I received my Bachelor of Science degree from Michigan State University in Child Development. I received a Master's in Literacy from Marygrove College. Most recently, I completed Reading Recovery training and received my certificate of completion through Oakland University. In March of 2018, I attended a weekend workshop at The Teacher's College in New York and received training around small group intervention teaching.

I have so many wonderful memories from teaching here. At Lakes, I started a tradition that continues today, which makes my heart so happy. The Friday before Mother's Day, the children invite their mom or important person into the classroom for an afternoon of pampering at our Mother's Day Spa. Watching each child light up as they make their mom feel so special was the best. Another was when I dressed up as Rasheed the lion (the first grade phonics mascot) and walked through all the first-grade classrooms at both Village and Lakes. I was unrecognizable in a full lion costume and delivered an encouraging letter for their teacher to read aloud to the students.

In 2006, I was hired at Lakes Elementary as a first grade teacher. I remained there for six years before having my second child. I was very fortunate to be able to stay home with my now three children for five years. When it was time for me to go back to work, I knew there was no other place I would rather be than Hartland. I was offered a Reading Recovery/Reading Support position at Village and Lakes. This is my third year back in Hartland and I couldn't be more grateful to be working in this district.

I love getting to know my families on a deeper level as a Reading Recovery teacher. I love the special connection and relationship we build together. I know a lot of them feel like they are drowning this year, but I think they are shining. They are doing things we all thought were impossible, and they are doing it well.

My husband Jeff and I have three children. We currently live in Northville, but we are hoping to move to Hartland soon. My son Adam, age 9, loves hunting, fishing, basketball, golf and anything outdoors. My daughter Jenna, age 7, is all about gymnastics and friends. My youngest John, age 5, makes friends everywhere he goes. As a family, we love to take trips with our extended family and we enjoy outdoor activities, family movie nights and game nights. This year all three of my children are attending Lakes.

This year I am truly grateful to be in Hartland. I am so impressed by my colleagues and administration for making daily difficult decisions. As a parent, I am grateful for the flexibility and choice for my children to learn in school. This year's demands on teachers are like no other. I hope teachers look back on this year feeling as proud as I am to be working alongside of you. I am grateful for the entire district's staff, as well as the community for working together always, but especially during such a challenging year.

Snow Day Procedures

Step 1: Superintendent and Director of Operations pay attention to weather condition predictions for the following morning. If bad weather is not predicted, end process and sleep well. If bad weather is predicted go to Step 2.

Step 2: The Superintendent and Director of Operations arrange for bus and vehicle drivers to drive the roads around Hartland starting at about 3:30 AM to assess conditions. The Superintendent and Director of Operations start communicating with each other, surrounding district transportation directors and superintendents, possibly the County Road Commission, and local law enforcement to assess road conditions with safety in mind. There is an effort to decide by 5:30 AM if roads are deemed too poor to travel, go to Step 3. If roads are deemed okay to travel, go to Step 6.

Step 3: Superintendent makes the call to have a "Snow Day" and communicates with the Director of Community Education to determine if the Child Care Center should remain open for business. Go to Step 4.

Step 4: Once a snow day has been called and the question of child care operations has been agreed upon, the Superintendent will contact the administrative team to inform the local radio station (WHMI), Detroit area television stations, Twitter (join @Hartlandschools to get the fastest notice) Facebook, (@hartlandconsolidatedschools), the district website www.hartlandschools.us, send out phone calls and text messages to announce that the district has called a snow day. All district events are canceled and buildings are closed for the morning.

Step 5: Between 11 AM and 12 PM on the snow day, the Superintendent, Director of Operations, Athletic Director, Director of Community Education, and High School Principal determine what, if any, events will be open for the afternoon at the High School and Educational Support Service Center. All other buildings (not including the 51 Building) are shut down until the following morning without exception to give our employees an opportunity to clear sidewalks, driveways, and parking lots in preparation to reopen the following day.

Step 6: The Superintendent and other staff listen patiently to those who disagree with the decision to open or close schools.

Kindergarten Online Enrollment Begins on February 1, 2021
2021-2022

Children are eligible for Kindergarten enrollment in August of 2021 if they will have had their fifth birthday on or before September 1, 2021. A child who turns five after September 1, 2021 and before December 1, 2021 may enroll if parent/legal guardian signs a waiver that is supported by the school district. Early enrollment may ensure that your child attends their resident school.

In order to complete your enrollment, please upload the following items:

- Birth certificate:** copy for school records
- Immunization Records:** proof of DTP, Polio, MMR, Hepatitis B, Chicken Pox (or proof of illness) and vision screening; plus a copy for school records
- Proof of residency (one of the following):** certificate of occupancy, purchase agreement, builder's permit, rent receipt or agreement, mortgage statement/receipt, voter registration card, utility bill or driver's license

A full-day Junior Kindergarten program may be offered. A minimum number of students are required for the program to be made available. Parents may need to provide transportation in order to participate. The age requirement of Junior Kindergarten is the same as for the regular Kindergarten program.

What is Career Technical Education (CTE)?

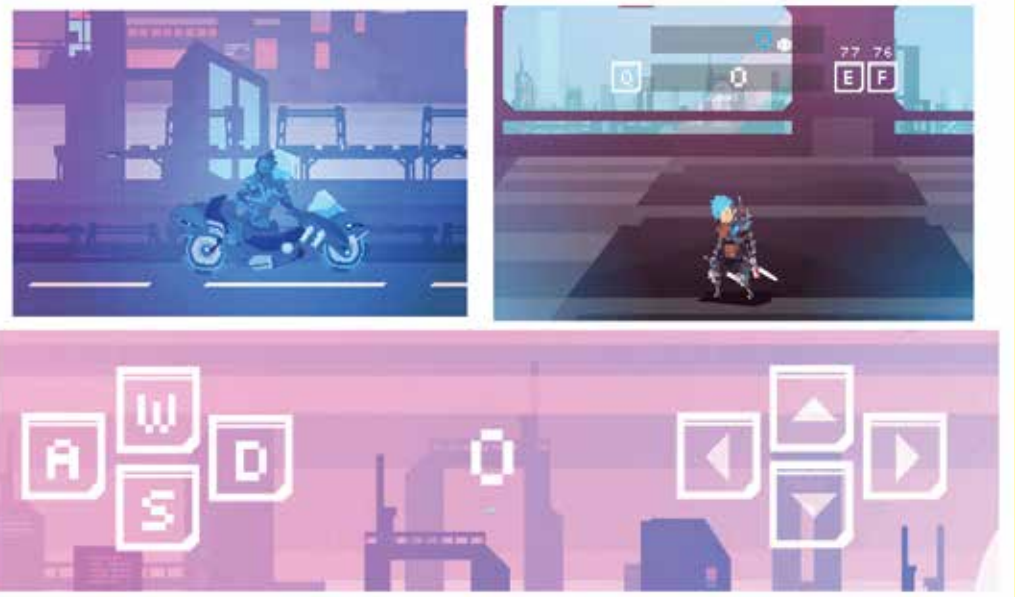
Career Technical Education (CTE) provides students with the academic and technical skills, knowledge and training necessary to succeed in future careers and to become lifelong learners. In total, about 12.5 million high school and college students are enrolled in Career Tech Ed classes across the nation. Hartland High School is fortunate to participate in a county-wide consortium that allows our students to access a wide variety of CTE programs. Livingston County CTE programs expose students to the high demand careers of tomorrow and offer our students the opportunity to access both collegiate and apprenticeship programs after high school.

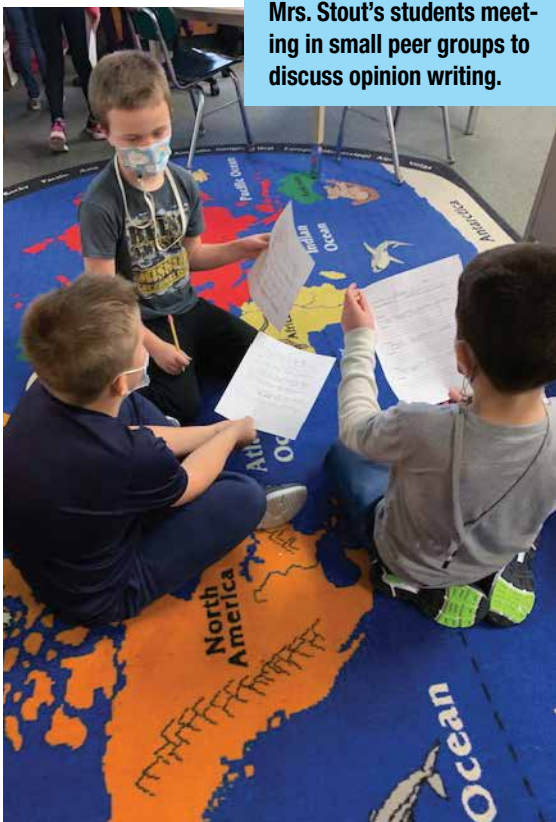

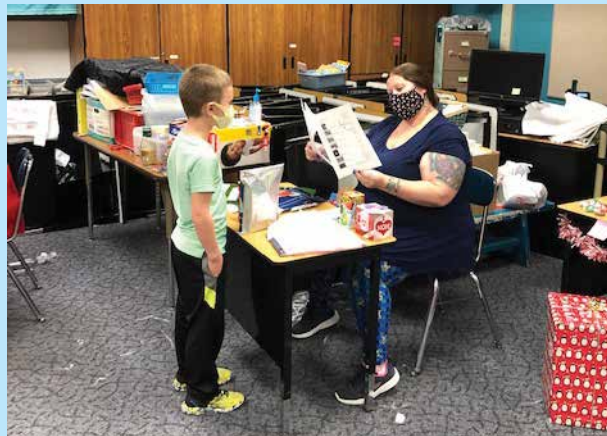

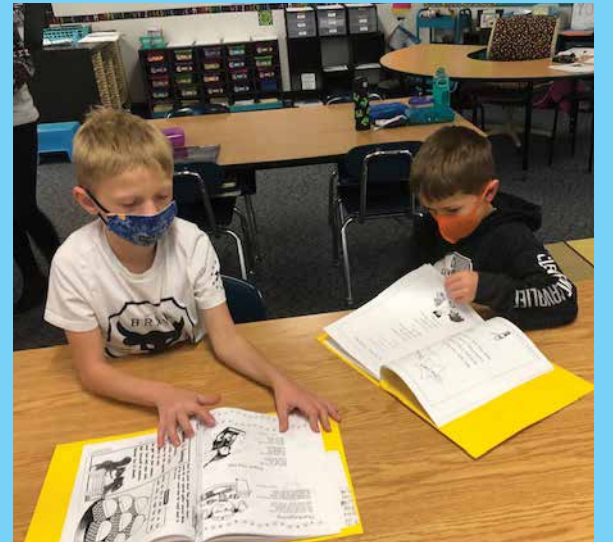

Winter brings a lot of exciting things to Round Elementary. It might be cold outside but the school is brimming with learning and excitement!

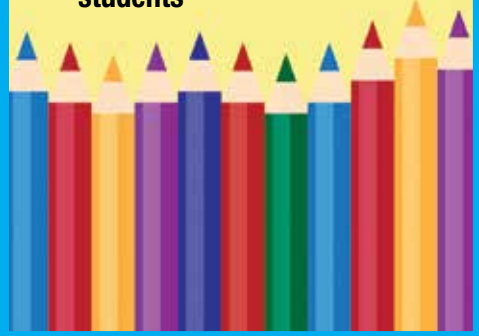

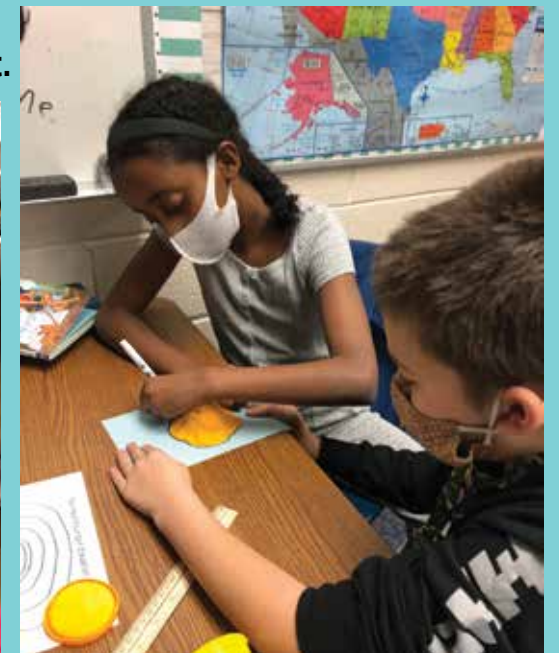

The ABC's and 123's of Face-to-Face or Online Learning: How can I help my student start the semester successfully?

Arrange and prioritize:

1. Find an organizational strategy that works best for your student's needs and/or skills.

Bit by bit:

2. Teach how to chunk. This can help keep looming deadlines or the feelings of being overwhelmed from happening.

1. You can't pay to put your name on a list to get the vaccine.
2. You can't pay to get early access to a vaccine.
3. Don't share your personal or financial information if someone calls, texts or e-mails you promising access to the vaccine for a fee.

Con artists may try to get your Medicare number or personal information to steal your identity and commit Medicare fraud. Medicare fraud results in higher care costs and taxes for everyone. Distribution of the vaccine for those over 65 if being done by county. At this time, the Livingston County Health Department will be responsible for setting up times and location. You need to register on-line for an appointment or contact them for any information.





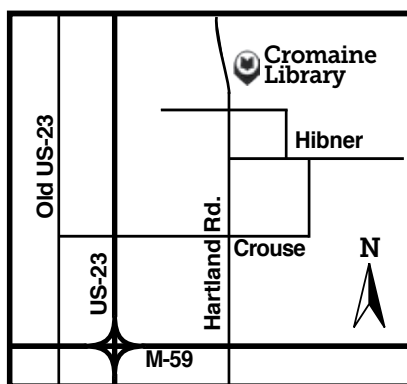

We Are Training You to Fail



I always like sharing real-life conversations and emails I have with our parents. What better way to share their common parenting struggles and questions. After a nice phone conversation with a parent wanting to develop her daughter's self-confidence, I followed up with this email:

Hi again Linda,

It was nice chatting with you about your daughter Alena. We had such a lengthy and involved conversation over the phone, I now realize I forgot to answer your question on

how we actually help children with their self-confidence, courage and assertiveness!

It is actually pretty simple and straight forward. Like I said, Alena sounds like a lot of the young children we work with today—cautious, timid and holding back. The challenge in raising a child today is their lives, in general, are too "success rich." If you look at school and most youth sports and activities, there is very little failure or struggle. You know, "everyone gets a trophy," everyone is a winner and the best.

"Kids need to skin their knees and eat dirt!" We as parents, think we are helping our children by clearing the path for them and making sure they excel and shine at everything. We think this is good for them and their self-esteem. While this may make us as parents, look and feel good, it is actually causing our children to become weaker emotionally. Have you ever seen a child totally crumble with the slightest mistake? Have you ever seen a child who has a total breakdown with the slightest setback or struggle? Or, a child who gives up when they do not get it perfect the first time?

Every time you fail or struggle, then power through it, you get stronger. Every time things are easy and come too fast, when you rarely have to struggle or work hard, you emotionally get weaker. You can see this when they emotionally give up, shut-down or even worse, have a meltdown.

Here, we may be unique in that we are able to intentionally create a "failure rich" environment. Like I tell our parents—*"we are not training your kids to be perfect...we are training them to fail."* Often this failure is harder on the parents than their kids!

As they progress to higher and higher levels, the failure we induce becomes even more frequent and intense, but here is the interesting reason why—we have to! We get tougher and harder on them because the kids become so strong. Failing does not phase them. They get right back up and instead it drives them. Instead of crushing them, it makes them even more determined. This passion is exhilarating to see. This is GRIT!

Failure is an interesting emotion. I get parents all the time who say, "I tell my child all the time it is okay to fail." But people cannot learn the skill of "not fearing failure" on an intellectual level because it is an "emotional" skill. You can tell them it is okay to fail, you can get them to understand how important it is to fail, you can show them examples, you can even model it yourself but they will never learn it in their head. It can really only be learned and developed when they consistently and repeated feel the crushing and devastating emotion of failure and then power through it.

We want Alena to struggle and fail here . . . where she is safe.

I hope this makes sense,

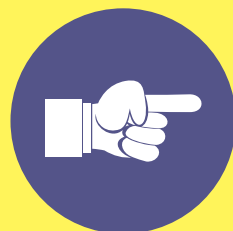

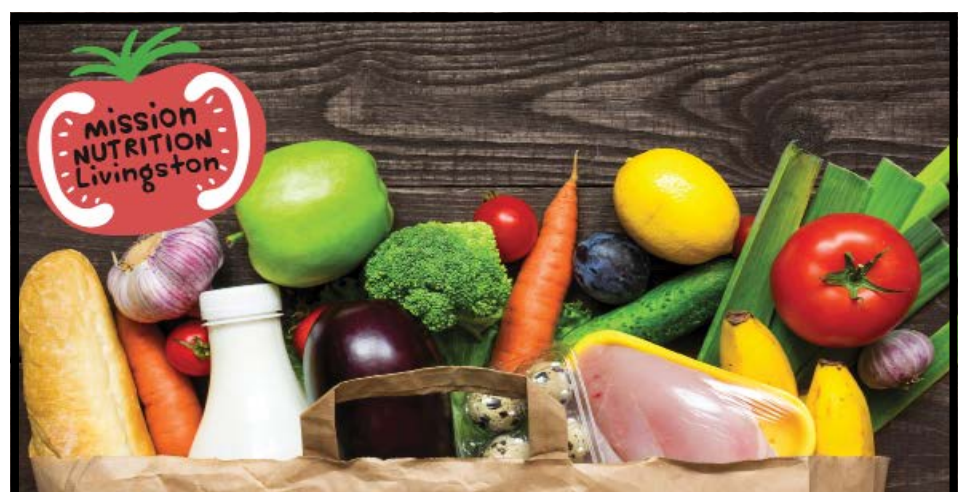
