Far too often the answer is, nothing or fine. To understand what really happens in school and the classroom, we ask that parents regularly ask questions such as:

- What learning targets did you work on in _____ class today?
- What does it mean to be a learner in school or in _____ class?
- What feedback did your teacher(s) give you today regarding your learning?
- How did you collaborate (work together) with other students today in your learning?
- How does your teacher(s) help you to understand what you know, what you need a little work on, or what you need help learning?
- What type of classroom conversations or debates did you have at school today?
- How do you know that you are learning in school or in _____ class?

These are just a few examples of deeper questions that will help you better assess your child's understanding of school and learning, and may even help you to seek intervention where your child may be struggling. Together, we will make a difference in the lives of our most precious resource, children.

Welcome Back From Hartland Transportation!

The 2018/2019 school year is underway and we are looking forward to another great year! As always, we strive to make your child's bus ride a positive part of their educational experience. Here are a few important informational points for review:

- Your student must be waiting at the bus stop 5 minutes prior to the scheduled arrival of the bus. Once the alternating lights of the bus are deactivated, the bus driver cannot legally reactivate them and it is then the parent's responsibility to transport their student to school.
- Students and Parents should never try to catch the bus once the lights have been canceled. Please do not go to another bus stop without contacting the Transportation Office; the bus driver must be notified.
- If possible, your house number should be visible from the traveled roadway; mailbox numbers are acceptable but should be large enough and clearly visible on both sides.
- The expected behavior of the student rider is found in the Parent-Student Handbook. We encourage parents to review these responsibilities with their children to ensure their privilege of riding is not lost. - Students should never cross the road prior to arrival of the bus.

Reading at HMS

Students at HMS are encouraged to choose books that are of interest to them, and are given time in class to read, have thought-provoking discussions, and make recommendations to each other. Reading is a central focus for our district, and while reading will be assigned, your son or daughter will also have many opportunities to choose his or her own book for independent reading and study. We help students, even reluctant readers, find books that they will enjoy. It is important for all students to read books of high interest that also support their growth as readers. Please help monitor which books your child is reading and ask him/ her to share with you. We encourage you and your child to set a goal of reading at least 20 minutes each day. Research is clear that students who read daily experience great benefits to learning and achievement though better comprehension, fluency, vocabulary, and back-ground knowledge. READING must be a priority.

Round Elementary School is a special place where our commitment to excellence, relationships and the development of involved citizens is the priority.





We also offer care for children who attend the Round, Village and Creekside, Lakes Elementary and Farms Intermediate School. The children who attend the **Lakes or Farms** Schools may enroll at the School Street center, or take advantage of the school-age program at the Lakes Elementary School.

Both center locations are open 6 AM to 6 PM

Both programs offer gym activities, arts and crafts, and outside play. When you are signed up for the Before and After School Care, you also have the option of attending on the "No School" days or Snow days! Our center is almost always open!

Before & After School Child Care Only

Full Time enrollment (5 days a week) is \$10.00 a session. Part Time enrollment (2-4 days a week) is \$12.00 a session. The minimum enrollment is 2 sessions a week for a charge of \$24 for the week.

Example- A student needs to attend 5 –AM sessions and 1 –PM session. The charge would be \$50 for the AM and \$12 for the P.M. session, for a total charge for the week of \$62. You must notify the office if your child/children will be absent from the Before & After school program. Your regular weekly tuition will be charged unless the Center is closed. If your Before & After School child attends on a No School Day, Snow Day, etc., your tuition for the day will be \$37.







Is Your Child Being Bullied? Parents often never know!



Dear Fellow Parents,

Bullying can range from severe physical abuse to very mild "silent treatment" or exclusion by friends. Both can have long lasting and devastating affects on children. Many parents never know about the mild and moderate bullying of their child.

According to the book Bullies and Victims in Schools; 96% of children will be bullied at least once in their lifetime. 46% of those children will suffer poor grades or will abstain from extra curricular activities

because of the bullying. 2% of those children will commit suicide because of constant harassment from classmates.

Is your child being bullied? Look for these signs in your child:

- 1. Bruises, cuts, scratches, torn clothing that cannot be explained and complaints about not feeling well.
- 2. Reluctance to go to school or requests to change school.
- 3. Books, money, lunch or belongings stolen, damaged, scattered around or "lost."
- 4. Excuses to avoid going to school, or insistence that you take him/her to school even though you live close by.
- 5. Insomnia or bed-wetting.
- 6. Frequent requests for money.
- $\label{eq:constraint} \textbf{A} \ \text{sudden}, \ \text{unexplained}, \ \text{deterioration} \ \text{in class} \ \text{work} \ \text{and/or} \ \text{homework}.$
- 8. Lack of participation in school activities, staying near the teacher during breaks.

- 9. Anxiety, insecurity, distress, unhappiness, secretiveness, mood changes and anger.
- 10. Claims of "I'm okay" when questioned about obvious unhappiness.
- 11. Low self-esteem.
- 12. Unhappiness at the end of weekends or school vacations.
- 13. Few friends or no friends in class and lack of invitations to birthday parties or other social activities.
- 14. Teasing or being laughed at by his/her peer group.

Bullying is a very difficult problem to stop. Our mission at Ohana Karate is to ensure every child has the right to feel safe and develop to their full potential. I feel that it is our responsibility to be a community leader and center for the fight against bullying.

Can this crisis be stopped? First, we must develop an ethos in which bullying is always unacceptable and will not be tolerated. Second, it takes a whole community to save our children. We must arm the victim, bully, bystander, parents, schools and community with the anti-bullying tools and systems. Please contact us if we can help you or your family.


