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## Superintendent's Corner

### May 5, 2020 Bond Proposal Update:

During the month of October, I hosted six focus group meetings designed to share details of the May 5, 2020 potential bond package. The focus groups included the following:

- Regular voters 65-70 years of age (100 random community members invited)
- Secondary parents with children at Ore Creek Middle School or Hartland High School
- Teachers and coaches (from youth to high school)
- Elected officials and community leaders
- High school students (11th-12th grade)
- Parents with children at our four elementary schools and Farms



Community and school stakeholders attended these sessions to learn about the district's current financial picture and past bonding history, how the 2020 bond proposal was developed, content of the bond package proposal and the schedule for work to be completed if the bond proposal passes as a key to planning and building for a better future. The focus group members were provided an opportunity to ask questions and share thoughts about the bond proposal. I will use these thoughts to adjust the proposal, if necessary, and to design the district's marketing plan for this proposal. I want to thank everyone involved in this effort as their time and voices are of tremendous value. I also want the community to know that I will hold at least two open sessions in January or February so that interested individuals can learn more and ask questions about the May 5, 2020 bond proposal. I will advertise these events in Community Life, on the district website at hartlandschools.us, Twitter, Facebook and in each of the school newsletters.

### District Snow Day Procedures:

As the weather changes and the snow and ice start arriving, I thought I would share how the decision is made to close school for what everyone calls a "snow day." Many people ask about the process, so I have described it below.

**Step 1:** The Superintendent and Director of Operations pay attention to weather condition predictions for the following morning. If bad weather is not predicted, end process and sleep well. If bad weather is predicted, go to Step 2.

**Step 2:** The Superintendent and Director of Operations arrange for bus and vehicle drivers to drive the roads around Hartland starting at about 3:30 AM to assess conditions. The Superintendent and Director of Operations start communicating with each other, surrounding district transportation directors and superintendents, possibly the County Road Commission and local law enforcement to assess road conditions with safety in mind. There is an effort to decide by 5:30 AM. If roads are deemed too poor to travel, go to Step 3. If roads are deemed okay to travel, go to Step 6.

**Step 3:** The Superintendent makes the call to have a snow day and communicates with the Director of Community Education to determine if the Child Care Center should remain open for business. Go to Step 4.

**Step 4:** Once a snow day has been called and the question of child care operations has been agreed upon, the Superintendent will contact the administrative team to inform the local radio station (WHMI), Detroit area television stations, Facebook (@hartlandconsolidated-schools), Twitter (join @Hartlandschools to get the fastest notice), the district website www.hartlandschools.us, as well as send out phone calls and text messages to announce that the district has called a snow day. All district events are canceled and buildings are closed for the morning.

**Step 5:** Between 11 AM and 12 PM on the snow day, the Superintendent, Director of Operations, Athletic Director, Director of Community Education and High School Principal determine what, if any, events will be open for the afternoon at the high school and Educational Support Service Center. All other buildings (not including the 51 Building) are shut down until the following morning without exception to give our employees an opportunity to clear sidewalks, driveways and parking lots in preparation to reopen the following day.

**Step 6:** Prepare for phone calls and social media posts that disagree with the decision made.

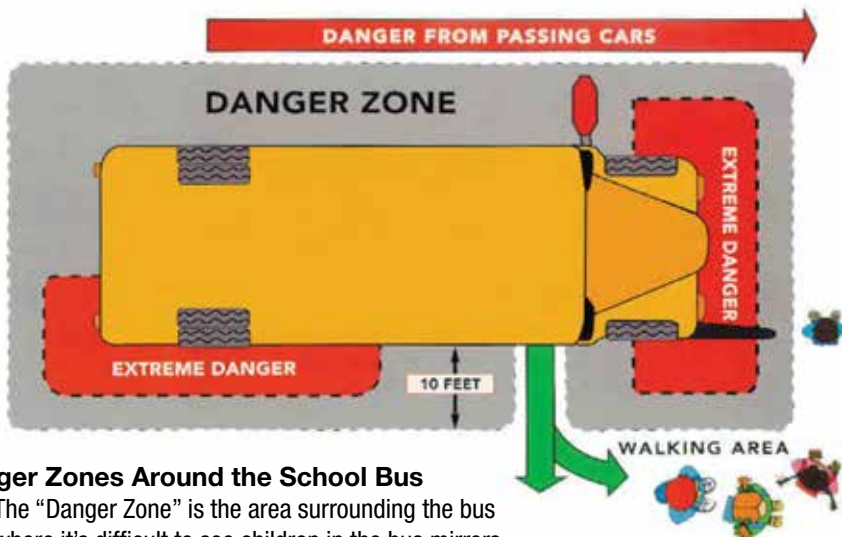

## School Bus Safety



### Danger Zones Around the School Bus

- The "Danger Zone" is the area surrounding the bus where it's difficult to see children in the bus mirrors.
- 20 feet in front, 10 feet behind and 10 feet on each side of the school bus.

### Loading and Unloading Safely:

- STAY on your own side of the road – 10 feet from the roadway, in a single row.
- WAIT until the bus has come to a complete stop, the red overhead lights are activated, and the driver displays the yellow safety signal.
- When crossing the road, check traffic both ways – then check again and walk 10 feet in front of the bus.
- NEVER stop to pick-up anything on the ground.

OK2SAY is the student safety program which allows students to confidentially report tips on potential harm or criminal activities directed at school students, school employees, and schools. It uses a comprehensive communication system to facilitate tip sharing among students, parents, school personnel, community mental health service programs, the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services and law enforcement officials about harmful behaviors that threaten to disrupt the learning environment.

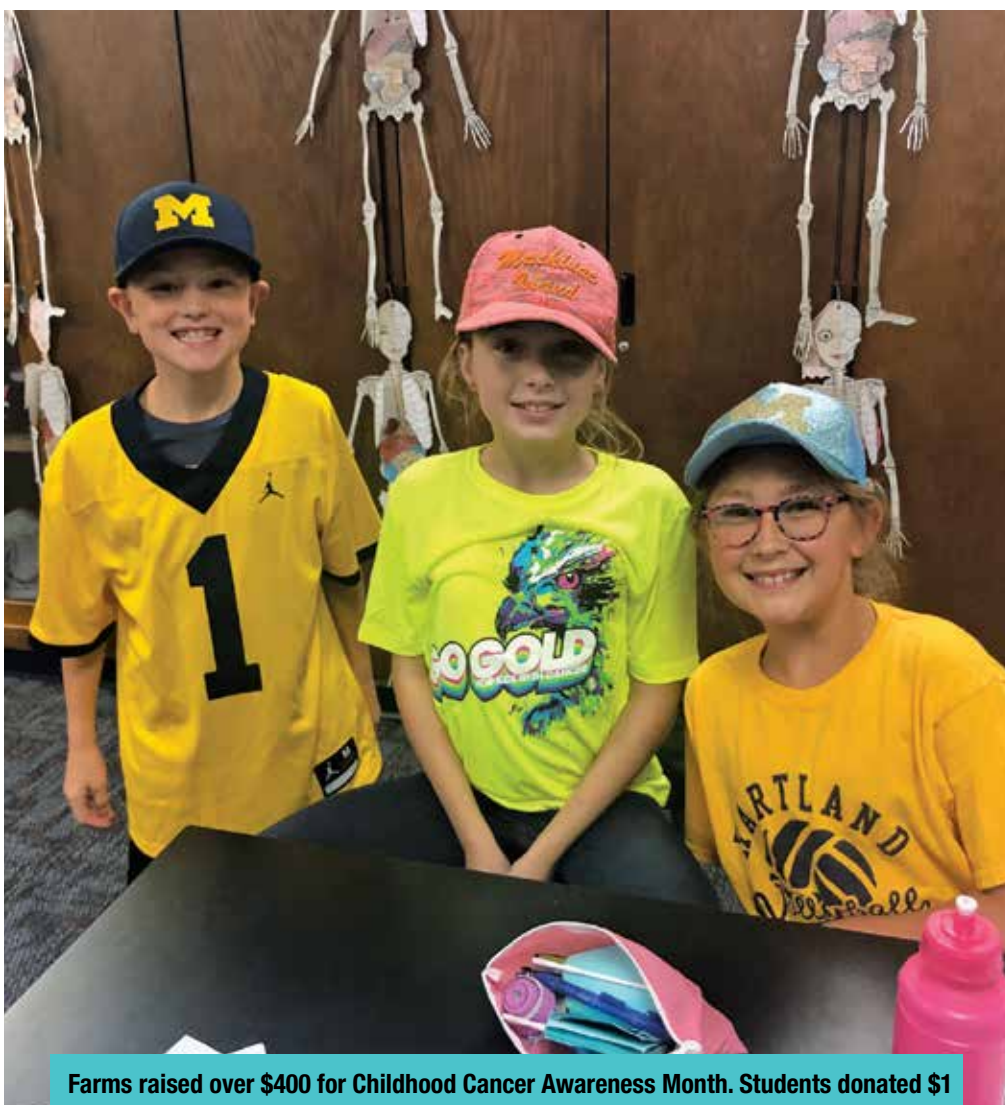

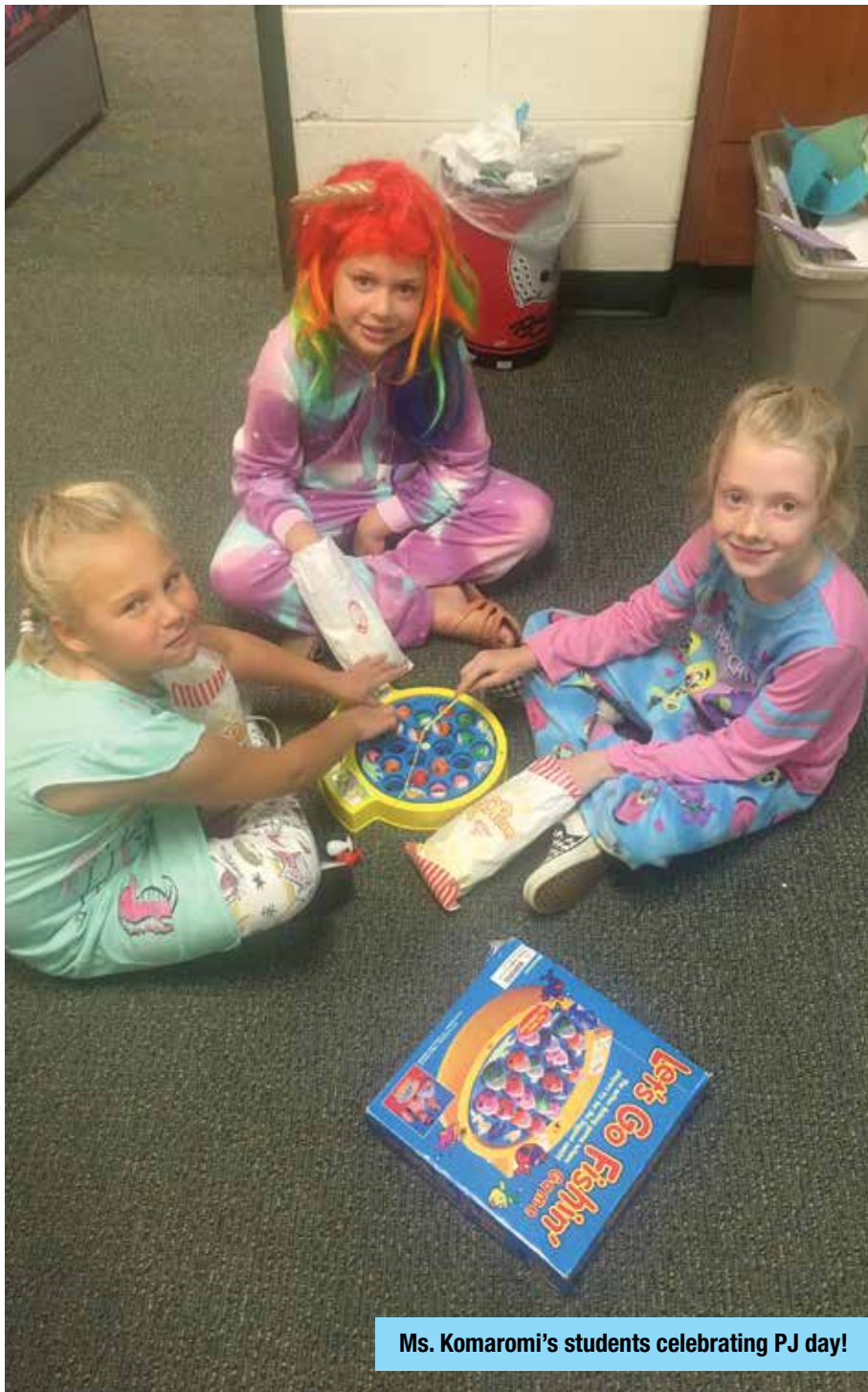

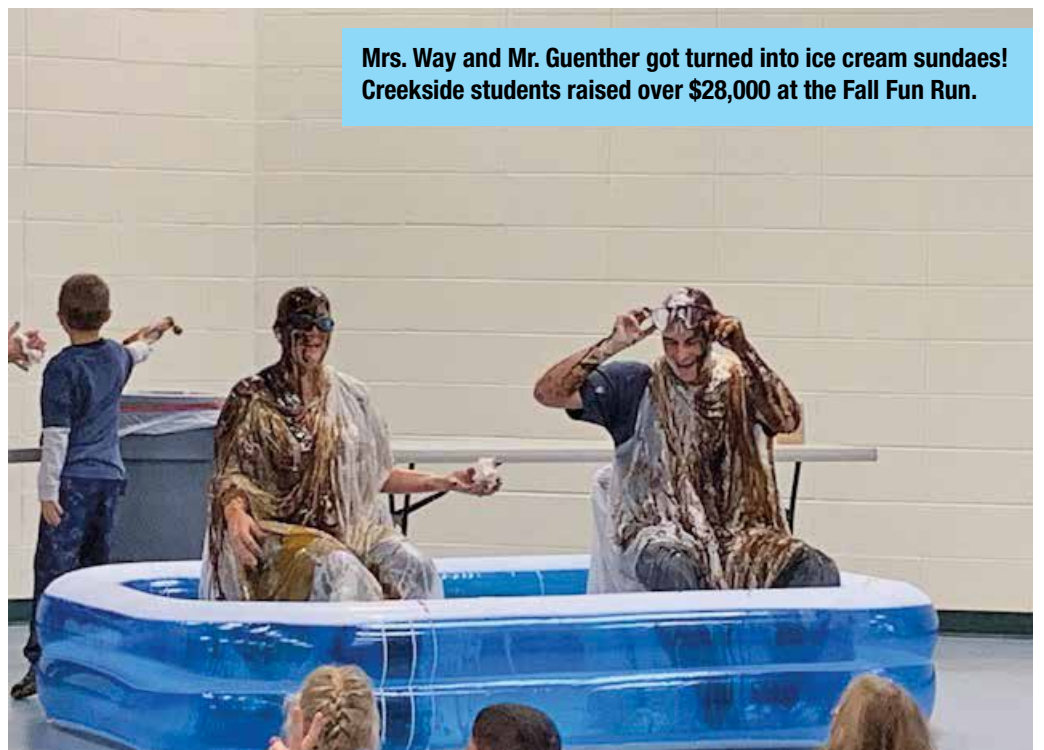

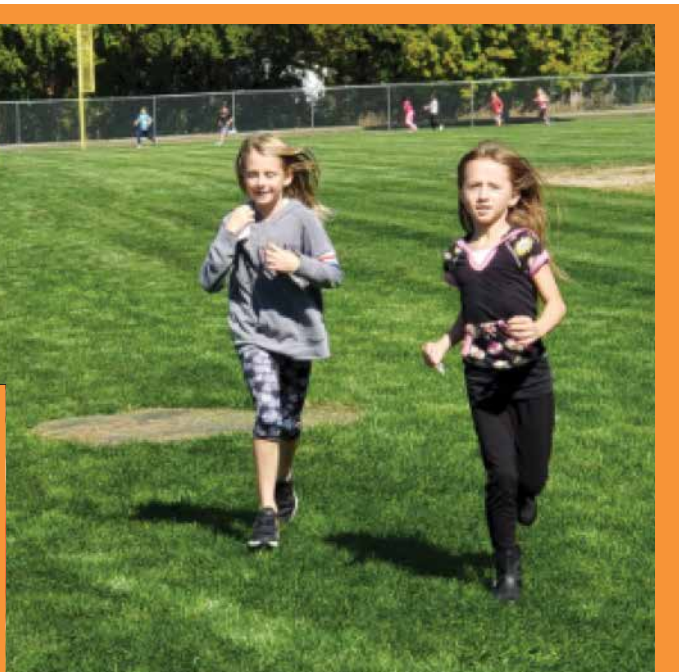
## Introducing the Village Victor Program

# Welcome to Hartland Preschool!

From the moment they are born, children use senses to explore and try to make sense of the world around them! They do this by touching, tasting, smelling, seeing and hearing.

Here at Hartland Preschool, we find Sensory Learning to be pivotal in helping our students grow, cooperate and have a positive experience in the classroom.

Studies have shown that children learn best and retain the most information when they use their senses. Providing opportunities for children to use their senses leads to a child's ability to complete more complex learning tasks and supports cognitive growth, language development, gross motor skills,

social interaction and problem solving skills. Sensory play also supports language development, fine and gross motor skills and problem solving skills!

The sensory activities we use in the classroom encourage exploration while students play, create and investigate. Sensory play also helps with social interactions and anxiety. For example, initially a child may find it difficult to play appropriately with a classmate when there are other things going on in the classroom. Sensory play is great for calming an anxious or frustrated child by giving them an outlet, and providing a simple task to focus on either individually or with a peer.

Some of our sensory activities may include access to water for play, diffusing essential oils, drawing letters or numbers in salt, digging for treasures in a bin of beans and rice, using special cream on a tray, Play-Doh, calming bottles and much more!

Utilizing all five (5) of our senses through touching, tasting, smelling, seeing and hearing, we continue to learn and grow in exponential ways here at HCPS!

We offer care for children who attend the Round, Village and Creekside, Lakes Elementary and Farms Intermediate School. The children who attend the **Lakes or Farms** Schools may enroll at the School Street center, or take advantage of the school-age program at the Lakes Elementary School.

**The School Street Center is open from 6 AM–6 PM. Lakes Elementary is open from 6:30 AM–6 PM.**

Both programs offer gym activities, arts and crafts, and outside play. When you are signed up for the Before and After School Care, you also have the option of attending on the "No School" days or Snow days! Our center is almost always open!

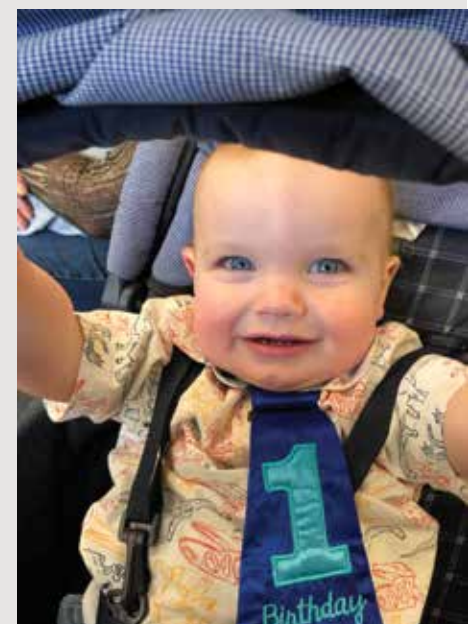
### Before & After School Child Care Only

Full Time enrollment (5 days a week) is \$10 a session. Part Time enrollment (2-4 days a week) is \$14 a session. The minimum enrollment is 2 sessions a week for a charge of \$28 for the week.

Example- A student needs to attend 5 morning sessions and 1 afternoon session. The charge would be \$50 for the AM and \$14 for the PM session, for a total charge for the week of \$64.

**You must notify the office if your child/children will be absent from the Before & After school program. Your regular weekly tuition will be charged unless the Center is closed. If your Before & After School child attends on a No School Day, Snow Day, etc., your tuition for the day will be \$39.**

## CHILD FIND

Child Find is an ongoing process of locating, identifying and evaluating children, ages birth through 26, who may have developmental delays or disabilities or who are in need of special education and related services. Children identified with developmental delays or a specific disability are entitled to a free, appropriate public education designed to meet his/her needs.

Hartland Consolidated Schools (HCS), in collaboration with Livingston Educational Service Agency, engages in activities and assessments to identify children who may be suspected of having a developmental delay or disability. This includes students enrolled in private schools and those that are home-schooled, mobile, migrant or homeless.

Referrals for intervention can be made by anyone concerned with a child's educational performance, including a parent, child's teacher, community agency or school official.

#### Children Ages Birth Through Preschool

Parents, providers or medical providers who have concerns regarding a child from birth to 3 years of age should contact Sara Leggett, Director of Early Childhood Special Education at LESA (517) 540-5550 for additional information.

#### Kindergarten Through Grade 12

Parents, providers or medical providers who have concerns regarding a child in kindergarten through grade 12 should contact Sue Pearson, Director of Special Education, Hartland Consolidated Schools (810) 626-2102 for additional information.

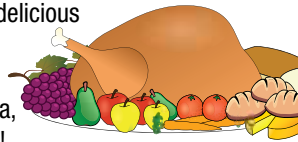

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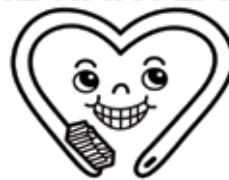

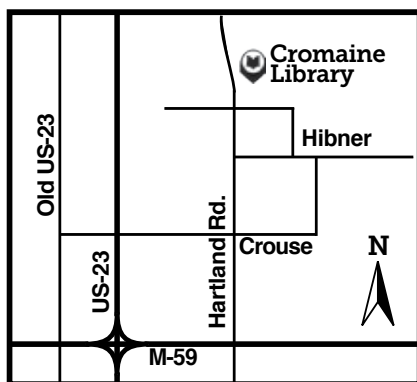

## Your WORDS Become Your THOUGHTS and your thoughts become your actions...

Here is a famous quote from Mahatma Gandhi:

*Your beliefs become your thoughts,  
Your thoughts become your words,  
Your words become your actions,  
Your actions become your habits,  
Your habits become your values,  
Your values become your destiny.*

Now Mahatma Gandhi was one pretty smart guy but you may have noticed that I changed the order of his words in his quote just a little bit. After years of developing kids and their parents I believe and have found **"Your WORDS become your thoughts!"**

I tell parents it may not seem like a big deal on the surface but the "words" your child uses are powerful and life changing. Those simple words over time compound to massively affect their thinking and attitude!

Here is what we teach our parents to do at Ohana Karate and you can use these same simple techniques with your child to shape their habits, attitudes and destiny.

**First**, just become acutely aware of what your child says and the words they choose to use. Just focus and notice a little more. You just might be amazed at what you hear. This will give you a very good indicator of how they think and what they think of. Do they say "Yes, I can" and talk positively about themselves and others? More importantly, how do they talk about themselves? Do they say things like "I am just not good at basketball" or "I am just not good at math?"

**Second**, while you are at it, just notice what you say and the words you choose. Most of the time we find a young child will mirror much of what their parents say. Have you ever met someone that is always upbeat and happy? Have you ever met someone that seems to have everything going wrong in their life all the time?

**Third**, once you are aware of the words you and your child use then just make a simple decision: "Are the words I choose and how we talk good?" or "Do we need to change the words we use and how we talk about ourselves and the world/people around us?"

For instance, do the words "I can't" come up often or does the focus tend to be more on why something can't be done? Or, is it more of a "I can do anything!" and "Okay, now how do we make it happen?"

Watch how they talk about school. Are they positive and looking forward to school? The words you simply cannot let a child say ever is "I hate school!"

Here is a big one. How much do you find yourself or your child criticizing, complaining or blaming? Blaming is a big one because you give up control. You give your success or failure to someone or something else. If your child says "Well, I just don't like my teacher!" or "I don't like my teammates!" later it just turns into "I hate my boss!" and "I don't like my co-workers!" They will start getting in the habit of saying "It was not my fault!"

**Fourth**, okay here is the good news. You have already done the hard part! You have **NOTICED** what words are being used, and you have **DECIDED** what words you want to use. If they are not the same you cannot help but **ACT!** Just realize the "small things matter" and choose every single word you and your child use!

At our dojo we do something many find odd at first. For instance every time we bow we say **"TRY MY BEST!"** They and their parents will say Try My Best hundreds of times. Also every student has to greet every parent in the dojo with a handshake and **"Hi my name is John and "I NEVER DO EASY!"** (which is the weekly training theme). This is all not by accident.

So just **NOTICE, DECIDE** and **ACT**

Remember, your words to become your thoughts.

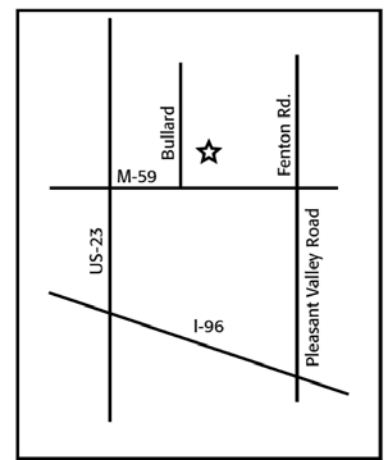

## College Action Plan: Check List

### Summer/Fall

- Narrow your list of colleges to between 5-10.
- Plan to visit as many of the colleges you plan to apply to if you haven't already.
- Create a master list or calendar that includes: SAT/ACT Test dates/deadlines (if retaking), College Application deadlines for schools you are planning to apply to (early and/or regular deadlines), and required financial aid application forms and their deadlines (aid applications may be due before college applications).
- Ask your counselor for a fee waiver if you think you may qualify for financial assistance.
- Take the SAT and/or ACT another time if you would like to try to improve your scores for admissions or scholarship consideration.
- Get a head start on completing as much required information as possible.
- Write your college application essay, if required, and have a teacher or other adult proofread it.
- Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at [www.fafsa.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa.ed.gov) to apply for financial aid – available beginning on October 1st. You will need your most recent tax returns.
- Complete the CSS/Financial Aid PROFILE. PROFILE is an online application used by certain colleges and scholarship programs to determine eligibility for their aid dollars.
- Ask one or two teachers for recommendations if you need them (also ask your counselor if using the Common Application or if you have special circumstances). Make sure to provide an outline or resume of your academic awards/accomplishments, extracurricular activities, etc.
- Complete and submit one or more college applications by Halloween.
- Create an account on [www.parchment.com](http://www.parchment.com) and request/send transcripts to colleges.

### Fall/Winter

- Keep track of the colleges you have applied to and the responses you receive.
- Send a copy of your 7th semester (1st semester of 12th grade) grades if the college is asking for it. Request to send your transcript through [www.parchment.com](http://www.parchment.com).
- Find out each college's actual cost. Use a Net Price Calculator (such as the one available on [www.bigfuture.collegeboard.org](http://www.bigfuture.collegeboard.org)'s website) to find out the potential for financial aid and the true out-of-pocket cost—or net price—for each college.
- Contact the Financial Aid Office or visit the Financial Aid Office website of the colleges in which you are applying to find out what type of aid is available, as well as the deadlines, for that particular college.
- Find and apply for scholarships. Make sure to check the HHS Scholarship Gazette that is updated monthly by the Counseling Department. It is emailed to students and parents, as well as posted on the HHS Counseling web page. Make sure to submit scholarships applications and/or essays by the deadlines.
- Find additional scholarships on scholarship websites. A suggested list is available on the HHS Counseling web page and on the Scholarship Gazette. Make sure to submit scholarships applications and/or essays by the deadlines.
- Sign up to take the AP Exam if you are enrolled in an AP course. Talk with your AP teacher if you have questions regarding whether or not you should take the exam.

### Winter/Spring

- If you are waitlisted, contact the admissions office to let them know you are still interested and ask how you can strengthen your application.
- Continue applying for scholarships. Review financial aid award offers to figure out which package works best for you. Pay attention to deadlines.
- Make a pros/cons list of the colleges you have been accepted to in order to choose the college that is the best fit for you.
- Visit your final college before accepting, if possible. You should receive acceptance letters and financial aid offers no later than mid-late April if you submitted your applications by the recommended deadlines.
- Inform each college of your acceptance or rejection of their offer and/or financial aid by May 1st.
- Notify your counselor of your final decision and send in your deposit to the college you have decided to attend.
- Apply for housing and submit the deposit if living on campus.
- Sign up for orientation to become an official student and find out the next steps.
- Register for classes. Send a copy of your final high school transcript to your college through [www.parchment.com](http://www.parchment.com).
- Contact the college if you have any questions!
