Winter certainly has taken its time for the most part, to get here this year, but we all know that it's here now! The district is in full swing planning for the 2016/17 school year. Scheduling for Hartland High School students begins this month and you may contact Hartland Middle School (for incoming freshman) or Hartland High School if you have specific questions regarding this process.



We are piloting a new program for kindergarten registra-

tion for the 2016/17 school year. We are replacing our traditional "Kindergarten Round-up" two-evening sessions with "open enrollment" beginning February 1st. Kindergarten registration packets can be picked up at any of the four elementary buildings, Farms Intermediate School, the childcare "51 Building" in the village, or at the administration office, 9525 Highland Road. They can also be downloaded from our web site: www.hartlandschools.us. The packets can then be returned to any of the elementaries or the administration office and they will process your enrollment right there. A Kindergarten Orientation will be held on Saturday, March 12, from 10:00 am to 11:30 am at the Hartland Education Support Service Center, 9525 Highland Road. The orientation will provide parents an opportunity to hear from kindergarten teachers about the "typical" school day and the kindergarten curriculum. In addition, administrators will be on hand to talk about school safety, transportation, school attendance areas, student nutrition, and answer questions.

This will be a family-oriented event and you are encouraged to bring your kindergarten child.

CARBON MONOXIDE ALARMS



Carbon Monoxide Alarms

This is the time of year to ensure that you are protecting your family from the silent killer...Carbon Monoxide.

Carbon monoxide is a colorless, tasteless, odorless gas. It is a by product of combustion from Gas fired appliances. It is slightly lighter than air, and if not detected, can be deadly. On average, about 170 people in the United States die every year from CO produced by non-automotive consumer products.

Because CO is undetectable to the human senses, people may not know that they are being exposed. The initial symptoms of low to moderate CO poisoning are similar to the flu (but without the fever). They include: Headache, fatigue, shortness of breath, nausea, and dizziness.



To protect your family, install a CO alarm that meets the requirements of the current UL 2034 safety standard. A CO alarm can provide some added protection, but it is no substitute for proper use and upkeep of appliances that can produce CO. Install a CO alarm in the hallway near every separate sleeping area of the home. Make sure the alarm cannot be covered up by furniture or draperies.

KINDERGARTEN ENROLLMENT 2016-17

Kindergarten Enrollment Packets will be Available Beginning February 1, 2016



KINDERGARTEN ORIENTATION

A Kindergarten Orientation will be held on **Saturday, March 12 from 10:00 am to 11:30 am** at the Hartland Education Support Service Center, 9525 Highland Road.

The orientation will provide parents an opportunity to hear from kindergarten teachers about a "typical" school day and the kindergarten curriculum. In addition, administrators will be on hand to talk about school safety, transportation, school attendance areas, student nutrition, and answer questions. This will be a family-oriented event and you are encouraged to bring your kindergarten child.

Hartland Consolidated Schools will be accepting kindergarten enrollment packets beginning **February 1, 2016** at the Board of Education office and each elementary school office during office hours. Enrollment packets can also be downloaded from our website at www.hartlandschools.us

In addition to the enrollment packet, the following documents must be presented when registering:

• Original birth certificate with seal, plus a copy of same certificate for school records

• Immunization records with proof of DTP, Polio, MMR, Hepatitis B, Chicken Pox vaccines (or proof of having illness), and vision screening, plus copy of same for school records

• Proof of residency using one of the following: certificate of occupancy, purchase agreement, builder's permit, rent receipt or agreement, mortgage statement/payment receipt, voter registration card, utility bill, driver's license.

Children are eligible for enrollment in kindergarten in September 2016 if they will have their fifth (5th) birthday on or before September 1, 2016. A child who turns 5 after September 1 and before December 1, 2016 may enroll if parent/legal guardian signs a waiver and is supported by the school district.

A full-day Junior Kindergarten program may be offered on a limited basis. A minimum number of students are required for the program to be made available. Parents may need to provide transportation in order to participate. You may contact Scott VanEpps at 810-626-2111 or scottvanepps@hartlandschools.us for more information.

School Bus Safety

School buses are the safest mode of transportation for getting children back and forth to school. Riding in a school bus is safer than walking, riding a bicycle, or being driven to school in private vehicles.

Today's school buses are built with safety in mind. According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, children are protected in large school buses by compartmentalization, a passive occupant protection system. This provides a protective envelope consisting of strong, closely-spaced seats that have energy-absorbing padded seat backs that help to distribute and reduce crash forces. Compartmentalization is most effective when occupants are fully seated within the bus seat. Students should sit on a school bus seat without any part of his or her body extending into the aisle.

More children are hurt outside school buses than inside as a passenger. School bus safety tips for drivers:

• Prepare to stop when a slowing bus has its overhead yellow lights flashing

• Stop at least 20 feet away for buses when red lights are flashing, unless driving in the opposite direction on a divided highway

- Slow down in or near school and residential areas
- Watch for children between parked cars and other objects

School buses are like traffic signals

- When overhead lights are flashing yellow: Prepare to stop
- When overhead lights are flashing red: Stop
- When hazard warning lights are flashing: Proceed with caution

School bus safety tips for students:

- Always stay in sight of the bus driver
- Don't cross the road without the bus driver showing the safety signal
- Students crossing in front of the bus should move forward, away

from the bus, until they can make eye contact with the driver and wait fo the safety signal before crossing the street

Get Connected to Hartland's Parent Portal!

The parent portal provides each parent access to his or her child's student data including attendance, academic records, progress reports, lunch account, and more.

Each parent may request his or her own PIN and password to access the portal.

Here is how to get yours:

1. Send an email to pc@hartlandschools.us, preferably from the email account you provided Hartland Schools upon registration of your child.

2. In the subject line, type Parent Portal PIN & password request.

3. List all your children currently enrolled in Hartland Schools, by their legal name.

- 4. After each child's name, indicate the building in which he or she is enrolled.
- 5. Be sure to indicate your legal name as the parent making the request.
- 6. Send the email.

A personal PIN and password will be emailed to you within 1 or 2 school days. We recommend you keep the PIN and password in a safe place. You have the ability to change your password but if you do forget it, you can always email and request a password reset. Did you know BREAKFAST will be served daily at Round, Farms, Ore Creek, Hartland High School and Legacy for the 2015-2016 school year?

Breakfast is available to <u>ALL</u> students at the above buildings!

If your child is approved for either Free or Reduced meals, your child is also eligible to receive either FREE breakfast or reduced price breakfast for only \$0.30.




Above: Students cheer on the Hartland Varsity Basketball team.

All Seniors Are Encouraged To Apply For Financial Aid

Hartland High School is aiming for the senior class to have a 100% completion rate of the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). It has been proven that students who fill out the FAFSA are more likely to follow through on their post secondary plans, and many schools no longer give out merit scholarships to students who do not apply for financial aid through the FAFSA.

We will have a thermometer style banner up in the hallway outside the main office showing the percentage of our senior class who has completed the FAFSA. Students/parents need to print out the confirmation page once they have submitted their FAFSA online, and turn a copy of it into the counseling office.

This confirmation page has no personal information on it. Each week starting in February, we will do a drawing for students who have turned in their confirmation page, and the students may win gift cards to Target, Bookstores, Gas Cards, etc. The earlier they turn in the confirmation page, the more chances they have at winning.




