Welcome to the Holiday Season. We have almost made it through first semester. While we have worked hard to keep our schools open, it has not been without many ups and downs, which we all anticipated when embarking on this journey during an unprecedented pandemic. I want to thank each person who is reading this article for your effort at helping us.

What will second semester bring in 2021? This is a great question that has been asked of me on a regular basis. I cannot answer it. What I do know is that Hartland High School will have designated remote and face-to-face learners to help our high school teachers better balance the delivery of dual instructional models. I know that our teachers and support staff will work to ensure every child is learning. Every K-8 student must sit for the newly required (2020-21) legislative benchmark assessments for the second time this year, while also sitting for the M-STEP assessments. I know that somehow and somehow we will have our students ready to graduate or move forward.

What can the community do to support keeping our school doors open for face-to-face instruction? The answer is simple; what happens in the community happens in our schools. If we want to remain face-to-face, then working to disrupt the spread of the COVID virus is up to everyone. Wearing a face mask that covers both the mouth and the nose is essential. Wearing a mask and keeping your nose uncovered is like wearing no face mask. Please do not do this. Regularly washing your hands, and most importantly staying home when sick, can only help to limit transmission. Choosing to not host parties and large family gatherings will most certainly help decrease the transmission of this virus. While you may not agree with what I am asking, the fact is that without the community's help, face-to-face instruction may be difficult to support and could force a move to one-hundred percent remote learning in buildings and/or the district.

I'm a 7th grade English teacher at Hartland Middle School. I have been in education for 25 years, 15 years in Hartland and 10 years in Brighton. I attended Eastern Michigan University, received my bachelor's degree in Learning Disabilities and Psychology from Hope College, a master's degree in Educational Leadership from Wayne State University, and am a Reaching Higher Instructor.

I started in Hartland at Village Elementary School, as a special education teacher. I was lucky enough to get to work for Bill Cain, and to have the opportunity to be a teacher in the same district where my son would start kindergarten and later graduate high school. For the next thirteen years, my son Josh and I had the opportunity to "go to school together," and I loved every minute of it. It has been a blessing to be both a mom and a teacher in Hartland.

After five years at Village, I spent three years at Farms as an English and social studies teacher. While I loved my time at Farms and had a lot of fun learning how to be a general education teacher, I moved to Ore Creek because my heart is really with middle schoolers. Middle school is where I began my teaching career (25 years ago), and it's where I belong and want to stay. In my opinion, there's no better place

to be than right where I'm at, and I am extremely thankful.

I have also had the privilege to be a part of Hartland Community Education's Prelude Theater, a children's theater group started by Jason Eaton. As the choreographer for Prelude, I have enjoyed working with students across grade levels, and getting to watch these young "stars" grow and shine.

A memorable moment for me was when I was invited to go on a hot air balloon ride with one of our Reaching Higher mentors, Brian Prokuda. Although the anticipation of it and the initial "take off" terrified me, it ended up being one of the most peaceful and beautiful experiences that I have ever had. To have the perspective, even for just a short time, of being above all the things that worry us down here on the ground was incredible! It's a perspective I try to remember every day.

I am still here because I still love teaching. Of course, it has its challenges, everything does. But it also has its rewards, its funny stories, and its unforgettable moments. It never grows old. Every day there's a new reason to keep working hard, to try new things, and to, hopefully, make a difference in someone's life.

I love Hartland schools and feel so blessed to be here. Not only is it, in my opinion, the best district in which to teach, but I believe it is the best place for students to learn how to be members of a community, to work hard, and to care about one another.

Winter Bus Safety Tips

With the winter months upon us it is always good to review bus stop safety tips to ensure a safe and pleasant trip to school.

At the Bus Stop:

- Allow extra time in the morning to get to your bus on time.
- Wear bright clothing so the bus driver and other motorists can see you in the early morning and late evening.
- Stand a minimum of 10' away from the roadway at the bus stops. Buses and vehicles need extra room to stop when there is snow and ice.
- Dress properly. Winter clothing, hats, mittens and boots will help keep you warm.

Waiting at the Bus Stop:

- Don't play in the snow/ice, or throw snowballs while waiting for the bus.
- Don't push or shove while loading the bus, and always use the handrail.

Boarding and Exiting:

- Accompany your student whenever possible.
- The area at the bus stop may not be maintained for the weather. Icy conditions increase the risk of sliding into the street or getting hurt.

Running Late in the Morning:

- Never try to catch the bus at another stop with your vehicle if your students miss their pick-up. Take them all the way to school or call the Transportation office. Communication with the bus driver is critical in this situation. The bus driver may not see late students running to board while in the danger zone.

How can I help my student end the first semester successfully?

As we approach the end of first semester, some families are wondering how best to help their MS or HS students with wrapping up course requirements. Try any of the following listed below. All of the strategies can be implemented immediately and can help a strong student see more success or a struggling student, not only make progress in a course, but help future semesters with lifelong approaches to learning.

Teach multiple ways to prioritize your student’s goal.

- Find an organizational strategy that works best for your student’s needs and/or skills. For example, projects can be organized by due date, time needed to complete, or by how difficult the subject is for the student.
- There is always a tendency for someone to suggest the organization strategy that works best for that adult. Remember if the method is not showing success, or the student struggles with the suggestion, he or she could benefit from a different approach for designing.

Teach your child how to chunk their goal.

- Keep looming deadlines, or the feelings of being overwhelmed, from happening. For example, break up research papers, novels, semester projects, etc into more manageable chunks. The tasks become more reasonable when they are tackled in tinier pieces.
- Often teenagers just see “too many” or “too large” of assignments to even know where to begin. Feeling overwhelmed can lead students to stifled productivity. Sometimes asking if they know “where even to begin” or “how to make the task” smaller, parents can determine if their student struggles with how to chunk assignments.

Ask about the plan of attack for your student’s goal.

- Have a plan to end the semester with the grades/credit they want. For example, it seems logical that a teenager would know how and when to complete and submit school work, however this is not always the case.
- Ask for an explanation of his or her plan. Ask for weekly check-ins. Consider making a comparison between your check-ins and “real life” or career situations like a foreman, supervisor or project manager checking with their workers for efficiency and to ensure the job is completed on time.
