The August 4, 2020 Bond Proposal is right around the corner. I am hoping that you have this on your calendar to vote. During the past few months I have been asked many questions about this proposal. Some of the questions that you might like to know answers to are:

Q: How has the district demonstrated financially sound decision making?

A: One important way is by identifying opportunities to save taxpayers money. We do this by taking advantage of refinancing originally approved debt from past bond proposals. Since 2011, the district has saved the taxpayers approximately \$34,300,000 by refinancing previously approved debt. Other ways we demonstrate financially sound decision making is in how we settle fair and equitable contracts with our

employee groups. Employee salaries and benefits make up roughly 80% of our total operating budget each year. Since we are a service provider, it makes sense that this is where we would spend a larger portion of revenue coming into the district. Being thoughtful and deliberate in spending is viewed by our district as essential to operating a premier school of choice school system.

Q: Since the State of Michigan provides a per pupil revenue stream, why is the district asking the community to support a bond?

A: The school aid fund provides a base dollar amount for each student enrolled to cover operating costs. The state does not provide additional revenue for capital improvement programs such as large renovations, upgrades, and facility construction. Every school district has an obligation to garner community support for these types of projects through separate funding and Hartland is no different. It has been ten (10) years since the last bond request and it is time to address the needs described in the bond proposal.

Armed Forces Recruiting

Important Notice to Parents: Armed Forces Recruiter Access to Students and Student Recruiting Information

The "No Child Left Behind Act of 2001" passed certain new requirements with respect to Armed Forces Recruiter Access to Students and Student Recruiting Information:

- Duty to Provide Information to Military Recruiters. Unless the parent otherwise requests, the District must provide upon request by military recruiters access to high school student's names, addresses and telephone listings.
- Consent. Either the high school student or the parent of the student may request that
 the student's name, address and telephone listing not be released without prior parental
 consent. Schools are required to notify parents of this option to make a request and shall
 comply with the request. This is the required notification and the Opt-Out Form is below.
- Access to Students. Each district shall provide military recruiters the same access to high school students as is provided generally to higher education institutions, community colleges, and prospective employers.




Student: Shannon EhrlichParents: Lori and Daryl Ehrlich





Hartland High Class of 2020 Eagle Scout



Welcome Back from Hartland Transportation!

The 2020/2021 school year is quickly approaching, and we are looking forward to another great year! As always, we strive to make your child's bus ride a positive part of their educational experience. Here are a few important informational points for review:

- Your student must be waiting at the bus stop 5 minutes prior to the scheduled arrival
 of the bus. Once the alternating lights of the bus are deactivated, the bus driver cannot
 legally reactivate them and it is then the parent's responsibility to transport their student
 to school.
- Students and Parents should never try to catch the bus once the lights have been canceled. Please do not go to another bus stop without contacting the Transportation Office; the bus driver must be notified.
- If possible, your house number should be visible from the traveled roadway. Mailbox numbers are acceptable but should be large enough and clearly visible on both sides.
- The expected behavior of the student rider is found in the Parent-Student Handbook. We
 encourage parents to review these responsibilities with their children to ensure their
 privilege of riding is not lost. The handbook can be found by going to the district website
 at www.hartlandschools.us, then clicking on Parents & Students, and then Handbooks.
- Postcards will be mailed home a week before school starts with your student's bus information. The computerized postcard will only list one stop address but your student should wait on the same side of the road they reside on until the bus is in place with red lights activated and the bus driver crosses them.
- · Students should never cross the road prior to arrival of the bus.

From the Counseling Office

Hartland seniors are encouraged to use their time over the summer vacation to make sure they are ready for the college application season. Most colleges have their applications available online on August 1st. In order to apply for admission seniors must:

- Complete the online college application and follow all steps outlined by the specific application.
- Request that Hartland HS send your official transcript by creating a www.parchment.com account and completing an online transcript request. Students who are well organized and planning ahead can make transcript requests in August. However, seniors should note that the HS Counseling Office will not begin processing transcript requests until the second week of school.
- Submit all necessary payments. 3.
- Monitor your application through your account on the college website to make sure that all parts of your electronic application were received and downloaded in a timely manner.
- Let your counselor know when you are accepted.

Once you have completed all of the applications, seniors are able to move on to complete their financial aid applications (FAFSA) in October, which is much earlier than in past years. This earlier filing deadline will allow families to use their 2019 tax documents to apply for financial aid, rather than waiting until January for their 2020 tax documents.

Finally, seniors can begin the process of researching scholarship opportunities. There are numerous online search engines for scholarships that can be particularly helpful. In addition, the counseling office will email you with a monthly newsletter filled with scholarship opportunities. Seniors who have used their summer wisely and have completed their applications early in the fall are far less stressed and have more time to devote to searching for scholarship dollars!

Welcome to the Hartland High School 2020-2021 school year! We are very excited to see all of the students after a difficult ending to the 2020 school year. Below are essential dates/times to ensure a smooth start to the

Grades 10-12 Registration: Will be held at the high school on Thursday, August 6th. Students will get their school picture taken, pay for and pick up their parking hang tag (11th and 12th grade), receive their fall schedule, have the ability to talk to their counselor and receive their high school ID card on site. Times are as follows: 10th Grade, 8-10 AM; 12th Grade, 10 AM-12 PM and 11th Grade, 1-3 PM.

- Please be aware that ONLINE enrollment for all new and current Hartland Consolidated students is required this year in an effort to go paperless. Please ensure that your email address is updated in the Parent Portal, as detailed directions have been sent out to complete the process. The online enrollment will be completed through the Parent Portal.
- 11th and 12th graders who would like to park on campus must register for a parking spot online BEFORE registration! The link to register can be found on the high school website. The \$75 fee must be paid at registration to receive the hang-tag. You can also pay and pick up the hang-tag from the office any day after August 8th. Students must show a valid driver's license at the time of pick up.
- In order to get a student parking hang-tag, students cannot have any outstanding fines or fees. No exceptions. Please check your students Pay-For-It account for any outstanding fines and fees. Also, please check Parent Connect to make sure your student does not have a negative lunch account.

Hartland Consolidated Schools August 4th Bond Proposal.

Dear Hartland Community,

In the early stages of the coronavirus pandemic, the Michigan Secretary of State, the County Clerk, and Township Clerks asked school districts with May elections to postpone until August 4th. In the interest of public health and safety, the Hartland Consolidated Schools complied with this recommendation.

Hartland's bond proposal election is now scheduled for August 4th. Voters can cast their ballots at the polls or from the safety of their own home by absentee ballot from June 20th through Election Day.

What is on the ballot?

The August 4th bond proposal is the same as the proposal originally scheduled for this past May. Registered voters within the boundaries of the Hartland Consolidated Schools will vote on a \$45 million bond proposal designed to keep Hartland Consolidated Schools facilities and instructional spaces updated when students return to school by...

- renovating, upgrading, and constructing school facilities, including making safety and security improvements
- · upgrading technology and technology infrastructure
- · upgrading athletic facilities
- · replacing school buses as they reach the end of their useful life

Every project in the bond proposal was reviewed and approved by the Michigan Department of Treasury. And, all renovations and upgrades will comply with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA).

If approved by voters, the bond proposal will affect every Hartland student and every Hartland school facility.

What will the bond proposal cost?

The \$45 million bond proposal will require a 1.44 mill increase in the current tax rate. For a Hartland Township homeowner living in a home with a taxable value of \$117,500.00 (the taxable value is typically 50 percent of the market value), this increase would cost \$169.20 per year, or about 46¢ per day. The longer you have lived in your home, the more likely the taxable value is less than 50 percent of the market value.

While some Hartland Township homeowners may pay more, many Hartland Township homeowners may pay less than 46¢ per day. To calculate your annual cost, multiply the taxable value of your home (not the market value) by 0.00144.

How to vote

- Residents of the Hartland Consolidated Schools who will be 18 years of age or older on Election Day and are registered can vote in this election. Any registered voter can vote at the polls on August 4th or by absentee ballot from June 20th through Election Day.
- To vote by Absentee Ballot you can complete and return the "Absent Voter Ballot Application" mailed to you by Michigan's Secretary of State, your local township, or use the application available by going to www.michigan.gov/vote.
- When you have completed your application, return it to your city/township clerk. You
 can find your clerk's contact information at www.michigan.gov/vote.
- Note that if you check the "Future Elections" box in the application, you will automatically receive an absentee application for all future elections.

As we prepare for the safe re-opening of our schools, all of us can take pride in how we worked through the pandemic together and didn't give up on doing what is best for our students and our community.

- Remodeling and upgrading school buildings and educational facilities will
 enhance the learning environment and continue to protect the community's
 investment in its schools. The average Hartland school facility is 41 years
 old. Many of the bond proposal projects call for replacing items that have
 worn out or exceeded their life expectancy.
- If approved by voters, the bond proposal will support upgrading
 instructional technology and infrastructure, helping students acquire
 workforce skills and /or be prepared for post-secondary education. It
 will affect every Hartland student and every Hartland school.
- The bond proposal was designed to maintain and enhance the school district's reputation for educational excellence and to continue its commitment to the community it serves.
- The \$45 million bond proposal will be a 1.44 mill increase. To calculate your annual cost multiply the taxable value (typically 1/2 of market value) of your home by 0.00144. (Example: for the average Hartland Township home with a \$235,000 market value, divide \$235,000 by 2 = \$117,500 x 0.00144 = \$169.20/year...or about 46¢ per day). While some Hartland Township homeowners may pay more, many Hartland Township homeowners may pay less than 46¢ per day.
- By law, bond revenue cannot be used to pay salaries or benefits. All bond revenue must be used for the purposes specified in the bond proposal and must be independently audited. For a complete list of bond proposal projects, go to www.hartlandschools.us and click on 2020 School Bond Proposal.
- Registered voters can vote at their regular precinct on August 4th or by absentee ballot after June 20th.

Keeping our schools current and competitive.

On August 4th, residents will vote on a \$45 million bond proposal that is designed to keep Hartland **Consolidated Schools current and competitive by** completing projects in four general areas:

- 1. Renovating, upgrading, and constructing school facilities. Many of the bond proposal projects are related to renovating and upgrading aging school facilities. If the bond proposal is approved, the school district plans to reconfigure selected instructional areas to support 21st Century teaching by creating instructional collaboration spaces, creating elementary Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM) Labs, and construction of a robotics center at the
- Educational Support Service Center. In addition, the school district will implement safety and security improvements that include constructing a secure vestibule at Creekside Elementary and installing additional security cameras in all buildings. Bond revenue will also fund replacement of selected band instruments, exterior doors, roofs, and furniture, and upgrades to electrical and mechanical systems
- Upgrading technology and technology infrastructure. Technology is an integral part of teaching and learning. Voter approval of the bond proposal will enable the school district to keep technology and the technology infrastructure current.
- 3. Upgrading and building athletic facilities. Competitive athletics, physical education, and recreation are important components of the educational process. The school district plans to use bond revenue to upgrade and build new athletic fields and facilities at Hartland Middle School and Hartland High School.
- 4. Replacing buses as they reach the end of their **useful life.** The bond proposal will provide funds to replace 41 buses (as they reach the end of their useful life).

What Have We Learned?

The over three month long "Stay at Home" order was not easy on anyone, but it has really been an opportunity to think and learn. To maybe take a new or different perspective, attitude and mindset about ourselves and the world around us.

As a dojo, one of our missions is to teach lessons. Probably the most powerful lesson we teach here is how you live your life. While we use various vehicles to get these lessons across—such as hard repetitious karate classes to push students out of their comfort zone and to their limits physically and emotionally, SEL and character development lessons, and leadership training—in the end the greatest and most powerful lessons in life are learned...through life itself.

We have learned a great deal from the many families we support here at this dojo. It should not be a surprise we have families who are really struggling right now, through no fault of their own, and at the same time we have families who feel a little guilty because they are having the best time in their lives. Why the difference?

It really got me to thinking about a fundamental precept of karate, "Never give up!" in a totally new and different way. For me, this life experience of the COVID-19 crisis has fundamentally changed my mindset and attitude on this subject.

Before the shutdown my understanding of never give up was too simple—"Just keep going and do not quit." But, just telling yourself "don't give up" is too elementary and does not work when things get really hard. There has to be much more to it. On a deeper and higher application level what I now believe it really means is — <u>How do I change and how quickly can I change?</u>

I think this crisis can be a life lesson for all of us, and in particular our children. Here is one thing that is inevitable: you cannot control CHANGE. Change will happen whether we want it to or not. The only questions are: How big will the next change be, and when will it happen?

So, here is how we might be able to apply and use this lesson with our children. Just have a family discussion. Then use and share your powers of observation and awareness. What are the major changes in our lives? Did we change and how have we changed to handle it? How quickly did we change, and could we have changed quicker and how?

In your next discussion break out the crystal ball. Here you can talk about the future because one way to improve and speed up your "changing skills" is to anticipate, formulate multiple plans, pivot faster, then make adjustments. While we

all wish everything in our lives would just go back to the way it was before the pandemic, the likelihood of that happening is pretty slim. We will have a new "normal." So, what is your best guess of what things will be like when school starts in August? Or later for the start of 2021? What can you do now to stay ahead instead of just waiting and reacting? How can you take more control? I really like the word "pivot." Just like in sports, how quickly can you change direction when the next ball is thrown at you?

Our greatest lessons are often taught by life itself. What lessons have you learned during what may be the most transformative times in our lives? What lessons have your children learned? As parents, don't we all want our children to learn <u>resourcefulness</u>, <u>adaptability</u> and resilience? I cannot think of a better time for us to teach all three.

I love and use quotes all the time. I want to leave you with a quote I heard during this pandemic that is now near the top of favorite quotes list—"Leaders do not make excuses ... they make adjustments!"

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

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

Notification of Rights Under FERPA

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) affords parents and students over 18 years of age ("eligible students") certain rights with respect to the student's education records. They are:

- 1) The right to inspect and review the student's education records within 45 days of the day the District receives a request for access.
 - a. Parents or eligible students should submit to the school principal [or appropriate school official] a written request that identifies the record(s) they wish to inspect. The principal will make arrangements for access and notify the parent or eligible student of the time and place where the records may be inspected.
- 2) The right to request the amendment of the student's education records that the parent or eligible student believes are inaccurate or misleading.
 - a. Parents or eligible students may ask Hartland Consolidated School District to amend a record that they believe is inaccurate or misleading. They should write the school principal, clearly identify the part of the record they want changed, and specify why it is inaccurate or misleading.
 - b. If the District decides not to amend the record as requested by the parent or eligible student, the District will notify the parent or eligible student of the decision and advise them of their right to a hearing regarding the request for amendment.
 Additional information regarding the hearing procedures will be provided to the parent or eligible student when notified of the right to a hearing.
- 3) The right to consent to disclosures of personally identifiable information contained in the student's education records, except to the extent that FERPA authorizes disclosure without consent.
 - a. One exception which permits disclosure without consent is disclosure to school officials with legitimate educational interests. A school official is a person employed by the District as an administrator, supervisor, instructor, or support staff member (including health or medical staff and law enforcement unit personnel); a person serving on the School Board; a person or company with whom the District has contracted to perform a special task (such as an attorney, auditor, medical consultant, or therapist); or a parent or student serving on an official committee, such as a disciplinary or grievance committee, or assisting another school official in performing his or her tasks.

- b. A school official has a legitimate educational interest if the official needs to review an education record in order to fulfill his or her professional responsibility.
- c. Upon request, the District discloses education records without consent to officials of another school district in which a student seeks or intends to enroll. [NOTE: FERPA requires a school district to make a reasonable attempt to notify the student of the records request unless it states in its annual notification that it intends to forward records on request.]
- 4) The right to file a complaint with the U.S. Department of Education concerning alleged failures by the District to comply with the requirements of FERPA. The name and address of the Office that administers FERPA is: Family Policy Compliance Office; U.S. Department of Education; 600 Independence Avenue, SW; Washington, DC 20202-4605

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 provides that the following "directory information" may be released upon request: student's name, date of birth, phone number, address and/or email, parent name(s), school of attendance, school photographs or videos of students participating in school activities, events or programs, picture(s), video(s), publication of student picture(s), personally identifiable artwork, school activity group(s), participation in officially recognized activities and sports, height and weight if member of an athletic team, dates of attendance, date of graduation, awards received, honor rolls, scholarships, telephone numbers for inclusion in school of PTO directories.

In order to comply with this legislation, the district requests that parents, emancipated minors and those students 18 years of age and over, who do NOT wish release of this information, mail or personally submit an Opt-Out form to the building principal or Assistant Superintendent of Personnel and Student Services, Hartland Consolidated Schools, 9525 E Highland Road, Howell, MI 48843 by October 1st of the new school year. Opt-Out Forms are available in each school office and at Central Office upon request.

List of common uses for disclosing names, photographs and other "directory information:" School newsletter, teacher newsletter, PTO newsletter, school website, social media (Facebook, Twitter, and other mediums), video kiosk, bulletin boards, school yearbook, athletic programs, graduation program, playbill (drama production), student-of-the-month recognition, clubs and extra-curricular programs.

HCS ASBESTOS HAZARD EMERGENCY RESPONSE ACT (AHERA) 2020 NOTIFICATION

The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) requires that each year, district workers and building occupants receive notification about asbestos activities such as response actions and inspections. The purpose of this correspondence is to meet those requirements and familiarize you with the asbestos related activities that have been conducted in Hartland Consolidated Schools during the last year.

MANAGEMENT PLANS: In 1988, Hartland Consolidated Schools contracted with Trust Thermal Systems, to conduct inspections for asbestos containing material (ACM) within all district owned buildings. These Management Plans are available for review in

the administrative office of each building. An electronic copy of each building management plan is also located in the Maintenance and Operations office.

SURVEILLANCE ACTIVITIES: The AHERA regulation requires surveillance of the condition of ACM every six months and Reinspections every three years. The Three-Year Reinspection within each of our buildings was conducted in December of 2018. The next Reinspection will be conducted in November of 2021. The last periodic surveillance was conducted in May of 2019. All of these surveillance activities will be included as part of the building's Management Plans.

ASBESTOS ABATEMENT: During the past year there were minor abatement at various buildings in the district. All documentation regarding past and future asbestos abatement projects are available to be viewed electronically, for access please contact the designated person at the Maintenance and Operations Office. Air tests will be conducted throughout all phases of the future asbestos removal projects at each building. The air samples will be collected and analyzed in accordance with all regulatory agency requirements.

Advisory To All Parents Regarding Integrated Pest Management

Hartland Consolidated Schools has adopted an Integrated Pest Management program. Inherent with this are the District's efforts to reduce pesticide use as much as possible. While it may occasionally be necessary to apply a pesticide, these will only be used as a last resort. This program does not rely on routine pesticide applications to resolve problems. We use various techniques such as habitat alteration, sanitation, mechanical means, exclusion, etc. to prevent pest from becoming a problem. You will receive advanced notice of the application of a pesticide, other than bait or gel formulations at your child's school. This

advance notice of the application will be given 48 hours before the application. The law requires us to do this notification by using two methods. The first method required by the law is the posting at the primary entrances to your child's school. The entrances that will be posted are those entrances that have a sidewalk that leads directly to a parking lot. The second method we are going to use is the posting in a common area located by the main office of the school. Parents are also entitled to receive this notice by first-class United States mail postmarked at least 3 days before the application. If you would like to be notified by

mail or e-mail please contact the Operations Department at (810) 626-2185. Please give the office your name, mailing address and what school your child attends. In an emergency (for example, bees nest), pesticides may be applied without prior notice, but you will be provided notice following any such application. You may review our IPM program or pesticide application records for your child's school by calling or e-mailing Matt Marino the District's Director of Operations at (810) 626-2185 e-mail at mattmarino@hartlandschools.us. This number or e-mail may also be used when school is not in regular session.
