# Superintendent's Message Chuck Hughes, Superintendent

Welcome to the beginning of a new year. This is an exciting time for me as I have the honor and privilege of becoming the Superintendent of Hartland Consolidated Schools. I wish to thank the Board of Education for their confidence in me and for continuing to support the hard work being done to establish the district as a "premier school of choice." It is especially important to me to share that my 17 years in Hartland would not have been successful without the mentorship of Superintendent Jan Sifferman. Jan has dedicated 41 years to Hartland Schools, 12 years as Superintendent. She has always displayed the ability to make decisions that were in the best interest of students and for the stability of the school district.



While I cannot easily replace Jan, I know that I have been fortunate to watch and learn from her amazing leadership. It is my hope that I will carry on her legacy of keeping the "heart" in Hartland.

As we begin this new journey together, I will be focusing my monthly messages to you on sharing the wonderful things occurring in the district and providing information on our greatest needs. One of the first goals is to move forward with the May 2, 2017 millage proposal for a Building and Site Sinking Fund Tax Levy, which was supported by a Board of Education resolution on November 21, 2016. The sinking fund is designed to be a pay-as-you-go, interest-free tax collection to provide districts with money to repair buildings and sites, increase security, purchase technology, and purchase land for future building sites if needed. While many states provide some type of building and site fund for school districts to tap into, Michigan does not. The Board of Education has agreed to put this millage proposal before the voters with a plan to repurpose a portion of the current debt levy so that it will not be a tax increase if passed. A "Yes" vote on May 2, 2017 will result in the decrease of our current debt retirement tax levy from 8.55 mills to 8.05 mills. The sinking fund would then collect .5 mills for the building and site fund. What this means is a zero net increase in what home owners currently pay while keeping the same overall tax levy of 8.55 mills.


Why a sinking fund? For a number of years, funding support from the state has either declined or has had only minor increases. Our primary function is to provide for instructional programs, thus our ability to deal with non-instructional issues (ex. repairs) has been limited. The district finds itself in a situation where our newest building is 13 years old and repairs are necessary on buildings throughout the district. We also have the need to continually invest in technology. One means available to supplement the general fund dollars so that we can invest in repairing roofs, driveways, doors, boilers, air conditioning units, flooring, as well as purchasing current technology, etc. is a sinking fund tax levy. Again, this will not cost our homeowners any additional dollars if passed in May.

#### 2016-2017 PARENT, TEACHER, EMPLOYEE NOTIFICATION OF THE AVAILABILITY OF THE MANAGEMENT PLAN FOR ASBESTOS

According to AHERA 763.93 (g) (4) "..at least once each school year, the LEA shall notify in writing, parent, teacher, and employee organizations of the availability of the management plans and shall include in the management plan a description of the steps taken to notify such organizations, and a dated copy of the notification. In the absence of any such organization... the LEA shall give written notice..."

The procedure and plan that the LEA has adopted for the notification listed above is as follows:

- •In writing, notify the presidents of each of the three above organizations of the availability of the asbestos management
- •In the event that there is no organization representing any of the above three groups, individual letters will be sent out, or notice will be given in a newsletter of the availability of the management
- •The Designated Person will be responsible to update the management plan as needed, and annually by March 30th of each school year.
- •The Designated Person will be responsible to ensure that a copy of the following or similar notification will be sent to the above organizations and/or individuals by April 30th of each school year and copies of the notices are filed in the management plan.







We offer care for children who attend the Round, Village and Creekside, Lakes Elementary and Farms Intermediate School. The children who attend the **Lakes or Farms** Schools may enroll at the School Street center, or take advantage of the school-age program at the Lakes Elementary School.



Both center locations are open 6:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.

Both programs offer gym activities, arts and crafts, and outside play. When you are signed up for the Before and After School Care, you also have the option of attending on the "No School" days or Snow days! Our center is almost always open!

#### **Before & After School Child Care Only**

Full Time enrollment (5 days a week) is \$8.50 a session

Part Time enrollment (2-4 days a week) is \$10.50 a session

The minimum enrollment is 2 sessions a week for a charge of \$21 for the week. Example- A student needs to attend 5 – AM sessions and 1 –P.M. session. The charge would be \$42.50 for the A.M. and \$10.50 for the P.M. session, for a total charge for the week of \$53.





You must notify the office if your child/children will be absent from the Before & After school program. Your regular weekly tuition will be charged unless the Center is Closed. If your Before & After School child attends on a No School Day, Snow Day, etc., your tuition for the day will be \$33.
