Welcome to 2021! The district continues to do everything possible to ensure that students and staff are safe with face-to-face instruction. As you might be aware, the school year has seen challenge after challenge for every school and program. Our staff has been amazing in every facet of operations. The Livingston County Health Department continues to support face-to-face instruction as schools seem to be the safest places regarding transmission. Educational research on student growth and development points to the need for children to be in school. Unfortunately, for some programs, our priorities must be centered around the schools and child care services so that we can meet the needs of the parents in the community. This has meant that Community Education programming and the Senior Center operations have been greatly affected. We cannot wait for the opportunity to bring these programs back fully, when it is safe to do so. Thank you for your support and understanding as we ensure that our core programs can continue so that students are engaged in learning with support for their social emotional needs.

2020 Bond Update:

The district is working with our construction and architectural firms to prepare for Phase I of the bond program. This includes collaborating with our elementary and technology staff to prepare for creating Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) centers in each elementary while updating the technology infrastructure to handle future needs. We have worked out conceptual designs for the STEM centers and have begun budgeting for our future staffing needs for the fall of 2021 to run the STEM centers. We have created and presented bid packages. We are hopeful that bids come in better than our estimates, which would allow our bond dollars to go further. This is exciting work as the bond will certainly enhance the education of all Hartland students and users of HCS programming.

Fall Parent Survey Results:

Each fall the district surveys parents regarding their thoughts on how we are doing with providing educational opportunities for their oldest HCS child. While this has been an unusual year, with roughly 15-17% of students engaging in 100% remote learning, the results of our survey are positive. What are parents saying in this unusual school year?

The district is preparing my child for the next academic year: 72% Absolutely Agree/Agree, with 18% Neutral

I prefer to get most of my information through email: 90% Absolutely Agree/Agree, with 9% Neutral

Administration communicates well: 85% Absolutely Agree/Agree, with 10% neutral

The district provides a safe environment for my child: 88% Absolutely Agree/Agree, with 9% Neutral

Technology availability is expected for my student: 86% Absolutely Agree/Agree, with 12% Neutral

I grade the district school where my oldest attends: 52% A, 31% B, 10% C, 4% D and 1% E

Note: The remaining responses could have been Disagree or Absolutely Disagree.

The district will evaluate the results and work to meet the needs of our students and parents. Thank you for taking the time to participate in this annual survey.

January 2021 Person of the Month: Brad Laibly



I have been lucky enough to work in Hartland for 15 years. In addition to normal band duties, we were able to grow the after-school jazz program and color guard program. In 2010, I moved to Farms Intermediate School to teach our youngest band members. Here we saw the 5th and 6th grade band program grow to over 400 members. In 2014, I moved to Hartland High School. Learning on my culture change research, we focused on growing the membership of

the band by creating a positive, welcoming environment for all. Our focus is on caring for our band family and entertaining the public. In 2014, the band had 108 members and by June 2020, it had grown to 256. Even during the pandemic, the band continues to flourish with five concert bands, three jazz ensembles, color guard and winter guard.

My better half is Allison Laibly. She is currently the band director at Farms. Allison is a marvelous teacher and mom who is an inspiration to me and everyone else that she meets. We have two children in the district. Duncan is currently a student at the middle school, and Mara is a student at Farms. All four of us are involved with the bands in Hartland.

I think the most memorable moments are the marching band performances at the Magic Kingdom in Walt Disney World, and on the steps of the Lincoln Memorial in Washington, D.C. A close second is the band's performances at the women's basketball games during the spring of 2020. It is especially meaningful when we have a band member that chooses to pursue music education as a profession.

I remain in Hartland because of the amazing teams of people and the strong support of the community. The team of band directors in Hartland is second to none. Through the band family, I have had the opportunity to spend many years with some of the nicest, most supportive parents and volunteers that I have ever come across. Of course, none of this would be possible without our band members. They are the best humans that I have ever interacted with. Their determination and spirit of teamwork allow them to achieve heights that would otherwise be unobtainable.

The pandemic situation had forced all of us to approach things a little bit differently. Working through band camp and the marching season required asking many of the departments within the school district for things that the band typically doesn't ask for. We are incredibly thankful for the level of support that we received throughout the district while trying to do normal things under abnormal circumstances. We are especially grateful to those individuals that go out of their way to do what's best for our students.



2021/22 Kindergarten Orientation and Enrollment

Kindergarten enrollment packets will be available online the first week of February. A Kindergarten Orientation is scheduled for Saturday, February 13, 2021, from 10 to 11:30 AM at the Hartland Educational Support Service Center, 9525 E. Highland Road pending Covid-19 restrictions.



The orientation will provide parents an opportunity to hear from kindergarten teachers about a “typical” school day and the kindergarten curriculum. In addition, administrators will be on hand to talk about school safety, transportation, school attendance areas, student nutrition, and answer questions. This will be a family-oriented event and you are encouraged to bring your kindergarten child(ren). Orientation details may change based on Covid-19 restrictions.

Hartland Consolidated Schools will be accepting kindergarten enrollment packets beginning February 1, 2021 at the Board of Education office and each elementary school office during office hours. Enrollment packets can also be downloaded from our website at www.hartland-schools.us. In addition to the enrollment packet, the following documents must be presented when registering:

- Birth certificate- a copy for school records.
- Immunization records with proof of DTP, Polio, MMR, Hepatitis B, Chicken Pox vaccines (or proof of having illness), and vision screening, plus copy of same for school records.
- Proof of residency using one of the following: certificate of occupancy, purchase agreement, builder's permit, rent receipt or agreement, mortgage statement/receipt, voter registration card, utility bill or driver's license.

Children are eligible for enrollment in kindergarten in August 2021 if they will have their fifth (5th) birthday on or before September 1, 2021. A child who turns five after September 1st and before December 1, 2021 may enroll if parent/legal guardian signs a waiver that is supported by the school district. Waivers are in the enrollment packet.

A full-day Junior Kindergarten program may be offered. A minimum number of students are required for the program to be made available. Parent may need to provide transportation in order to participate. The age requirements for Junior Kindergarten are the same as for the regular Kindergarten program. Students worked in small groups using beakers of water, stopwatches, sun lamps and a hole punch. 



The BOGO Book Fair & Santa Shop




Did you know...



The Wiggle Worm room has children ages 1.5-2.5 years old. The early toddler stage is a time full of development and learning new experiences. I'M BORED!

Does this sound like your child?



Dear Fellow Parents,
I am Sam Larioza, father of two wonderful kids and the owner of Ohana Karate. I often get asked parenting questions by our many wonderful families. I want to share this actual email revealing two valuable skills all highly successful kids (and adults) share but few ever learn:

Dear Sensei,
Caden had a rough year in Kindergarten last year and I truly believe that a large part of his struggle was boredom. He had already done a year of preschool and a year of Begindergarten before doing Kindergarten and academically he was not challenged. Through the 3rd quarter this escalated into some very undesirable behaviors where he was basically checked out, flat out ignoring his teachers in specials class and often leaving his work unfinished, choosing instead to fiddle with the things in his tool box or simply stare out into space. Going into first grade the expectations are higher and I hope that he will rise to the challenge. I'm hoping that challenging him more in karate is the right way to get him started in the right direction.

Dear Nancy,
It is very interesting but your message and your challenge with Caden touches on one of the most valuable and important lessons in karate and in life. **"Delayed Gratification"** and **"Mastering the Mundane."** These two things are hugely significant in determining who is highly successful and who fails in life.

Many kids, especially highly intelligent ones, will seem to constantly be "bored," or feel what they are being taught or what the group is doing is too easy or boring. The truth is "mastery" takes repetition and hard work, and lots of it! For instance, a child will think they have learned their kata because they know the physical sequence and will think "This is dumb, I don't want to do this anymore. I want to learn the next kata" when in fact they just touched the surface. After a while the danger is that this becomes a "habit" more than a response to what they are learning.

The earlier a child learns "Delayed Gratification" and "Mastering the Mundane" the sooner they get on the track and habit of success. Kids who have these down are the kids that get straight "A's" in school. They are the ones that play and practice for all four years of high school football despite not being a starter and only playing occasionally when the score is a blowout. They are the kids that FINISH college.

So as you will see, there is a method to our madness. At the Little Dragon level we know that most kids that age cannot handle delayed gratification and mastering the mundane. So we disguise our lessons as "games" even though each one has a purpose and a lesson. At each higher level we gradually make the classes less "fun" and more repetitious and hard on purpose.

We want to teach the students that this stuff is difficult but good for you. So while I think that Caden is ready to move up I know the more valuable life lesson would be to stay in Little Dragons for a while longer to force him to confront his "I'm bored" habit. Let me know what you think?

Dear Sensei,
Thank you for your perspective. I never really thought of "Mastering the Mundane" as a skill before, but you're absolutely right. I have told him more times than I can count that we all have to do things we don't enjoy and we just have to find a way to work through it and do our best. I can definitely see a pattern of "I'm bored" attitude coming from him and it is absolutely something I'd like to squash before it gets out of hand. Thank you so much for all of your time and effort with this. I really appreciate all of your input. Having Caden as part of the Ohana Dojo has truly made a difference in both his behavior as well as many of my approaches with him. I respect and value your opinion very much and I thank you for all that you do!

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

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
