Welcome Back From Hartland Transportation!

The 2019/2020 school year is quickly approaching. We are looking forward to another great year! As always, we strive to make your child's bus ride a positive part of their educational experience. Here are a few important informational points for review:

- Your student must be waiting at the bus stop 5 minutes prior to the scheduled arrival of the bus. Once the alternating lights of the bus are deactivated, the bus driver cannot legally reactivate them and it is then the parent's responsibility to transport their student to school.
- Students and Parents should never try to catch the bus once the lights have been canceled. Please do not go to another bus stop without contacting the Transportation Office; the bus driver must be notified.
- If possible, your house number should be visible from the traveled roadway; mailbox numbers are acceptable but should be large enough and clearly visible on both sides.
- The expected behavior of the student rider is found in the Parent-Student Handbook. We encourage parents to review these responsibilities with their children to ensure their privilege of riding is not lost. The handbook can be found by going to the district website at www.hartlandschools.us, then clicking on Parents & Students and then on Handbooks.
- Postcards will be mailed home a week before school starts with your student's
 bus information. The computerized postcard will only list one stop address but
 your student should wait on the same side of the road they reside on until the
 bus is in place with red lights activated and the bus driver crosses them.
- Students should never cross the road prior to arrival of the bus.

From the Counseling Office

Hartland seniors are encouraged to use their time over the summer vacation to make sure they are ready for the college application season. Most colleges have their applications available online on August 1st. In order to apply for admission seniors must:

- Complete the online college application and follow all steps outlined by the specific application.
- Request that Hartland HS send your official transcript by creating a www.parchment.com account and completing an online transcript request. Students who are well organized and planning ahead can make transcript requests in August. However, seniors should note that the HS Counseling Office will not begin processing transcript requests until the second week of school.
- 3. Submit all necessary payments.

- 4. Monitor your application through your account on the college website to make sure that all parts of your electronic application were received and downloaded in a timely manner.
- 5. Let your counselor know when you are accepted.

Once you have completed all of applications, seniors are able to move on to complete their financial aid applications (FAFSA) in October, which is much earlier than in past years. This earlier filing deadline will allow families to use their 2018 tax documents to apply for financial aid, rather than waiting until January for their 2019 tax documents.

Finally, seniors can begin the process of researching scholarship opportunities. There are numerous online search engines for scholarships that can be particularly helpful. In addition, the counseling office will email you with a monthly newsletter filled with scholarship opportunities. Seniors who have use their summer wisely and have completed their applications early in the fall are far less stressed and have more time to devote to searching for scholarship dollars!

Welcome to the New School Year

We are very excited to see all of the students after a wonderful summer break. Below are essential dates/ times to ensure a smooth start to the school year:

Grades 10, 11, & 12 Registration: Will be held at the high school on Wednesday, August 7th. Students will get their school picture taken, pay for and pick up their parking hang tag (11th and 12th grade), receive their fall schedule, have the ability to talk to their counselor and receive their high school ID card on site. 10th Grade: 8–10 AM, 11th Grade: 11 AM–1 PM, 12th Grade: 1–3 PM

Please be aware that ONLINE enrollment for all new and current Hartland Consolidated students is required this year in an effort to go paperless. Please ensure that your email address is updated in the Parent Portal. Detailed directions have been sent out to complete the process. The online enrollment will be completed through the Parent Portal.

11th and 12th graders who would like to park on campus must register for a parking spot online BEFORE registration! The link to register can be found on the high school website. The \$75 fee must be paid at registration to receive the hang-tag. You can also pay and pick up the hang-tag from the office any day after August 8th. Students must show a valid driver's license at the time of pick up.

In order to get a student parking hang-tag, students cannot have any outstanding fines or fees. No exceptions. Please check your student's Pay-For-It account for any outstanding fines and fees. Also, please check Parent Connect to make sure your student does not have a negative lunch account to start the year.

LINK/9th grade Orientation: Will be held at Hartland High School from 7:30 AM—12:30 PM. 9th grade students will spend the morning doing team-building activities and learning about life as a Hartland High School student. As a part of their day, they will get their school picture taken, receive their schedule and receive their HHS ID card. If you cannot attend, students can pick up their schedules from the high school main office any day after August 8th. Please ensure the online registration has been completed before LINK Day! There is a 9th grade parent meeting from 8—9 AM in the high school auditorium the morning of LINK Orientation on August 8th. Parents will have the opportunity to chat with high school counselors, administration and to ask questions about Hartland High School.

Make-up Registration: Did you miss registration? Make-up registration will be held at the high school on Thurs-day, August 15, 2019 from 8–11 AM. Students will pick up and pay for parking tags (11th and 12th graders), get their school picture taken, and pick up their schedules.

First day of School: Mark your calendars! We'll be starting our school year on Wednesday, August 21, 2019. School starts promptly at 7:20 AM. Please ensure your student is aware of the High School dress code!

Back-to-School Night: If you'd like a chance to meet your student's teachers and see the high school facilities, please plan to join us for Back to School Night on Wednesday, August 28, 2019 from 6:30–8:30 PM.



Attendance Information and Expectations:

Please keep in mind that regular school attendance is critically important to the academic success of your child. Please keep in contact with our office regarding your child's attendance and if they are ill or need to miss school for a medical appointment, please provide our office with a note documenting the absence. I will be continuing to send out attendance letters to parents when their child misses 5, 10, and 15 days of school, as well as for excessive tardies or early pick-ups. Through raising awareness of student absences, we hope to reduce our amount of chronically absent students (15 days or more absent) from 11% (53 students) for the 2018-19 school year to closer to 5% for the coming year.

Tips for Improving School Attendance:

- 1. Try to schedule doctor and dentist appointments in the beginning or end of the day so that your child will only miss an hour or a $\frac{1}{2}$ day. Appointments can also be scheduled on days off.
- If your child has a fever or vomiting staying home from school is necessary until they are fever/vomiting free for 24 hours. Your child will benefit from early detection and action in order to get healthy and return to school promptly.
- 3. Monitor your child's attendance through Parent Connect to keep track of absences. Many times parents are unaware of how many times their student has been absent until seen on a data sheet.
- 4. We know there are a wide variety of reasons students are absent from school, from health concerns to transportation challenges. There are many people in our building prepared to help you if you or your student are facing challenges getting to school. Please reach out to Mr. Howerton whenever a need/challenge arises. We appreciate your efforts and concern.

Essential Instructional Practices in Early Literacy


Here, at Hartland Preschool, we have adopted the ten recommended instructional practices as developed by the Early Literacy Task Force. Each month we will be exploring the practices that we perform in our classrooms. These important tips not only demonstrate what we practice in the preschool classrooms but are also important to nurture a well-rounded child as they enter elementary school and beyond.

The Instructional practices were developed by the *Michigan Association of Intermediate School Administrators General Education Leadership Network (GELN) Early Literacy Task Force (2016). Essential instructional practices in early literacy: Prekindergarten, Lansing, MI: Authors.*

GELN Practices 6 & 9 – Interactions Around Writing and Ongoing Observation & Assessment of Children's Language and Literacy Development that Informs Their Education

The General Education Leadership Network suggests that adults engage in deliberate interactions with children around writing, giving them opportunities to write texts that are personally meaningful to them. These writings may include interactive writing which involves contributing to a piece of writing led by the teacher, or scaffolded writing which allows the individual child to create their own message that they would like to share.

Both of these practices are utilized in the classroom on a regular basis, following developmentally appropriate methods. Students are encouraged to begin the writing process by first writing their name how they think it looks, then by copying or tracing their name using their individualized name card. Building upon this first step, writing materials are provided throughout the day and students are encouraged to use their creativity in the writing process. This can be done in a variety of ways; drawing pictures, then writing words to describe their creation, creating lists through dramatic play, using a finger to write in salt, sand or cream, writing on dry erase boards, and writing on the Interactive Televisions and SMARTboards are just a few examples of how teachers promote this practice in the classroom.



It is important to note that the process of learning to write can look different for everyone. It is appropriate at this age for writing to appear as a scribble, letter-like forms, random letters, or even a few letters that can be found in the word they are writing. Encouraging students to learn through a processed approach fosters their creativity and empowers them to grow and excel!

The final step in practicing the GELN Instruction is that of continuous observation and assessments of children's language and literacy development. This is completed by observing and interacting with children during their open exploration time, asking students to recall and retell stories as well as lessons learned during circle time, and having students read a message of the day both in and out of order on the Interactive Television and SMARTboard. Additionally, photo journaling their progress throughout the year, as well as verbal assessments are also ways teachers continuously observe and assess here at Hartland Consolidated Schools Preschool.



Following the 10 Essential Instructional Practices in Early Literacy, attending regular continuing education courses, collaborating with Elementary School Teachers & LESA Specialists, and completing annual training with our District's Math and Literacy Coaches are just a few ways Hartland Consolidated Schools Preschool sets itself apart from other programs. The question is not "Are we doing enough," but "What can we do to continuously improve our program, ourselves and best support our students?" Our goal at HCSP is to instill lifelong learners not only in our students, but ourselves as well!

Our licensed Day Care has limited openings. Please stop in or call to see if we have availability for your child. Rates: Infant \$47/day, minimum five (5) days per week, Day Care \$39/day, minimum four (4) days per week.

We offer care for children who attend the Round, Village and Creekside, Lakes Elementary and Farms Intermediate School. The children who attend the **Lakes or Farms** Schools may enroll at the School Street center, or take advantage of the school-age program at the Lakes Elementary School.

The School Street Center is open from 6 AM-6: PM. Lakes Elementary is open from 6:30 AM-6 PM.

Both programs offer gym activities, arts and crafts, and outside play. When you are signed up for the Before and After School Care, you also have the option of attending on the "No School" days or Snow days! Our center is almost always open!

Before & After School Child Care Only

Full Time enrollment (5 days a week) is \$10 a session. Part Time enrollment (2-4 days a week) is \$14 a session. The minimum enrollment is 2 sessions a week for a charge of \$28 for the week.

Example- A student needs to attend 5 –AM sessions and 1 –PM session. The charge would be \$50 for the AM and \$14 for the PM session, for a total charge for the week of \$64.

You must notify the office if your child/children will be absent from the Before & After school program. Your regular weekly tuition will be charged unless the Center is closed. If your Before & After School child attends on a No School Day, Snow Day, etc., your tuition for the day will be \$39.





Is your child ready for kindergarten or first grade?

Can they sit still, listen, follow directions and get along with others?

While teaching 100s of preschoolers and kindergarteners over the last 16 years, we have discovered one critical key to success for not only school but for the rest of their lives.

Here is the key: Your child's start in school is **HUGE!** It will pretty much dictate how they do for the rest of their academic career! If your child is ahead of her peers she will stay ahead and love school. Kids who struggle or start off behind their peers almost never catch up and like school much less.

Along with falling behind they can sometimes get inaccurately "labeled" as unable to focus, hyperactive or extremely shy. We have wonderful teachers in our elementary schools but, partially because of the overwhelming academic curriculum, they do not have the time or resources to teach the needed basic behavioral and social skills to your child. Young children really need to have these skills **BEFORE** they start kindergarten and first grade.

As a result, we are seeing more young kids struggling in school. We have talented hard-working kindergarten teachers in our community but increasingly they are needing to just give their students the benefit of the doubt and pass them on to first grade hoping they succeed.

The missing skills we are talking about are centered around "Self-Regulation." Schools are also calling this "SEL" or Social Emotional Learning.

Self-regulation is the ability to monitor and manage emotions, thoughts and behaviors. It's what helps children focus their attention on learning when they might be distracted by others, upset by a problem or excited about an upcoming event.

When humans are first born, they have little control of their reaction to their emotions and feelings for good reason. When they are hungry or uncomfortable they cry. As they

get older they need to be able to regulate their response and not just react to their emotions. For example, when they get mad they cannot just hit others. Or, when they are playing with others they may need to share when they do not want to. They may have to focus and listen while being distracted. These skills are not just required for success in young children. Later they help teens and adults resolve conflict, problem solve, think independently, participate and get along with others.

So how do you help your child? Just copy what we do. At our karate school, we like to use the term "accelerating their lives." Often these skills just need more practice! We want our students to experience things at five years old that most kids do not experience until they are in high school. A good example of this is public speaking. While our students practice speaking and performing in front of a group at an early age, many kid's first experience is that speech class in high school!

Children learn by "doing" and repetition. So here is what you can do at home. Intentionally look for experiences that practice self-regulating skills. Things like having to listen to instructors and coaches. Handling distractions. Placed in emotional situations like getting frustrated or making a mistake. Expose them to stress, failure and hard-ship regularly. Working with partners and on a team. Get them involved with making decision and making choices. Place them in situations where they have to help others, and then eventually in leadership positions.

Anyways I hope this helps. Like I always tell our parents "You only get <u>one</u> chance to start kindergarten or first grade!"

ASBESTOS HAZARD EMERGENCY RESPONSE ACT (AHERA) 2019 NOTIFICATION

The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) requires that each year, district workers and building occupants receive notification about asbestos activities such as response actions and inspections. The purpose of this correspondence is to meet those requirements and familiarize you with the asbestos related activities that have been conducted in Hartland Consolidated Schools during the last year.

MANAGEMENT PLANS

In 1988, Hartland Consolidated Schools contracted with Trust Thermal Systems, to conduct inspections for asbestos containing material (ACM) within all district owned buildings. These Management Plans are available for review in the administrative office of each building. An electronic copy of each building management plan is also located in the Maintenance and Operations office.

SURVEILLANCE ACTIVITIES

The AHERA regulation requires surveillance of the condition of ACM every six months and Reinspections every three years. The Three-Year Reinspection within each of our buildings was conducted in December of 2018. The next Reinspection will be conducted in November of 2021. The last periodic surveillance was conducted in May of 2019. All of these surveillance activities will be included as part of the building's Management Plans.

ASBESTOS ABATEMENT

During the past year there were minor abatement at various buildings in the district. All documentation regarding past and future asbestos abatement projects are available to be viewed electronically, for access please contact the designated person at the Maintenance and Operations Office. Air tests will be conducted throughout all phases of the future asbestos removal projects at each building. The air samples will be collected and analyzed in accordance with all regulatory agency requirements.

Advisory To All Parents Regarding Integrated Pest Management

Hartland Consolidated Schools has adopted an Integrated Pest Management program. Inherent with this are the District's efforts to reduce pesticide use as much as possible. While it may occasionally be necessary to apply a pesticide, these will only be used as a last resort. This program does not rely on routine pesticide applications to resolve problems. We use various techniques such as habitat alteration, sanitation, mechanical means, exclusion, etc. to prevent pest from becoming a problem. You will receive advanced notice of the application of a pesticide, other than bait or gel formulations at your child's school. This advance notice of the application will be given 48 hours before the application. The law requires

us to do this notification by using two methods. The first method required by the law is the posting at the primary entrances to your child's school. The entrances that will be posted are those entrances that have a sidewalk that leads directly to a parking lot. The second method we are going to use is the posting in a common area located by the main office of the school. Parents are also entitled to receive this notice by first-class United States mail postmarked at least 3 days before the application. If you would like to be notified by mail or e-mail please contact the Operations Department at (810) 626-2185. Please give the office your name, mailing address and what school your child attends. In an emergency (for

example, bees nest), pesticides may be applied without prior notice, but you will be provided notice following any such application. You may review our IPM program or pesticide application records for your child's school by calling or e-mailing Matt Marino the District's Director of Operations at (810) 626-2185 e-mail at mattmarino@hartlandschools.us. This number or e-mail may also be used when school is not in regular session.
