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Superintendent's Corner

As we move into October, I want to remind parents that the first 100 days of school are vital to student learning and long-term retention. Your diligence in making sure that your children get a good night sleep and attend school regularly is critical to teaching and learning. Last year, the district saw a continued drop in chronically absent students (those missing 15 or more days). Four years ago, the district found that 16% of our student body were chronically absent from school. Last year, this dropped to 10%. At Hartland High School we started addressing this issue four years ago due to a 22% chronic absence issue, and are happy to report that in 2018-19 that 22% fell to 3%—amazing and only made possible by partnering with students and parents to see the value of regular attendance. I believe that regular attendance was significant in supporting learning, and in the fact that 498 out of 500 seniors graduated from our high school programs in 2019.

Just recently, the State of Michigan released our Spring 2019 standardized assessment scores. Our students and staff should be extremely proud of the progress we are making toward reaching for 70% or better proficiency in every tested area, widening the gap between how our students perform and how the State of Michigan performs, and ensuring that all students are learning. As you look at the results below, you will see that our students either maintained or improved in 13 of 15 MSTEP areas, and our 8th grade through 11th grade students performed exceptionally. Most impressive is the performance of our Economically Disadvantaged Students (those qualifying for free or reduced lunch) who earned a number one ranking compared to all other public high schools in the county. The work we are doing to ensure that the “whole child” is addressed through early and often intervention seems to be a factor in this success.

I also earned a master's degree in Science Education from Michigan State.

I currently teach AP Biology, AP Biology Lab and Anatomy & Physiology to 10th–12th graders. Over the years I have also taught Earth Science, Environmental Science and Biology. I am a proud member of the Hartland High School Science Department, which works collaboratively to advance instructional techniques and curriculum to best meet the needs of students and prepare them to become educated citizens, ready for post-secondary studies and training.

College Action Plan: Check List

Summer/Fall

- Narrow your list of colleges to between 5-10.
- Plan to visit as many of the colleges you plan to apply to if you haven't already.
- Create a master list or calendar that includes: SAT/ACT Test dates/deadlines (if retaking), College Application deadlines for schools you are planning to apply to (early and/or regular deadlines), and required financial aid application forms and their deadlines (aid applications may be due before college applications).
- Ask your counselor for a fee waiver if you think you might qualify for financial assistance.
- Take the SAT and/or ACT another time if you would like to try to improve your scores for admissions or scholarship consideration.
- Get a head start on completing as much required information as possible.
- Write your college application essay, if required, and have a teacher or other adult proofread it.
- Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at www.fafsa.ed.gov to apply for financial aid – available beginning on October 1st. You will need your most recent tax returns.
- Complete the CSS/Financial Aid PROFILE. PROFILE is an online application used by certain colleges and scholarship programs to determine eligibility for their aid dollars.
- Ask one or two teachers for recommendations if you need them (also ask your counselor if using the Common Application or if you have special circumstances). Make sure to provide an outline or resume of your academic awards/accomplishments, extracurricular activities, etc.
- Complete and submit one or more college applications by Halloween.
- Create an account on www.parchment.com and request/send transcripts to colleges.

Fall/Winter

- Keep track of the colleges you have applied to and the responses you receive.
- Send a copy of your 7th semester (1st semester of 12th grade) grades if the college is asking for it. Request to send your transcript through www.parchment.com.
- Find out each college's actual cost. Use a Net Price Calculator (such as the one available on www.bigfuture.collegeboard.org's website) to find out the potential for financial aid and the true out-of-pocket cost—or net price—for each college.
- Contact the Financial Aid Office or visit the Financial Aid Office website of the colleges in which you are applying to find out what type of aid is available, as well as the deadlines, for that particular college.
- Find and apply for scholarships. Make sure to check the HHS Scholarship Gazette that is updated monthly by the Counseling Department. It is emailed to students and parents, as well as posted on the HHS Counseling web page. Make sure to submit scholarships applications and/or essays by the deadlines.
- Find additional scholarships on scholarship websites. A suggested list is available on the HHS Counseling web page and on the Scholarship Gazette. Make sure to submit scholarships applications and/or essays by the deadlines.
- Sign up to take the AP Exam if you are enrolled in an AP course. Talk with your AP teacher if you have questions regarding whether or not you should take the exam.

Winter/Spring

- If you are waitlisted, contact the admissions office to let them know you are still interested and ask how you can strengthen your application.
- Continue applying for scholarships. Review financial aid award offers to figure out which package works best for you. Pay attention to deadlines.
- Make a pros/cons list of the colleges you have been accepted to in order to choose the college that is the best fit for you.
- Visit your final college before accepting, if possible. You should receive acceptance letters and financial aid offers no later than mid-late April if you submitted your applications by the recommended deadlines.
- Inform each college of your acceptance or rejection of their offer and/or financial aid by May 1st.
- Notify your counselor of your final decision and send in your deposit to the college you have decided to attend.
- Apply for housing and submit the deposit if living on campus.
- Sign up for orientation to become an official student and find out the next steps.
- Register for classes. Send a copy of your final high school transcript to your college through www.parchment.com.
- Contact the college if you have any questions!

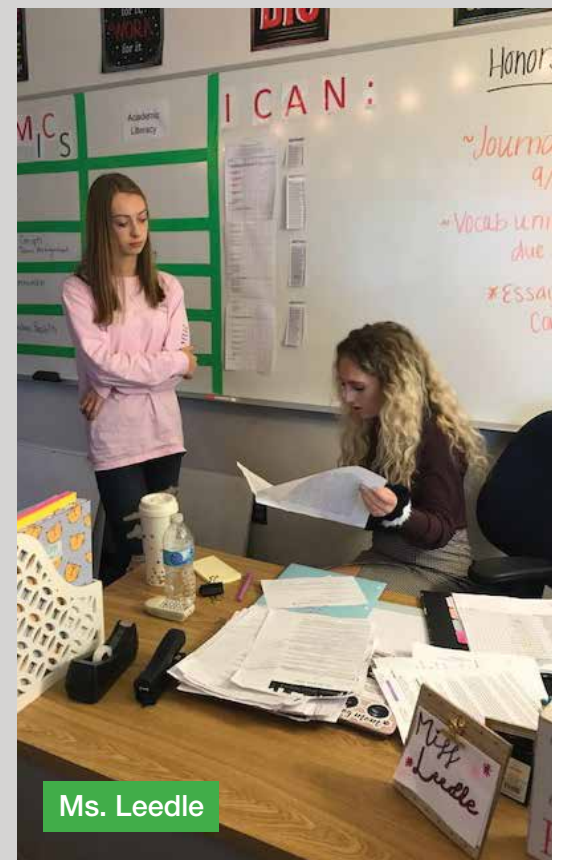

Attendance Information And Expectations

Please keep in mind that regular school attendance is critically important to the academic success of your child. Please keep in contact with our office regarding your child's attendance. If your child is ill or needs to miss school for a medical appointment, please provide our office with a note documenting the absence. I will be continuing to send out attendance letters to parents when their child misses 5, 10 and 15 days of school, as well as for excessive tardies or early pick-ups. Through raising awareness of student absences, we hope to reduce our amount of chronically absent students.

Tips for Improving School Attendance:

1. Try to schedule doctor and dentist appointments in the beginning or end of the day so that your child will only miss an hour or a ½ day. Appointments can also be scheduled on days off.
2. If your child has a fever or vomiting staying home from school is necessary until they are fever/vomit free for 24 hours. Your child will benefit from early detection and action in order to get healthy and return to school promptly.
3. Monitor your child's attendance through Parent Connect to keep track of absences. Many times parents are unaware of how many times their student has been absent until it is seen on a data sheet.

We know there are a wide variety of reasons students are absent from school—from health concerns to transportation challenges. There are many people in our building prepared to help you if you or your student are facing challenges getting to school. Please reach out to Mrs. Way whenever a need/challenge arises. We appreciate your efforts and concerns.

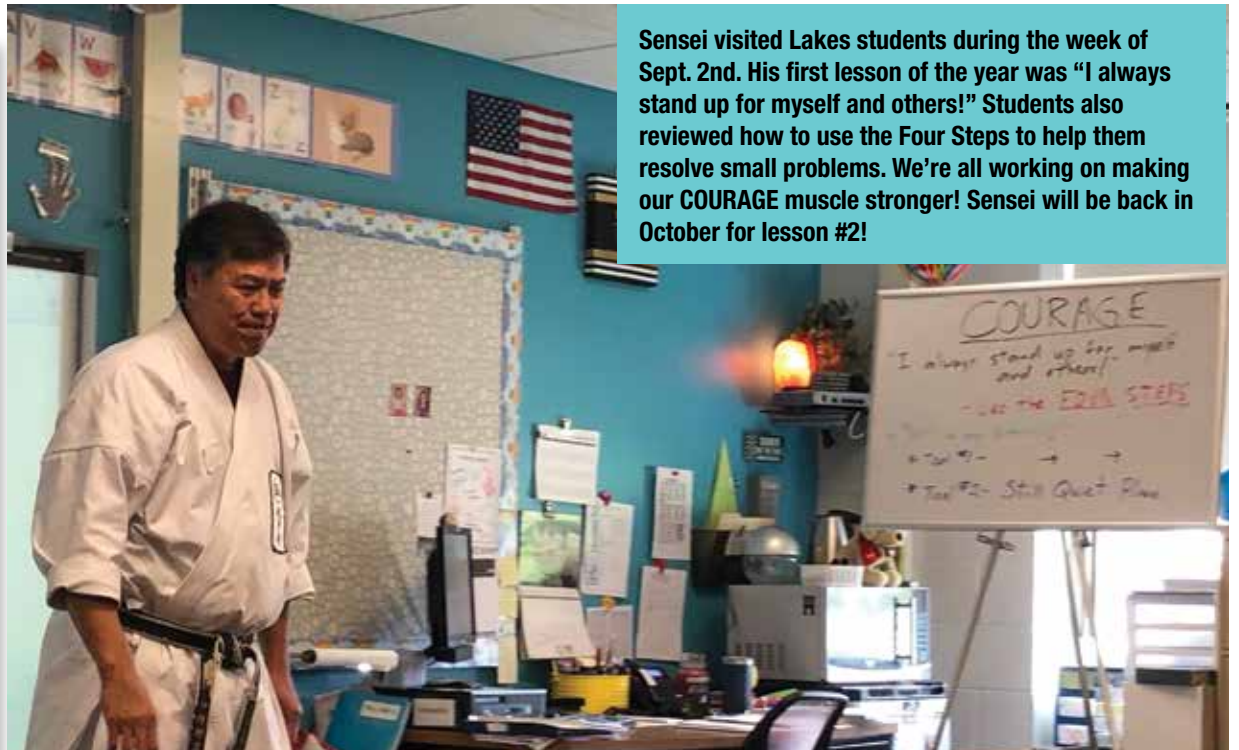

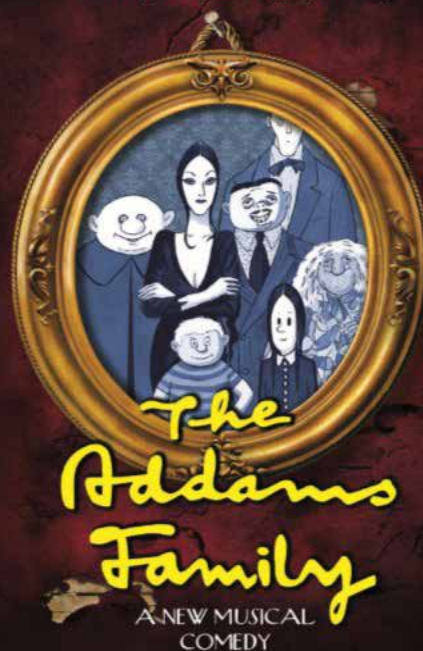

You must notify the office if your child/children will be absent from the Before & After school program. Your regular weekly tuition will be charged unless the Center is closed. If your Before & After School child attends on a No School Day, Snow Day, etc., your tuition for the day will be \$39.

In the Alumni Spotlight: Dawn Mantela VanderWerf

Dawn (Mantela) VanderWerf is a 1989 Hartland High School graduate. Dawn went on to pursue a degree in journalism from the University of Texas at Arlington. After working for a magazine, a publishing company and then becoming a Sales Director for Mary Kay Cosmetics for 15 years, Dawn experienced some dramatic events in 2009 that led to a divorce and her becoming a full-time single mom.



Still in the midst of her personal struggles as a single parent, Dawn became increasingly aware of the distress so many other single parent families experience and felt led to be part of the solution. In 2012 she founded Single Parent Missions, an organization that would provide resources to help single parents find help, hope and healing. Initially, SPM provided free online resources, life-coaching and daily devotionals, specifically for single parents. It has expanded to offer support groups, conferences and church and community leadership coaching.

In 2013, Dawn returned to her home state of Michigan, bringing her ministry headquarters to the Grand Rapids area. In 2014 she published her first book, *The Daddy Gap*, which addresses the alarming increase in single parent homes and how this dramatic shift in family structure affects the Church and the state. Happily remarried in 2015, Dawn and her team began hosting the Single Parenting Summit (the only conference of its kind in the country) that trains and encourages single moms, single dads and church and community leaders. Dawn is excited to see how far this ministry has come and credits God for giving her the vision and opening doors. 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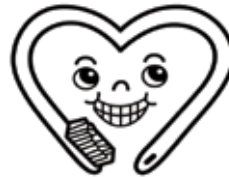

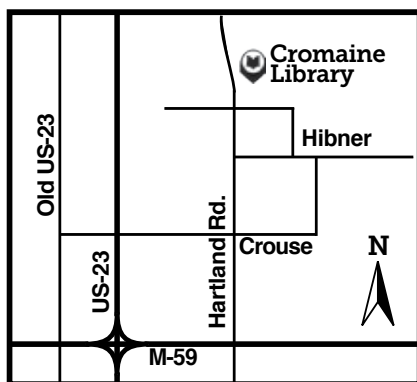

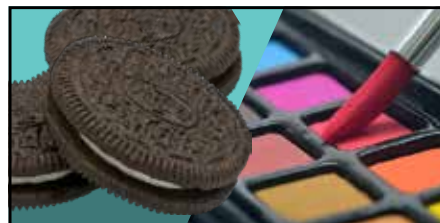

I'M BORED!

Does This Sound Like Your Child?

Dear Fellow Parents

I am Sam Larioza, father of two wonderful kids and the owner of Ohana Karate. I often get asked parenting questions by our many wonderful families. I want to share this actual email revealing two valuable skills all highly successful kids (and adults) share but few ever learn:

Dear Sensei,

Caden had a rough year in Kindergarten last year and I truly believe that a large part of his struggle was boredom. He had already done a year of preschool and a year of Kindergarten before doing Kindergarten and academically he was not challenged. Through the 3rd quarter this escalated into some very undesirable behaviors where he was basically checked out, ignoring his teachers in specials class and often not finishing his work, choosing instead to fiddle with the things in his tool box or simply stare out into space. Going into first grade expectations are higher and I hope that he will rise to the challenge - I'm hoping that challenging him more in karate is the way to get him started in the right direction.

Dear Nancy,

Your message and your challenge with Caden touches on one of the most valuable and important lessons in karate and in life. **"Delayed Gratification"** and **"Mastering the Mundane."** These two things are hugely significant in determining who is highly successful and who fails in life. Many kids, especially highly intelligent ones, will seem to constantly be "bored," or feel what they are being taught or what the group is doing is too easy or boring. The truth is "mastery" takes repetition and hard work, and lots of it! For instance, a child will think they have learned their kata because they know the physical sequence and will think "This is dumb, I don't want to do this anymore. I want to learn the next kata" when in fact they just touched the surface. After a while, the danger is that this becomes a "habit" more than a response to what they are learning.



The earlier a child learns "Delayed Gratification" and "Mastering the Mundane," the sooner they get on the track and habit of success. Kids who have these down are the kids that get straight A's in school. They are the ones that play and practice for all four years of high school football despite not being a starter and only playing occasionally. They are the kids that FINISH college.

So as you will see, there is a method to our madness. At the Little Dragon level we know that most kids that age cannot handle delayed gratification and mastering the mundane. So we disguise our lessons as "games" even though each one has a purpose and a lesson. At each higher level we gradually make the classes less "fun" and more difficult on purpose. We want to teach students that this stuff is difficult but good for you. So while I think that Caden is ready to move up, I know the more valuable life lesson would be to stay in Little Dragons longer and force him to confront his "I'm bored" habit. Let me know what you think?

Dear Sensei,

Thank you for your perspective. I never really thought of "Mastering the Mundane" as a skill before, but you're absolutely right. I have told him more times than I can count that we all have to do things we don't enjoy and we just have to find a way to work through it and do our best. I can definitely see a pattern of "I'm bored" attitude coming from him and it is absolutely something I'd like to squash before it gets out of hand.

Thank you so much for all of your time and effort with this. I really appreciate all of your input. Having Caden as part of the Ohana Dojo has truly made a difference in both his behavior as well as many of my approaches with him. I respect and value your opinion very much and I thank you for all that you do!

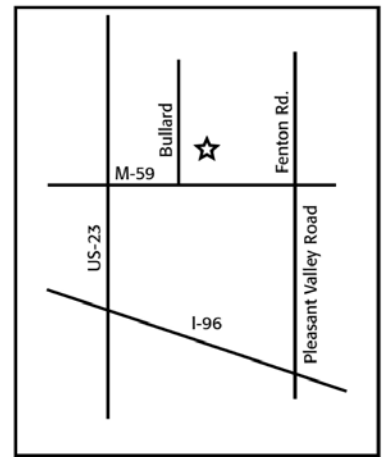
