As planned, the Board of Education followed through on their intention to lower the Debt Retirement Tax Levy by 0.5 mills to accommodate the 0.5 Mill Building and Site Sinking Fund approved by the voters in May. This was done during the June 26, 2017 Board of Education Annual Budget Hearing and will go into effect in December. Thanks again for trusting that Hartland Schools is working hard to provide a safe and engaging learning environment for our students.

NO PARKING FIRE LANE During the past school year, situations occurred in which emergency response vehicles could not maneuver around vehicles parked in the fire lanes. Most notably this has occurred at the high school sports complex and in the Lakes Elementary and Farms Intermediate circle drive. The district would appreciate the public's cooperation not parking where fire lanes exist. This includes the striped off areas in some of our parking lots.

Community members may not be aware that these fire lanes exist for two reasons. The first is the fire department needs access to our

buildings 24 hours a day. At any moment a situation could occur that requires emergency access to the facilities. If vehicles are parked in the fire lanes, emergency vehicles cannot efficiently tend to the emergency at hand. The second reason is that at any given time an individual or group of individuals may require medical attention. With access points blocked, the emergency staff cannot effectively reach and treat those in need.

Please heed the signage and marked areas designated as Fire Lanes and keep these areas clear at all times. In the event that individuals continue to ignore the signage around district facilities, tickets may be issued to violators. Help us keep our community members, guests, and facilities safe.

## ADVISORY TO ALL PARENTS INTEGRATED PEST MANAGEMENT

#### Dear Parent/Guardian:

The Hartland Consolidated Schools has adopted an Integrated Pest Management program. Inherent with this are the District's efforts to reduce pesticide use as much as possible. While it may occasionally be necessary to apply a pesticide, these will only be used as a last resort. This program does not rely on routine pesticide applications to resolve problems. We use various techniques such as habitat alteration, sanitation, mechanical means, exclusion, etc. to prevent pest from becoming a problem.

You will receive advanced notice of the application of a pesticide, other than bait or gel formulations at your child's school. This advance notice of the application will be given 48 hours before the application. The law requires us to do this notification by using two methods. The first method required by the law is the posting at the primary entrances to your child's school. The entrances that will be posted are those entrances that have a sidewalk that leads directly to a parking lot. The second method we are going to use is the posting in a common area located by the main office of the school. Parents are also entitled to receive this notice by first-class United States mail postmarked at least 3 days before the application. If you would like to be notified by mail please contact the Operations Department at (810) 626-2185. Please give the office your name, mailing address and what school your child attends.

In an emergency (for example, bees nest), pesticides may be applied without prior notice, but you will be provided notice following any such application.

You may review our IPM program or pesticide application records for your child's school by calling or e-mailing Matt Marino the District's Director of Operations at (810) 626-2185 e-mail at mattmarino@hartlandschools.us. This number or e-mail may also be used when school is not in regular session.

#### Notification of Rights under FERPA

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) affords parents and students over 18 years of age ("eligible students") certain rights with respect to the student's education records. They are:

- 1) The right to inspect and review the student's education records within 45 days of the day the District receives a request for access.
- a. Parents or eligible students should submit to the school principal [or appropriate school official] a written request that identifies the record(s) they wish to inspect. The principal will make arrangements for access and notify the parent or eligible student of the time and place where the records may be inspected.
- 2) The right to request the amendment of the student's education records that the parent or eligible student believes are inaccurate or misleading.
- a. Parents or eligible students may ask Hartland Consolidated School District to amend a record that they believe is inaccurate or misleading. They should write the school principal, clearly identify the part of the record they want changed, and specify why it is inaccurate or misleading.
- b. If the District decides not to amend the record as requested by the parent or eligible student, the District will notify the parent or eligible student of the decision and advise them of their right to a hearing regarding the request for amendment. Additional information regarding the hearing procedures will be provided to the parent or eligible student when notified of the right to a hearing.
- 3) The right to consent to disclosures of personally identifiable information contained in the student's education records, except to the extent that FERPA authorizes disclosure without consent.
- a. One exception which permits disclosure without consent is disclosure to school officials with legitimate educational interests. A school official is a person employed by the District as an administrator, supervisor, instructor, or support staff member (including health or medical staff and law enforcement unit personnel); a person serving on the School Board; a person or company with whom the District has contracted to perform a special task (such as an attorney, auditor, medical consultant, or therapist); or a parent or student serving on an official committee, such as a disciplinary or grievance committee, or assisting another school official in performing his or her tasks.
- b. A school official has a legitimate educational interest if the official needs to review an education record in order to fulfill his or her professional responsibility.
- c. Upon request, the District discloses education records without consent to officials of another school district in which a student seeks or intends to enroll. [NOTE: FERPA requires a school district to make a reasonable attempt to notify the student of the records request unless it states in its annual notification that it intends to forward records on request.]
- 4) The right to file a complaint with the U.S. Department of Education concerning alleged failures by the District to comply with the requirements of FERPA. The name and address of the Office that administers FERPA is: Family Policy Compliance Office; U.S. Department of Education; 600 Independence Avenue, SW; Washington, DC 20202-4605

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 provides that the following "directory information" may be released upon request: student's name, date of birth, phone number, address and/or email, parent name(s), school of attendance, school photographs or videos of students participating in school activities, events or programs, picture(s), video(s), publication of student picture(s), personally identifiable artwork, school activity group(s), participation in officially recognized activities and sports, height and weight if member of an athletic team, dates of attendance, date of graduation, awards received, honor rolls, scholarships, telephone numbers for inclusion in school of PTO directories,

In order to comply with this legislation, the district requests that parents, emancipated minors and those students 18 years of age and over, who do NOT wish release of this information, mail or personally submit an Opt-Out form to the building principal or Assistant Superintendent of Personnel and Student Services, Hartland Consolidated Schools, 9525 E Highland Road, Howell, MI 48843 by October 1st of the new school year.

#### **Get Connected to Hartland's Parent Portal!**

The MiStar Parent Portal provides each parent access to his or her child's student data including attendance, academic records, progress reports, lunch account, and more.

Each parent may request his or her own PIN and password to access the portal.

After you have registered your child, you should automatically receive an email within 24 hours containing your Parent Portal PIN and password. In the event that you do not receive this email, please follow the instructions below.

Send an email to pc@hartlandschools.us preferably from the email account you provided Hartland Schools upon registration of your child.

In the subject line, type Parent Portal PIN & password request.

List all your children currently enrolled in Hartland Schools, by their legal

After each child's name, indicate the building in which he or she is enrolled. Be sure to indicate your legal name as the parent making the request. Send the email.

A personal PIN and password will be emailed to you within 48 hours. We recommend you keep the PIN and Password in a safe place. You have the ability to change your password so that it is something easier for you to remember. If you forget your password, simply submit another email to pc@hartlandschools. us and we will reset it for you.

#### Welcome Back from Hartland Transportation!

The 2017/2018 school year is quickly approaching. We are looking forward to another great year! As always, we strive to make your child's bus ride a positive part of their educational experience. Here are a few important informational points for review:



\* Your student must be waiting at the bus stop 5 minutes prior to the scheduled arrival of the bus. Once the

alternating lights of the bus are deactivated, the bus driver cannot legally reactivate them and it is then the parent's responsibility to transport their student to school.

- \* Students and Parents should never try to catch the bus once the lights have been canceled. Please do not go to another bus stop without contacting the Transportation Office; the bus driver must be notified.
- \* If possible, your house number should be visible from the traveled roadway; mailbox numbers are acceptable but should be large enough and clearly visible on both sides.
- \* The expected behavior of the student rider is found in the Parent-Student Handbook. We encourage parents to review these responsibilities with their children to ensure their privilege of riding is not lost. The handbook can be found at: http://www.hartlandschools.us and clicking on the Parents & Students tab.
- \* Postcards will be mailed home a week before school starts with your student's bus information. The computerized postcard will only list one stop address but your student should wait on the same side of the road they reside on until the bus is in place with red lights activated and the bus driver crosses
- \* Students should never cross the road prior to arrival of the bus.

Armed Forces Recruiter Access to Students & Student Recruiting Info

The "No Child Left Behind Act of 2001" passed certain new requirements with respect to Armed Forces Recruiter Access to Students and Student Recruiting Information:

- •Duty to Provide Information to Military Recruiters. Unless the parent otherwise request, the District must provide upon request by military recruiters access to high school student's names, addresses and telephone listings.
- Consent. Either the high school student or the parent of the student may request that the student's name, address and telephone listing not be released without the prior parental consent. Schools are required to notify parents of this option to make a request and shall comply with the request.
- Access to Students. Each district shall provide military recruiters the same access to high school students as is provided generally to higher education institutions, community colleges, and prospective employers.



#### Seniors, it is College Application Season!

Hartland seniors were encouraged to use their time over the summer vacation to make sure they are ready for the college application season. Most colleges have their applications available online on August 1st. In order to apply for admission seniors must:

- 1. Complete the online college application and follow all steps outlined by the specific application.
- 2. Request that Hartland HS send your official transcript by creating a www.parchment.com account and completing an online transcript request. Students who are well organized and planning ahead can make transcript requests in August. However, seniors should note that the HS Counseling Office will not begin processing transcript requests until the second week of school.
- 3. Submit all necessary payments.
- 4. Monitor your application through your account on the college website to make sure that all parts of your electronic application were received and downloaded in a timely manner.
- 5. Let you counselor know when you are accepted. Once you have completed all of applications, seniors are able to move on to complete their financial aid applications (FAFSA) in October. Families will be using their 2016 tax documents to apply for financial aid.

Finally, seniors can begin the process of researching scholarship opportunities. There are numerous online search engines for scholarships that can be particularly helpful.

In addition, the counseling office will email you with a monthly newsletter filled with scholarship opportunities. Seniors who have used their summer wisely and have completed their applications early in the fall are far less stressed and have more time to devote to searching for scholarship dollars!


#### **Attendance Policy**

Thank you to our community for the continued support for our children at Creekside. We are looking forward to a great year as we "Work Together to Grow Young Minds"!







#### **Early Hartland Residents**

Thomas Hall, b 1873 in Connecticut, died in Hartland Township in April 1840. He is buried in Hartland Cemetery, along with his daughter Lorinda who died in 1858, several of her children, and her husband Amos Richardson. As it turns out, Amos remarried after Lorinda died, but he is buried in proximity to Lorinda.

Thomas Hall had 3 daughters...another daughter Cynthia married Lovell C. Chambers, and both are buried in Hartland Cemetery. One of their daughters married into the Kirk family. Including Thomas Hall and the Crouse brothers, there were about 40 people/families who moved into Hartland area between 1834 and 1850.

#### DOES YOUR CHILD LISTEN TO YOU THE FIRST TIME?

#### It's frustrating when our children can't focus or listen, isn't it?

And when they don't pay attention to what you are saying in the home, you have to wonder how much they are missing at school!

In 20+ years of teaching Martial Arts and Success Skills, I've developed a five step approach to improve a child's skill of listening. We use structure and discipline (and kids love it!). You can easily use these same five steps with your child!

- The Listening Posture. We use what are called "listening cues" in our classes. Teach your child that when it's time to listen, they must sit or stand straight up with good posture. Shoulders back. Lift the chest a little. Chin high. This alone can double listening retention!
- Direct Eye Contact is Essential. Insist on it. Your child will then be able to focus on the words being said. Computers, cell phones and texting work against us in developing good eye contact skills in children and teens!
- Listen to the Complete Message Before Acting. Children tend to listen incompletely. We find that children will tend to listen to the first part of an instruction, then start to act before the complete instruction is heard. Teach your child to maintain eye contact and posture until the talker is completely done. They have to learn patience and self discipline.
- Repeat the Message Back to the Speaker, When Possible. We like getting them to repeat <u>complex instructions</u> in class. You can do the same at home. For example, a child might say, "So, Mom, you'd like me to clean up my room and feed the cat before I play on the computer?" This lets the speaker know your child has understood!

• Praise Good Listening Skills! Changing children's behavior is basically pretty simple - just praise the desired behavior and ignore the undesired behavior. "Catch them doing something right". When they listen well - PRAISE THEM!!!!

Even very young children can be taught these steps. Begin by reading the steps to them, and then practicing each skill!

When you observe your child losing focus, just the simple reminder, "Remember ... listening skills!" will re-focus them. In our class we frequently use the powerful and effective question cue "Are you listening like a Black Belt?".

And, of course, it can't be repeated enough - watch like a hawk for situations when your child does listen effectively. Catch them doing it right, and follow up with a huge dose of appreciation, like, "Honey, I am so proud of you for listening to what I was saying!"




