Tickets will be issued to those individuals choosing to ignore this expectation. Thank you for helping us keep our community members, guests and facilities safe.

Hartland High School parents and students who use the back entrance running by Creekside Elementary and through the Village of Hartland, please slow down and help us to ensure that the back entrance is available for arriving and leaving school. Unfortunately, the poor driving choices of a few could result in losing the ability to keep this route open, forcing all traffic to enter and exit on Dunham Road. Welcome Back From Hartland Transportation!

The 2019/2020 school year is underway. We are looking forward to another great year! As always, we strive to make your child's bus ride a positive part of their educational experience. Here are a few important informational points for review:

- Your student must be waiting at the bus stop 5 minutes prior to the scheduled arrival of the bus. Once the alternating lights of the bus are deactivated, the bus driver cannot legally reactivate them and it is then the parent's responsibility to transport their student to school.
- Students and Parents should never try to catch the bus once the lights have been canceled. Please do not go to another bus stop without contacting the Transportation Office; the bus driver must be notified.
- If possible, your house number should be visible from the traveled roadway; mailbox numbers are acceptable but should be large enough and clearly visible on both sides.
- The expected behavior of the student rider is found in the Parent-Student Handbook. We encourage parents to review these responsibilities with their children to ensure their privilege of riding is not lost. The handbook can be found by going to the district website at www.hartlandschools.us, then clicking on Parents & Students and then on Handbooks.
- Students should never cross the road prior to arrival of the bus.
- Livingston County Road Commission has informed us that the work on the Crouse Road Bridge has had some unforeseen delays and is now slated to open on September 7th. While this closure will increase the amount of traffic on Hartland Road from Clyde Road down to M59, we have been making arrangements to minimize the potential delays to our routes. The buses will make every effort to arrive at each stop as listed on your post card or in parent portal, however they may be a little late. Please remember that it is only temporary and traffic conditions are outside of our control. We appreciate your understanding and patience as we navigate this closure.

From the Guidance Office: Are You Ready for College Applications?

Seniors are encouraged to begin looking into the application process for the college, universities and post-secondary programs as school begins! Most colleges have their applications available online on August 1st. In order to apply for admission seniors must:

- 1. Complete the online college application and follow all steps outlined by the specific application.
- 2. Request that Hartland HS send your official transcript by creating a www.parchment.com account and completing an online transcript request. Students who are well organized and planning ahead can make transcript requests in August. However, seniors should note that the HS Counseling Office will not begin processing transcript requests until the second week of school.
- 3. Submit all necessary payment.
- 4. Monitor your application on through your account on the college website to make sure that all parts of your electronic application were received and downloaded in a timely manner.
- 5. Let your counselor know when you are accepted.

Once you have completed all of applications, seniors are able to move on to complete their financial aid applications (FAFSA) in October, which is much earlier than in past years. This earlier filing dead-line will allow families to use their 2018 tax documents to apply for financial aid, rather than waiting until January for their 2019 tax documents.

Finally, seniors can begin the process of researching scholarship opportunities. There are numerous online search engines for scholarships that can be particularly helpful. In addition, the counseling office will email you a monthly newsletter filled with scholarship opportunities. Seniors who have used their summer wisely and have completed their applications early in the fall are far less stressed and have more time to devote to searching for scholarship dollars!

The Hartland High Band and Drum line attended band camp in August. The approximately 270 student members of the Eagles band spent one week away at band camp to learn comradery, marching formations and to increase their attention to detail under the direction of Brad Liably. We all look forward to hearing our amazing Hartland Band and Drum Line during football season!



Important Reminders

School Bell Times: School begins at 8:45 AM and ends at 3:45 PM, Monday–Thursday. On Fridays ("Early Release Fridays"), dismissal time will be 2:45 PM. Students will be allowed to go to their lockers at 8:35 AM.

Drop-off and Pick-up: If you are driving your child to school, please **do not** drop him/her off before 8:25 AM, as there is no adult supervision available in the building. After 3:50 PM, Monday –Thursday and 2:50 PM on Fridays, students **MUST** be picked up and signed out in the office, as there is no adult supervision available outside after those times.



"E.A.G.L.E.S. Take Flight"—Social emotional learning is an area that each school in Hartland works on developing with our students every year. Social emotional learning involves helping teach students how to understand and manage emotions, set and achieve positive goals, feel and show empathy for others, establish and maintain positive relationships and make responsible decisions. We are looking forward again to working with Sensei Sam Larioza on our E.A.G.L.E.S. Take Flight Program! Principal Howerton will be sending out updates throughout the year on our work in this area. This work falls under the umbrella of our PBIS (Positive Behavioral Interventions & Supports) and E.A.G.L.E.S. concept (see below) which focuses on teaching positive behavior so students can be successful in school and life.

E.A.G.L.E.S. (Through Reason, Respect, and Responsibility)

E=Empathy—The ability to understand and share the feelings of another.

A=Achievement—A thing done successfully, typically by effort, courage, or skill. **G=Grit**—Perseverance and passion for a long term goal.

L=Link—A relationship between two things or situations, especially where one thing affects the other.
 E=Empower—Make someone stronger and more confident, especially in controlling their life and claiming their rights.

S=Serve—To be worthy of reliance or trust. To help persons and be favorable, opportune or convenient.

LOC Student Run Credit Union starts Year 3—Lakes' student-run credit unions are managed by 4th grade students with the supervision of an LOC employee. Student employees gain hands-on experience on how to run a branch and they perform duties of the various positions available at a financial institution. They are also taught real-life work skills.

Please return your application if you plan to participate. As always, breakfast is offered every morning.

Attendance Information and Expectations: Please keep in mind that regular school attendance is critically important to the academic success of your child. Please keep in contact with our office regarding your child's attendance. If they are ill or need to miss school for a medical appointment, please provide our office with a note documenting the absence. If your child has a fever or vomiting, staying home from school is necessary until they are fever/vomiting free for 24 hours. Your child will benefit from early detection and action in order to get healthy and return to school promptly. I will continue to send attendance letters to parents when their child misses 5, 10 and 15 days of school. I will contact you for excessive tardies or early pick-ups as well. We hope to reduce the number of chronically absent students in order to improve student achievement and social-emotional skills.

Tips for Improving School Attendance:

- Try to schedule doctor and dentist appointments at the beginning or end of the day so that your child only misses an hour or a ½ day of school. Appointments can also be scheduled on days off as well.
- Monitor your child's attendance through Parent Connect to keep track of absences. Absences
 can add up quickly and parents are often unaware of how many times their student has been
 absent.
- Students are tardy until 9:20 AM. If you child arrives after 9:20 AM they will be marked ½ day absent. At the end of the day, students picked up before 3:20 PM are also marked ½ day absent.
- We know there are a wide variety of reasons students are absent from school, from health concerns to transportation challenges. There are many people in our building prepared to help you if you or your student are facing challenges getting to school. Please reach out to Mrs. Hot-tum whenever a need/challenge arises. We appreciate your efforts and concern.

What Happened To Strong Work Ethic? Parents with young children need to read this, too!



Notification of Rights Under FERPA

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) affords parents and students over 18 years of age ("eligible students") certain rights with respect to the student's education records. They are:

- 1) The right to inspect and review the student's education records within 45 days of the day the District receives a request for access.
 - a. Parents or eligible students should submit to the school principal [or appropriate school official] a written request that identifies the record(s) they wish to inspect. The principal will make arrangements for access and notify the parent or eligible student of the time and place where the records may be inspected.
- 2) The right to request the amendment of the student's education records that the parent or eligible student believes are inaccurate or misleading.
 - a. Parents or eligible students may ask Hartland Consolidated School District to amend a record that they believe is inaccurate or misleading. They should write the school principal, clearly identify the part of the record they want changed, and specify why it is inaccurate or misleading.
 - b. If the District decides not to amend the record as requested by the parent or eligible student, the District will notify the parent or eligible student of the decision and advise them of their right to a hearing regarding the request for amendment. Additional information regarding the hearing procedures will be provided to the parent or eligible student when notified of the right to a hearing.

3) The right to consent to disclosures of personally identifiable information contained in the student's education records, except to the extent that FERPA authorizes disclosure without consent.

- a. One exception which permits disclosure without consent is disclosure to school officials with legitimate educational interests. A school official is a person employed by the District as an administrator, supervisor, instructor, or support staff member (including health or medical staff and law enforcement unit personnel); a person serving on the School Board; a person or company with whom the District has contracted to perform a special task (such as an attorney, auditor, medical consultant, or therapist); or a parent or student serving on an official committee, such as a disciplinary or grievance committee, or assisting another school official in performing his or her tasks.
- b. A school official has a legitimate educational interest if the official needs to review an education record in order to fulfill his or her professional responsibility.
- c. Upon request, the District discloses education records without consent to officials of another school district in which a student seeks or intends to enroll. [NOTE: FERPA requires a school district to make a reasonable attempt to notify the student of the records request unless it states in its annual notification that it intends to forward records on request.]
- 4) The right to file a complaint with the U.S. Department of Education concerning alleged failures by the District to comply with the requirements of FERPA. The name and address of the Office that administers FERPA is: Family Policy Compliance Office; U.S. Department of Education; 600 Independence Avenue, SW; Washington, DC 20202-4605

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 provides that the following "directory information" may be released upon request: student's name, date of birth, phone number, address and/or email, parent name(s), school of attendance, school photographs or videos of students participating in school activities, events or programs, picture(s), video(s), publication of student picture(s), personally identifiable artwork, school activity group(s), participation in officially recognized activities and sports, height and weight if member of an athletic team, dates of attendance, date of graduation, awards received, honor rolls, scholarships, telephone numbers for inclusion in school of PTO directories.

In order to comply with this legislation, the district requests that parents, emancipated minors and those students 18 years of age and over, who do NOT wish release of this information, mail or personally submit an Opt-Out form to the building principal or Assistant Superintendent of Personnel and Student Services, Hartland Consolidated Schools, 9525 E Highland Road, Howell, MI 48843 by October 1st of the new school year. Opt-Out Forms are available in each school office and at Central Office upon request.


