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## Superintendent's Corner

## I want to thank the community for approving the bond issue presented on August 4, 2020. The process to develop a plan and present it to you has taken 2.5 years. Your commitment to ensuring that our students, community, and staff have the educational environments necessary to promote success is greatly appreciated.

#### **Back-to-School Plan:**

As the Superintendent, it was my responsibility to recommend to our dedicated Board of Education thoughtful and deliberate plans that met the expectations of the Governor's MI Safe Schools Roadmap. As I write this article, data available for Livingston County shows a downward trend in the percentage of COVID positive tests regarding all individuals tested. This data point will be monitored daily as we work to eventually bring school back to what we are used to, five days a week of direct instruction. Will there be concerns that arise? Most assuredly. Will we work to mitigate issues such as positive results in students and staff? Absolutely! We may also have to take a step back to move forward. As a key strategy to moving forward with the plan, wearing a cloth face mask that covers the mouth and nose will not be debatable unless there is a clear medical reason in which wearing a face mask would cause harm to the wearer. Students refusing to wear a face mask will not have the privilege of attending school face-to-face. This is a public health issue that simply has no room for individuals to opt-out of this expectation.

As a Superintendent, father, husband, and human being, I care deeply about our staff and students and will continue to do everything in my power to make the educational experience positive for everyone. Someday, we will look back and realize that we overcame a major challenge.

#### **No Parking:**

I want to remind everyone that we need help with parking patterns. If you find a No Parking Fire Lane sign in district driveways and parking lots, please do not park in these areas. These areas must be clear in case we have a fire in one of our buildings or if someone gets hurt and the emergency responders need access. The high school sports complex and the Lakes Elementary/Farms Intermediate circle drive are good examples of fire lanes that must be accessible, day and night. The district appreciates the public's cooperation in not parking where fire lanes exist, including the striped off areas in some of our parking lots. Unfortunately, tickets may be issued if the choice is made to ignore signage.

## Welcome Back from Hartland Transportation!

The 2020/2021 school year is underway, and we are looking forward to another great year! As always, we strive to make your child's bus ride a positive part of their educational experience. Here are a few important informational points for review:

- Your student must be waiting at the bus stop 5 minutes prior to the scheduled arrival of the bus. Once the alternating lights of the bus are deactivated, the bus driver cannot legally reactivate them and it is then the parent's responsibility to transport their student to school.
- Students and parents should never try to catch the bus once the lights have been canceled. Please do not go to another bus stop without contacting the Transportation Office; the bus driver must be notified.
- If possible, your house number should be visible from the traveled roadway. Mailbox numbers are acceptable but should be large enough and clearly visible on both sides.
- The expected behavior of the student rider is found in the Parent-Student Handbook. We encourage parents to review these responsibilities with their children to ensure their privilege of riding is not lost. The handbook can be found by going to the district website at www.hartlandschools.us, then clicking on Parents & Students, and then Handbooks.
- Postcards were mailed home with your student's bus information. The computerized postcard only lists one stop address but your student should wait on the same side of the road they reside on until the bus is in place with red lights activated and the bus driver crosses them.
- Students should never cross the road prior to arrival of the bus.

#### What is Block Scheduling? And why is LEGACY moving to a block schedule?

• Block scheduling means students have fewer classes per day but each class is scheduled for a longer period of time than normal (90 minutes versus 50).

#### What is A/B block scheduling?

• Students take three courses on the "A" day (also known as "even" or "Day 1") and alternate with another set of three courses the "B" day (also known as "odd" or "Day 2").

 Paired with the Tuesday blended day, LEGACY students will have the opportunity to complete one additional course beyond last year's ability. Students spend every class period engaged in curriculum, activities, collaboration and online is saved for home. • With more time in each period, teachers can still cover the content fully and have time for activities that may not have fit into smaller time frames.

- One 45 minute standard course, remains the same both days. This course is dedicated to our career and college preparation and produced items like Educational Development Plans (EDPs), Interview Day with business professionals, social emotional skill building and much more.
- Some in the educational community argue that by narrowing the amount of new topics introduced in one day, students are able to focus and retain more. And less movement and switches equals more safety for all.



#### News You Can Use From Medicare


Due to changes in Federal law and policy, as of January 1, 2020, Medicare Advantage plans can now offer a new type of supplemental benefit, called Special Supplemental Benefits for the Chronically ill. This type of plan can only be offered to those who meet the definition of being "chronically ill." Not everyone is eligible nor is every Medicare Advantage Plan eligible to offer this plan. There is a two-part test for plans to determine whether anyone is eligible for SSBCI.

- 1. The enrollee meets the definition of having a "chronic illness" as determined by Medicare rules.
- Such benefits must also have a reasonable expectation of improving or maintaining the health or overall function of the enrollee as it relates to the chronic condition or illness.

**Do you qualify?** You won't know until you are actually enrolled in the plan. Find out what the actual costs of the benefits will be and are there shortcomings in the rest of the plan such as loss of other benefits such as vision, hearing or dental. What is the cost-sharing amount you have to pay and what limitations are there, such as number of visits and availability. MOW, personal care and transportation can be arranged through other sources, like the Hartland Senior Activity Center.



## How do I MOTIVATE my child for school (especially at home)?



This is crazy isn't it? So much unknown. So much doing things for the very first time. We are clearly in uncharted territory with this COVID-19 pandemic and "new" school year. We are also in a fluid situation that seems to change daily. I wanted to share what we have learned over the years working with hundreds of area parents and their children that might help.

We may be in luck because we have heard this question from parents many times before: "Sensei, how do I motivate my child to . . .?" You fill in the blank. It could be – do their homework, do karate, get better grades in school, take basketball seriously, or work harder. I could not help but become obsessed with uncovering the answer and the solution for our parents.

First of all, one of our findings might surprise you – **willpower, discipline and motivation** <u>do not work!</u> (You will end up trying to motivate your child for a long time.)

What I mean is motivation does not work in the long run. You need it to get started but it will rarely sustain you, or your child very long. Think of motivation and willpower like your cellphone battery or your car's gas tank. You have different levels at all times depending on a number of factors like time of day, your stress/fear level, what you ate, or how much sleep you got. For instance, have you ever known someone who was serious about losing weight or starting to workout? Think about it, what percentage kept the weight off permanently or workout religiously to this day. The success rate is very low.

So, if it's not willpower, discipline or motivation, what is it? Why are the successful and high achieving able to do it? Drawing from the work of folks like Simon Sinek, James Clear, Gary Keller and others here is what works – <u>HABITS.</u>

Success leaves clues. When you look at and study high achievers, you may think they have more discipline or drive than you and I. But when you look deeper, they really do not. They just have better and more disciplined habits. Our primary mission at this dojo (karate school) is helping parents develop these habits in their children. "They just need more practice."

Okay, so how do I develop these habits in my child? There is a science to developing good habits.

Step 1: Become aware of, then choose your energy/ emotional <u>STATE.</u>

Step 2: Be intentional on what you FOCUS your mind on.

 $\label{eq:step 3: Have the right \underline{STRATEGY} (action plan).$ 

a. First, set them up for success.

- i. <u>Make it Obvious</u>–People do not lack motivation, they lack clarity. Be crystal clear and decisive.
- ii. <u>Make it Attractive</u>–Routine/Culture/ Environment they like.
- iii. <u>Make it Easy</u>–We are lazy by nature. Focus on the starting line, chunk it down.

- iv. <u>Make it Satisfying</u> The key? We are attracted to things that give us pleasure or satisfaction. Not a reward but use linking.
- b. Then shut up and do the reps <u>REPETITION</u>. You never stop working on your habits.
- Step 4: In the end, your habits become your <u>IDENTITY.</u> (I am a runner. I am a life-long learner. I am a reader/ writer. I am an athlete. I am a straight "A" student.)
