

Kindergarten Enrollment 2019-2020

Hartland Consolidated Schools is now accepting kindergarten enrollment packets at the Board of Education office and each elementary school office during office hours. Enrollment packets can also be downloaded from our website at www.hartlandschools.us.

In addition to the enrollment packet, the following documents must be presented when registering:

- Original birth certificate with seal, plus a copy for school records.
- Immunization records with proof of DTP, Polio, MMR, Hepatitis B, Chicken Pox vaccines (or proof of having illness), and vision screening, plus copy of same for school records.
- Proof of residency using one of the following: certificate of occupancy, purchase agreement, builder's permit, rent receipt or agreement, mortgage statement/receipt, voter registration card, utility bill or driver's license.

Children are eligible for enrollment in kindergarten in September 2019 if they will have their fifth (5th) birthday on or before September 1, 2019. A child who turns 5 after September 1st but before December 1, 2019 may enroll if parent/legal guardian signs a waiver and it is supported by the school district.

A full-day Junior Kindergarten program may be offered. A minimum number of students are required for the program to be made available. Parents may need to provide transportation in order to participate. The age requirements for Junior Kindergarten are the same as for the regular Kindergarten program. Paul Scheidler: 2019 Memorial Day Parade Grand Marshall

The Hartland Community Council is proud to introduce Paul Scheidler as the 2019 Grand Marshall of the Hartland Memorial Day Parade. Considering that Paul has taught at Hartland High School since 1994, after student teaching at HHS in 1991, and then teaching at Legacy for 2 years, he would not need introducing to the 7,000 plus Hartland alumni that he had in class through the years.

Paul has taught a variety of history classes at Hartland High School. He has recently been particularly interested in the local history of Hartland and Livingston County. He has regularly over the last number of years had students participate in the Sunday

before Memorial Day ceremony at the Hartland Cemetery. After students research various families buried in the cemetery, they tell the history of the family, including one or two of the family members. The students dress in time appropriate apparel to make the presentation even more authentic. If you have not attended this event in past years, you should definitely consider making it part of your Memorial Day weekend plans. It begins at 7 PM on May 26th at the Hartland Cemetery.

Within the past year, Paul was honored with an award for the Michigan Council for History Education/Grand Valley State University. This award honors the best elementary, high school and pre-service level teachers throughout Michigan. Paul presented a lesson to those in attendance offering a glimpse into his classroom. The previous summer, Paul was given a box of World War I letters, photos and other memorabilia that was found in the attic of a relative of another history teacher at the school. Paul, along with his history seminar students, spent the semester researching the artifacts

and the battles that took place at that point in history. The class then presented their findings to the descendants of that soldier. The students successfully mapped out the movement and job assignments during the war for that soldier, including what events lead to him eventually settle in Michigan.

In addition to his distinguished teaching career, Paul has served in the military. Paul served in the US Army from 1982-1984, stationed in West Germany, 3rd Armored "Spearhead" Division. He joined the Army Reserves in 1984, serving with the 70th Training Division in Livonia, Michigan. He had two tours of duty overseas. The first

was in Bosnia in 2003-2004. And from 2008-2009 he served in Iraq as a combat adviser.

The entire Hartland community thank Paul Scheidler not only for his military service, but his continued service to the students at Hartland High School. His is a fine role model to the young people he sees everyday of the school year. Congratulation to Paul Scheidler!

Did you know the Transportation office is open throughout the summer?

Just as one school year ends, Transportation begins working on the next. Our office is open and staff will be available to accept forms and answer any questions you may have throughout the summer.

Efficient routes are created based on current busing forms (School of Choice, Joint Custody, and Alternate Destination) and enrolled student addresses. All busing forms are destroyed at the end of each school year, and new forms are required annually by July 1st to be assured of a seat on the proper bus. As we cannot assume anything, every year your student will be assigned to your home address unless a new form is submitted. All forms can be found at www.hartlandschools.us/Departments/Transportation/Forms.

Busing forms are required for:

- Students who are using a stop other than their home stop for morning or afternoon, or both morning and afternoon (Alternate Destination form)
- School of Choice students (School of Choice form)
- Students whose parents live in separate homes within the district (Joint Custody form)

The group experienced two excursions from Munich, including one to Dachau Concentration Camp used by Nazis during WWII and to Neuschwanstein Castle, which is the fairytale replicated castle used by Walt Disney. Students also met with Berlin high school students who gave them a tour of a typical day in German high school, and they were part of a discussion with residents who lived through the East Germany/West Germany divide, including the fall of the Berlin Wall. From the Guidance Office:

One of the misconceptions about 529 college savings plans is it takes a lot of money to open an account. While data shows most families who save in 529 accounts tend to be wealthier, there are still a lot of middle-class and lower-income families using the plans.

Experts say, the minimum contribution to open an account is lower than what it used to be. Michigan's prepaid 529 plan-Michigan Education Trust (MET)-now allows purchasers to buy in credit hour increments. The new Pay-As-You-Go option allows parents, grandparents and others to purchase a contract by paying for one credit hour to begin with and then make contributions as low as \$25 a credit hour. The Michigan Education Savings Program (MESP) can be started with as little as \$25. Both plans offer Michigan residents tax advantages.

It is often recommended for purchasers to make recurring payments into the 529 account, but it is not required. Parents can use milestones as an opportunity to contribute-if you have a toddler who no longer needs diapers take a portion of that money and put it into college savings. Friends and relatives can also use holidays and birthdays as an opportunity to contribute.

Even saving a little for college is better than nothing. Every dollar saved is a dollar the student, or parent, isn't going to have to borrow later. According to a Washington Post article, Americans now owe a record \$1.3 trillion in student loans. "Some 50 million people in the U.S. hold a student loan, slightly more than the number of people on Medicare and almost as many as those receiving Social Security benefits."







Essential Instructional Practices in Early Literacy

Here, at Hartland Preschool, we have adopted the ten recommended instructional practices as developed by the Early Literacy Task Force. Each month we will be exploring the practices that we perform in our classrooms. These important tips not only demonstrate what we practice in the preschool classrooms but are also important to nurture a well-rounded child as they enter elementary school and beyond.

The Instructional practices were developed by the *Michigan Association of Intermediate School Administrators General Education Leadership Network (GELN) Early Literacy Task Force (2016). Essential instructional practices in early literacy: Prekindergarten, Lansing, MI: Authors.*

Tracie Waldron will highlight the seventh Instructional Practice of the GELN—"extended conversation."

"Extended conversation" is key in language development. The use of conversation is extensively used in our preschool classrooms daily. Children are warmly greeted by name upon arrival. Teachers ask children about their morning, weekend, or something special that may be going on in their lives. Teachers create intentional opportunities for peer interaction. Teachers model how to ask peers for materials, "Ask Jane, 'Can you please hand me the red paint?" Children are encouraged to communicate with peers while working, playing and enjoying their meal. Children are asked open-ended questions to increase vocabulary. One way we encourage children to elaborate on a topic is by using the phrases: "I wonder what would happen next?" or "Tell me more about..." or "What do you think...?"

Conversation with children acknowledges and shows respect to them. Listening to children shows we value their thoughts and ideas, and fosters positive self-concept. These life-long skills are the foundation for success.

What kind of loser is your child?

I received this email from a local teacher:

Sensei, I have a question. What suggestions do you have to help students cope with disappointment? We have a big contest coming up. Only 2 fourth graders will win. I'd like to be prepared with strategies to help those that don't win.

Here was my response back to her:

Great question. This can actually tie in nicely to the development of your student's "Discipline Muscle" and the "Three Types of People" lesson I did for you and your students.

Here is how to apply it. Remember the Type Two people? They are the majority of people (50-85%) who "do just enough to get by." This is the "rat race" where everybody is competing against each other for the same teams, colleges, jobs, friends, etc. People who are type two people live a life and in a world of scarcity. They believe there is not enough to go around so "I better get mine first." They compete against each other. They have to cut each other down to survive, let alone excel. People in this group can't help but develop a "Fixed Mindset". (They also often have a perfectionist mindset too). They believe people that succeed must have cheated or taken a short cut. It just is not fair! They believe people that succeed must have brains and talents they do not. Their response to failure and setbacks is to give up and quit.

Help your students understand they can choose to be Type Two or Type One people. It is a CHOICE. You can choose the I-always-do-a-little-bit-more-than-anyone-expects habit and mindset of Type One people. Here only about 7% of the population lives. They do not need to compete here. They actually help each other at this level. They know that there is more than enough to go around. They believe it is not a zero-sum game. They know they can make plenty more and the supply of success is unlimited.

They have a growth mindset and an abundance mindset. When one person in this group rises, they all rise. There is plenty for everyone. "There is no competition at the top!"

Here is how you can nicely tie all this into your classroom and with your students. Tell them they can use this contest to not only notice, but also <u>practice</u> being a Type One person.

Just start by helping them notice: Type One people do something very different when they compete—They look and act exactly the same whether they win or lose!

When they compete, you cannot tell if they won or lost by looking at them! Instead, without boasting or celebrating, the Type One winner looks the loser in the eye and says "Okay, good on you. I won this time but keep pushing me. I am going to work even harder because I know that if I even blink you will beat me next time. You better give me your best because YOU make me better!" And even better, the Type One loser, without getting upset or disappointed in losing, will look the winner in the eye and say "Nice job dude. You got me this time but you better watch out. I just learned far more from that loss than you will ever learn from your win. Thanks for teaching me. You stay sharp because the next time I will beat you. I am hungry. I can out work you. Don't celebrate and get comfortable now. Thank you for making me better. Keep pushing me. Bring it on!"

They both win! This is why when we do in-house karate tournaments at our dojo we only give out one medal for the winner because the rest are losers! And that is good!

I think you should have only one winner! ;-)




