2020 Bond Proposal

Kindergarten Enrollment 2020-2021

Kindergarten enrollment packets are now available online at hartlandschools.us.

Parents may begin the enrollment process online and complete the enrollment when visiting their respective elementary school or the HESSC and providing the following documents:

- Birth certificate-a copy for school records.
- Immunization records with proof of DTP, Polio, MMR, Hepatitis B, Chicken Pox vaccines (or proof of having illness), and vision screening, plus copy of same for school records.
- Proof of residency using one of the following: certificate of occupancy, purchase agreement, builder's permit, rent receipt or agreement, mortgage statement/receipt, voter registration card, utility bill, driver's license.

Children are eligible for enrollment in kindergarten in August 2020 if they will have their fifth (5th) birthday on or before September 1, 2020. A child who turns five after September 1st and before December 1, 2020 may enroll if parent/legal guardian signs a waiver that is supported by the school district.

A full-day Junior Kindergarten program may be offered. A minimum number of students are required for the program to be made available. Parents may need to provide transportation in order to participate. The age requirements for Junior Kindergarten are the same as for the regular Kindergarten program. Transportation Information for the Upcoming School Year

It's time to start thinking about busing for the new school year. For your convenience, forms are now being accepted to ensure room on every bus to accommodate your transportation needs for the first day of school.

All transportation forms (Alternate Destination, Joint Custody, School of Choice, and Legacy forms) will expire at the end of the 19/20 school year. If new forms are not submitted, in-district students will automatically be assigned to the closest bus stop to their home address, and non-resident students will not receive a bus assignment.

The deadline for submitting forms to the Transportation Office to request a bus assignment

other than the home address is June 15, 2020. Late transportation requests will not be considered until after the first two weeks of school.

The Transportation and Central Office staff will be available throughout the summer months if you should have any questions or need assistance. Post cards with your student's bus information should arrive a week before the first day of school. If you have any questions feel free to call us at 810-626-2175.

Looking for high quality child care? Our licensed child care center is ready to have you join our family! Please call or email us to see if we have availability for your child. We serve infants through early 5s at our center. We also offer before and after care for children who attend the Round, Village, Creekside, Lakes Elementary and Farms Intermediate School. The children who attend the Lakes or Farms Schools may enroll at the School Street center, or take advantage of the school-age program at the Lakes Elementary School. The School Street Center is open from 6 AM–6 PM. Lakes Elementary is open from 6:30 AM–6 PM. Both programs offer gym activities, arts and crafts and outside play. When you are signed up for the Before and After School Care, you also have the option of attending on the "No School" days or Snow days! Our center is almost always open!

- ☐ Be sure to check your Medicare claim summaries for errors and questionable bills
- ☐ If you suspect Medicare fraud, please report it by calling Medicare's toll-free customer service center at 1-800-MEDICARE (1-800-633-4227), or by visiting www.medicare.gov/fraud
- ☐ If your doctor orders a COVID-19 test for you, Medicare covers all of the costs. You should not have any cost-sharing.
- ☐ Medicare also covers all medically necessary hospitalizations. This includes extra days in the hospital for in-patients who were on the verge of being discharged, but were diagnosed with COVID-19 and had to stay longer under quarantine
- ☐ There's no vaccine for COVID-19 at this time. However, if one becomes available, Medicare will cover it
- ☐ If you have a Medicare Advantage Plan, you have the same benefits as people with Original Medicare. Medicare Advantage plans are now required to have the same cost-sharing for COVID-19 lab tests as Original Medicare: zero
- □ Medicare also recently expanded its coverage of telehealth services to enable beneficiaries across the country to receive a wider range of healthcare services from doctors without having to travel to a healthcare facility
- □ Doctors, nurse practitioners, clinical psychologists, and licensed clinical social workers can deliver telehealth services via phone and video chat. Medicare beneficiaries can receive telehealth services in their home as well as in any healthcare facility, including a physician's office, hospital, nursing home, or rural health clinic
- □ During this emergency, Medicare will pay for telehealth services at the same rates as in-person services, giving doctors an incentive to use this alternative and reserve their offices to treat those who truly require in-person care

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






OAK WILT

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

What is it?

- Oak wilt, caused by a fungus, is a vascular disease of oak trees.
- Oak wilt restricts the flow of water and nutrients through the tree, causing the foliage to wilt.
- Oak wilt has been found on trees throughout the Midwest.
- -All oaks are susceptible to oak wilt, but it is lethal for species in the red oak group.

What Can I Do to Help?



DO NOT PRUNE OAK TREES APRIL- JUNE

when the highest risk of infection occurs. It is prudent to avoid pruning until trees have lost their leaves for winter.



DO NOT MOVE FIREWOOD

- especially if it comes from oak-wilt killed trees, as it can harbor the fungus.
