Between now and the end of the school year, I will be busy working with district personnel planning for the 2020-21 school year, while also meeting with as many people as possible to share information regarding the potential May 5, 2020 bond proposal. If the Board of Education passes an official resolution to move forward with the bond proposal on February 10, 2020, I will be hosting the following community information sessions: Thursday, February 20, 2020 at 6 PM in the Board of Education Room and Wednesday, March 11, 2020 at 6 PM in the Board of Education Room.

All community members are welcome to attend these sessions to ask questions and get a better understanding of what is included in the potential bond proposal. Please mark your calendars as I hope to see many of you at these meetings.

Did you know if the bond proposal is placed before the Hartland voters on May 5, 2020 and approved, our Robotics, Archery, and Band programs could be enhanced?

**Robotics Program Enhancement:** The proposal will call for renovating and building additional space at the Hartland Educational Support Service Center to house a Robotics Center. The center would include a work space, storage, restrooms and playing fields for the robotics program.


**Hartland Archery Program Enhancement:** The Round Elementary School would have its gym floor refinished to accommodate use for youth basketball programming so that the Hartland Archery program can move into a new home at Village Elementary. The space is big enough for maximizing shooting lanes and will allow for storage so that the program does not have to live out of a trailer, as they have been for many years.

**Band Program Enhancement:** The Hartland Band programs would also benefit from the passage of the bond proposal as it includes options for the purchase of new band instruments. It has been roughly twenty years (2000 Bond) since the band programs have seen an emphasis on instrument replacement.

It uses a comprehensive communication system to facilitate tip sharing among students, parents, school personnel, community mental health service programs, the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services and law enforcement officials about harmful behaviors that threaten to disrupt the learning environment

# **Kindergarten Orientation**

A Kindergarten Orientation will be held on Saturday, February 8, 2020, from 10 AM to 11:30 AM at the Hartland Educational Support Service Center, 9525 E. Highland Road.

The orientation will provide parents an opportunity to hear from kindergarten teachers about a "typical" school day and the kindergarten curriculum. In addition, administrators will be on hand to talk about school safety, transportation, school attendance areas, student nutrition, and answer questions. This will be a family-oriented event and you are encouraged to bring your kindergarten child(ren).

Parents may begin the pre-enrollment process online and complete the enrollment when visiting their respective elementary school or the HESSC and providing the following documents:

- Birth certificate-a copy for school records.
- Immunization records with proof of DTP, Polio, MMR, Hepatitis B, Chicken Pox vaccines (or proof of having illness), and vision screening, plus copy of same for school records.
- Proof of residency using one of the following: certificate of occupancy, purchase agreement, builder's permit, rent receipt or agreement, mortgage statement/receipt, voter registration card, utility bill, driver's license.

Children are eligible for enrollment in kindergarten in August 2020 if they will have their fifth (5th) birthday on or before September 1, 2020. A child who turns five after September 1st and before December 1, 2020 may enroll if parent/legal guardian signs a waiver that is supported by the school district.

A full-day Junior Kindergarten program may be offered. A minimum number of students are required for the program to be made available. Parent may need to provide transportation in order to participate. The age requirements for Junior Kindergarten are the same as for the regular Kindergarten program. # MY CHILD IS NOT SHY ...

#### Do they ever hold back?

I cannot tell you the number of times I have heard a young mother say to me "Sensei, Bella is not shy...once she gets to know you she is not shy at all!"

I have to just smile and nod because this is what shyness is—that <u>initial</u> reaction or holding back!

We see so many shy children today. Is it more common and prevalent in today's world? I think both pushing kids too hard too young (making them perfectionists) and "over-parenting" (helicopter parents) may be contributing factors.

Working with children with shyness is near and dear to my heart—because I was shy growing up! I did not realize until just recently how much it affected my life. But I now see that it held me back and was a self-limiting factor in almost everything I did.

Were you shy as a child? Are you still a little shy now? Besides meeting people or trying new things here is what it did to me—it caused me to live in the dreaded "grey zone"!

The grey zone is that place in the middle. You know it—wanting to lay low, not stick out, stay safe, not take any risks. I, like many, was trapped in a box and never really realized it. Instead of excelling I had to stay average and fit in. If you want to know the truth just replace the word "mediocre" for the word average. I was set on a track to live a mediocre life. This now drives me absolutely crazy!

Here is another amazing revelation that took me 50 years to realize—like many, others saw me as a successful high achiever. I graduated from the Naval Academy, had a successful career in the Navy and corporate world, a wonderful family. Yet I know, looking back, I always stopped short of my full potential. So even if you have a



seemingly successful and high achieving child, is shyness keeping them in that safe "grey zone"? That grey zone of "this is good enough" and I do not want to extend any further so I stay safe. Just imagine if you could free them from that powerful invisible box.

I tell you my story only to make it real for you or hopefully help you see it in your child (or even yourself). Even high achievers are affected by shyness. And, definitely if you have a young child you could significantly change the course of their life now. So do you see the signs of shyness in

your child? Meeting people, separation anxiety, shying away from hard or new things, giving up or quitting too easily or quickly, inability to speak up or raise their hand? Taking the safer easier way? Living in the GREY ZONE?!

Okay so what can you do as a parent? The way to get your child out of their box is to form a simple powerful "habit". This is the habit of constantly confronting and conquering/powering through their fears because that is all shyness is - a form of fear. Here is the key to any fear—every time you encounter a fear and power through it YOU get stronger but...every time you hesitate, hold back or step back your FEAR gets stronger!

I love this quote from Eleanor Roosevelt—"Do one thing every day that scares you!" 'Til next time!


