Welcome to October. It has been a long process to get to this point in the school year. District staff have been working extremely hard since March to figure out the best way to open school safely for our children so that they can have the best opportunity to learn and get back to normal. While I feel like a broken record, I cannot tell you how important it is that our community focuses on supporting these efforts. Remembering the importance of using cloth face masks that cover the nose and mouth is an essential practice toward keeping our buildings open. Maintaining social distance standards where possible and not hosting large gatherings with friends and family goes a long way towards limiting the possible transmission of COVID.

I want to thank our teaching staff especially. Currently, we have 83% of our families attending school while 17% are engaged in remote learning. Our teachers are working diligently to create opportunity for student learning in both modes. This is not easy and extremely taxing. I appreciate how patient our students and parents have been with this demanding process. While every child will be presented with learning experiences based on the State of Michigan education standards, it looks very different depending on which option for learning has been chosen. I am asking our teachers to do the best that they can every day. The fact is that our Phase 4 Return to School Plan was designed around the ability to offer students an opportunity to make a choice that can be changed when needed, with little to no loss in the process of learning. This is very different than pulling teachers out of the school to teach virtual classrooms and requiring a full-year commitment by parents or resorting to an all-district virtual learning experience. It would be very difficult to support participation in athletics, band, robotics, etc. if we were all remote, considering that if we were all remote it would be based on the idea that it is unsafe to have groups of children working together.

Someday, we will all look back and remember 2020 as a year of difficulty. Thank you for sticking with us.

I have taught social studies at Hartland High School since 2010. I have been told it is still on YouTube, which is a sign of the times that we teach in. If you were a part of that talent show, then you know that kids love it when we step out of the box for them.

As I was breaking into the teaching game, I always thought I would settle into teaching in Fowlerville. I had developed great relationships there, but when there was an opening in Hartland, I jumped at it. I had

not spent much time in Hartland and did not know much about the district. I quickly realized that I had been given a great opportunity to work in this Premier School District. Eleven years later and I am still teaching in Hartland and loving it. The high school is full of great educators and I love coming to work each day to work with them. I try to be part of Hartland culture as much as I possibly can and see myself finishing my career here. My favorite piece of Hartland culture that I was able to experience was with the Spanish trip to Costa Rica in 2019. - Stop at least 20 feet away for buses when red lights are flashing, unless driving in the opposite direction on a divided highway.
- · Slow down in or near school and residential areas.
- Watch for children between parked cars and other objects.

- · When overhead lights are flashing red: Stop.
- · When hazard warning lights are flashing: Proceed with caution.



College Action Plan: Check List

Summer/Fall

- Narrow your list of colleges to between 5-10. Plan to visit as many of the colleges you plan to apply to if you haven't already.
- Create a master list or calendar that includes: SAT/ACT Test dates/deadlines, application deadlines for schools you are planning to apply to, and required financial aid application forms and their deadlines (aid applications may be due before college applications).
- Ask your counselor for a fee waiver if you think you may qualify for financial assistance.
- Take the SAT and/or ACT another time if you would like to try to improve your scores for admissions or scholarship consideration.
- Get a head start on completing as much required information as possible and write your college application essay and have a teacher or other adult proofread it.
- Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at www.fafsa.ed.gov to apply for financial aid – available beginning on October 1st. You will need your most recent tax returns.
- Complete the CSS/Financial Aid PROFILE. PROFILE is an online application used by certain colleges and scholarship programs to determine eligibility for their aid dollars.
- Ask one or two teachers for recommendations if you need them (also ask your counselor if using the Common Application or if you have special circumstances).
 Make sure to provide an outline or resume of your academic awards/accomplishments, extracurricular activities, etc.
- Complete and submit one or more college applications by Halloween.
- Create an account on www.parchment.com and request/send transcripts.

Fall/Winter

- · Keep track of the colleges you have applied to and the responses you receive.
- Send a copy of your 7th semester (1st semester of 12th grade) grades if the college is asking for it. Request to send your transcript through www.parchment.com.
- Find out each college's actual cost. Use a Net Price Calculator (such as the one available on www.bigfutre.collegeboard.org's website) to find out the potential for financial aid and the true out-of-pocket cost—or net price—for each college.
- Contact the Financial Aid Office or visit the Financial Aid Office website of the colleges in which you are applying to find out what type of aid is available and deadlines, for that particular college.
- Find and apply for scholarships. Make sure to check the HHS Scholarship Gazette
 that is updated monthly by the Counseling Department. Make sure to submit scholarships applications and/or essays by the deadlines.
- Find additional scholarships on scholarship websites. A suggested list is available
 on the HHS Counseling web page and on the Scholarship Gazette. Make sure to
 submit scholarships applications and/or essays by the deadlines.
- Sign up to take the AP exam if you are enrolled in an AP course. Talk with your AP teacher if you have questions regarding whether or not you should take the exam.

Winter/Spring

- If you are wait listed, contact the admissions office to let them know you are still interested and ask how you can strengthen your application.
- Continue applying for scholarships. Review financial aid award offers to figure out which package works best for you. Pay attention to deadlines.
- Make a pros/cons list of the colleges you have been accepted to in order to choose the college that is the best fit for you.
- Visit your final college before accepting, if possible. You should receive acceptance letters and financial aid offers no later than mid-late April if you submitted your applications by the recommended deadlines.
- Inform each college of your acceptance or rejection of their offer and/or financial aid by May 1st.
- Notify your counselor of your final decision and send in your deposit to the college you have decided to attend.
- Apply for housing and submit the deposit if living on campus.
- Sign up for orientation to become an official student and find out the next steps.
- Register for classes. Send a copy of your final high school transcript to your college through www.parchment.com.
- Contact the college if you have any questions!







Our music teacher, Ms Hagar, is working her magic with the second graders.








Fire Department Millage Request

When Hartland Township voters go to the polls on November 3rd, they will be asked to vote on a millage to continue funding the Fire Department. The current millage is expiring, and this will replace it. The current millage has been in place for over 10 years and, through good stewardship, has weathered the trials of two economic slow-downs and a substantial recession.

That said, our community has continued to grow. With increased numbers of emergencies and calls for service, along with increased costs due to the price of equipment and

supplies rising, a small increase of .25 (from 1.81 to 2.06) is being requested, which is an additional \$31.25 per year (\$2.60 per month) for Hartland's median home value of \$250,000 for the next 5 years, and covers funding for all of the department's operations and expenses.

We are very grateful for the community support of our fire department and look forward to continuing to provide the best level of service we can to all of our residents in their time of need. 

SO HOW DOES THIS "KARATE" THING WORK? (Most parents are blown away by what we really do!)

I recently received this email question from a parent:

"My son is in third grade and struggling in school. I just cannot get him motivated. I know he can be an "A" student if he would only apply himself. Can you tell me how karate will help? I do not want him to get mean or aggressive with his little sister."

Here is my response:

"First, an easy answer to the last part of your question is that karate will not make him meaner. Quite the opposite, parents find that their child actually becomes kinder and nicer."

But now to your real question - How does this stuff work?

Karate has very little to do with punching and kicking. My joke with parents is "Don't tell your child but we don't really teach karate here!" Actually we do teach great martial arts, fitness and self defense but what our families really love is that we help them develop the habits, attitudes and character traits that produce highly successful children.

Okay, you are probably saying that this "sounds" good but how do you do it?
