Levy to its full levy on May 8, 2018 is evidence of this. Leading up to the special election, I shared the history of the Non-homestead Tax Levy and that the State of Michigan pulls out the 18 mills from our state aid package because they expect the local education agency to collect the full millage, in our case the full 4.7 million dollars. For a principal homeowner in the district, this equates to a zero increase in the tax levy. As you may be aware, without this money, the district would certainly look very different regarding programs and more.

Hartland High School Recognized by a National Publication: Congratulations to the students and staff at Hartland High School. The U.S. News and World Reports honored the high school with recognition as an outstanding Michigan High School. The annual "America's Best High Schools" list came out in May. This ranking places the high school in the top 6% of all Michigan high schools.

Memorial Day Parade Reflections

The 2018 Hartland Memorial Day Parade is now "in the books." Did you know this past parade was Hartland's 83rd Memorial Day Parade? Initially it was known as "Decoration Day" and was started in the years following the American Civil War. When Hartland held that first parade in late May 1936, Franklin Delano Roosevelt was still serving his first term, and earlier that year "Mutiny On the Bounty" won best picture. It was only the 8th Academy Award, and the United States consisted of just 48 States. A big thank you to all who helped in making the parade a success. To name everyone would be impossible.

Most everyone is not even going to think about Memorial Day 2019 for at least the next ten months, but that is certainly not the case for the Hartland Area Community Council. The meeting in early June is a "wrap up" of this years parade to discuss how it might be improved for next year. In January 2019 discussions will take place regarding the theme for the 2019 parade, and nominations for Grand Marshall will be accepted through March 2019.

The Council is always seeking volunteers to help with the enormous task of planning the parade. You say your Memorial Days are too busy to help? There are dozens of important jobs that are completed well before late May. Putting together the Parade Booklets, helping with details like ordering the Port-A-Johns, having trash containers in Epley Park and along the parade route are just a few of the examples that are taken care of well in advance of parade day.

The Community Council meets the first Monday of the month, starting in September and wrapping up with the June meeting. They generally take place in the media center at Ore Creek Middle School. They start at 6:30 pm and adjourn at 7:30. New faces are always welcome, along with new ideas. Consider attending, and meet other Hartland residents that want this eight decade plus tradition going for decades to come!
