Did You Know That The Following Laws Have Been Adopted by the State of Michigan?

On December 21, 2018, Governor Snyder signed laws to create a state Office of School Safety that requires schools develop emergency operations plans and conduct safety assessments with local law enforcement. Note: Hartland Schools currently has emergency operation plans in place, conducts safety assessments regularly and is part of a School Safety Committee at the county level.

On December 27, 2018, Governor Rick Snyder signed a law making cyber bullying a crime. This means that those individuals who feel that they can bully others using a computer, tablet, smart phone, etc. will face stiffer penalties.

February 2019 Person of the Month: **Christine Rutkowski**

I have been a teacher in Hartland for 20 years. I teach 8th grade Social Studies at Ore Creek. I have a Bachelor of Science in English and History from Eastern Michigan University and a Master's Degree in Teaching from Marygrove College.

I live in Brighton and have two children. My daughter, Mary, is studying to become a teacher; my son, Jim, works for the Japanese consulate office in Detroit. I chair the school improvement committee, am a member of the Instruc-



tional Consultation Intervention Team and am involved in facilitating Classroom Assessment for Student Learning (CASL) work in the building.

My most memorable moments at HCS are when I was Teacher of the Year in 2008–2009. I was extremely humbled by the honor and the support I received from my colleagues. Also, several years ago as part of a project, a group of students in one of my classes created a skit to reenact a Civil War battle. As middle school students, they did not have access to actual Civil War clothing and weaponry but they made do, bounding into the room with broomsticks for muskets and colanders on their heads. It was the most entertaining reenactment I have ever watched.

I continue to have a passion for what I do. I love teaching history, but I also love being able to help my students make connections between the events of the past and what is going on in the world today. While many things have changed over the years, what hasn't changed is the sense of curiosity and creativity our students have. On a daily basis they make me laugh, think and challenge me to be the best teacher I can be.

I work with a building full of talented, committed and passionate people who always try to do what is best for the students. There is a high level of collaboration and support among the staff. If you ask for help with your curriculum, with a particular student, or even with a simple technology issue, by the end of the day you will have five people at your classroom door willing to give you a hand.

The sense of community in Hartland is very strong. We celebrate together during the joyful times, and pull together and offer support during the difficult times. This can be in the simplicity of kind words of encouragement, congratulations, in sympathy, or in large undertakings that provide resources or money for people who are in need. It is all done with sincerity and a true sense of generosity and thankfulness.

Kindergarten enrollment packets will be available on February 1, 2019



Kindergarten Orientation

A Kindergarten Orientation will be held on Saturday, February 16, 2019, from 10 AM to 11:30 AM at the Hartland Educational Support Service Center, 9525 E. Highland Road (M-59).

The orientation will provide parents an opportunity to hear from kindergarten teachers about a "typical" school day and the kindergarten curriculum. In addition, administrators will be on hand to talk about school safety, transportation, school attendance areas, student nutrition, and answer questions. This will be a family-oriented event and you are encouraged to bring your kindergarten child(ren).

Hartland Consolidated Schools will be accepting kindergarten enrollment packets beginning February 1, 2019 at the Board of Education office and each elementary school office during office hours. Enrollment packets can also be downloaded from our website at www.hartlandschools.us.

In addition to the enrollment packet, the following documents must be presented when registering:

- Original birth certificate with seal, plus a copy for school records.
- Immunization records with proof of DTP, Polio, MMR, Hepatitis B, Chicken Pox vaccines (or proof of having illness), and vision screening, plus copy of same for school records.
- Proof of residency using one of the following: certificate of occupancy, purchase agreement, builder's permit, rent receipt or agreement, mortgage statement/receipt, voter registration cared, utility bill, driver's license.

Children are eligible for enrollment in kindergarten in September 2019 if they will have their fifth (5th) birthday on or before September 1, 2019. A child who turns 5 after September 1st but before December 1, 2019 may enroll if parent/legal guardian signs a waiver and it is supported by the school district.

A full-day Junior Kindergarten program may be offered. A minimum number of students are required for the program to be made available. Parent may need to provide transportation in order to participate. The age requirements for Junior Kindergarten are the same as for the regular Kindergarten program. Junior government students in Mrs. Barbara Gazda's classes set up a mock Congressional hearing where students played different roles in the argument "should French fries be sold at Hartland High?" Students were assigned roles, which required them to do research about French fries, potatoes and nutrition requirements. The student-based Congress heard the arguments from Idaho potato farmers, the Juvenile Diabetes Foundation, the Presidential Council on Physical Fitness and the US Department of Agriculture. The activity was great to show students how Congressional hearings happen in the US government!

Livingston County Sheriff Deputy Brad Neff discussed the forensic investigation of motor vehicle crashes to Mr. Mike Jahnke's Forensic Science and Mr. Dan Aldred's Law and Criminal Justice classes. Students learned protocols from both a law and forensic science perspective, including listening to true case studies from the field.



Mrs. Shanna Dana and her Advanced Placement Biology students performed a lab to examine DNA through electrophoresis. Students prepared bacterial DNA samples that were representative of human DNA, prepared them with dye and pipetted them into agarose gels which were then electrocuted. The DNA moved down the gel, and students interpreted the results in a mock-paternity test. What an awesome hands-on lab!

We want your child to struggle here!

Your initial reaction may be "What! Why would I want my child to struggle at anything?" Please hear me out. This may shed some light on the reason we do some of the things we do. You may even have a completely different perspective on raising your child.

As parents we all want to see our child thrive and succeed, don't we? We want them getting all A's, and scoring all the goals. We love to see them as the featured soloist at the recital or the lead in a play. We take joy when they get the Student of the Month award or win a huge trophy. But educators and experts are realizing we are raising a generation of children accustom to getting everything too quickly and easily.

A generation where "Everyone gets a trophy." Where everyone is the best, the prettiest, the smartest and the fastest. While this may seem to be good for one's self-esteem, you might be surprised to find out it does the exact opposite. The alarming result is children are struggling to handle even the slightest bit of adversity or failure-students and athletes who give up or shut down when not immediately successful and children who quit and say "I can't" even before they try something they feel is hard. The schools are identifying this as student's lack of "emotional" development. While the educational world is using the term "SEL" (Social/Emotional Learning), I like to use a simpler phrase –we need to develop **STRONGER kids**!

But how do you develop a stronger child? Here's the key for you as a parent, strength is built with **RESISTANCE** and **STRESS**. Think of it much like a muscle. If your muscle has to lift weights, it will become stronger. Why? Because the human body has the amazing ability of adaptation. The muscle is stressed, it grows in reaction to the stress. The opposite also holds true. If you don't use it, you lose it. Instead of weights, your brain needs stressors like **FEAR, HARDSHIP, FAILURE** and **BOREDOM** to develop.

- COURAGE can only be developed in the presence of fear.
- HARD WORK and DISCIPLINE need the experience of hardship, or doing things you don't want to do.
- **PERSISTENCE** and **PERSEVERANCE** is cultivated while in the deep emotional feeling of failing.
- RESOURCEFULNESS and CREATIVITY are produced by boredom.

Here is how we apply these stresses in your child's karate class. We actually do the exact opposite of what they typically see at school, sports and other activities. **WE INTENTIONALLY TRAIN THEM SO THEY STRUGGLE.**

How do we get them to struggle? In most of your child's world they are being taught or instructed with the intent of getting an "A" or being perfect. They are taught to the standard of perfection. But, not in terms of making them stronger. Instead, at our dojo we teach them their karate techniques and katas too fast and with too much material so they cannot possibly perform well on their test. We intentionally teach them with the goal of causing them to struggle. This struggle is the emotional stress they so badly need.

While we know this can initially be hard for you to watch and accept, you can help your child by learning how to reinforce, celebrate and appreciate your child struggles in class or on their next test. Let them know this good stress is making them stronger. Focus on and praise their effort instead of their results. On the ride home just say "Joey, I loved watching you do karate today!"

Know that every time they experience one of these "good" stresses, their "brain muscle" and character are getting stronger!
