


Superintendent's Message Janet Sifferman, Superintendent

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Hartland Schools Teacher of the Year

Rob Jellison

Hartland Consolidated Schools Teacher of the Year has taught for 16 years, the first year was as a long-term sub, all of which were for Hartland Middle School. Jellison's passion for teaching came from his love for children and wanting to help them learn about the world beyond the classroom walls.



Having great teachers growing up and

seeing how much they enjoyed their job had a huge impact on Jellison's decision to become a teacher himself.

"As I tell people all of the time - everyday is a new journey in the profession of teaching," he said. "Growing up in Hartland, I knew I wanted to be a teacher by the time I was a junior in high school. It was not until I helped build houses while attending GVSU that those thoughts changed. I loved working with my hands and thought a residential log homebuilder was going to be the path I took into my retirement years. However, having a pars fracture in my L5 vertebrae changed my path, and brought me back to teaching. As many have told me time and time again - everything happens for a reason."

The archery program at Hartland Schools was started when Jellison took an educational wilderness leadership class in Jackson Hole. This is where he learned about the National Archery in the Schools Program and thought that it would be a great addition in Hartland. Having always been an avid outdoorsman who loved to hunt and fish, Jellison returned from his trip as a certified instructor and took the proposal to Mr. Steve Livingway, principal at Hartland Middle School. Livingway and Hartland Superintendent, Jan Sifferman gave Jellison permission to order equipment and teach a few science units in his classroom while using archery equipment. Shortly after the units ended, students wanted to keep shooting, so Jellison stayed after school with 18 kids to shoot. Those 18 students became the start of the Hartland Youth Outdoors Club, that also involves fishing, canoeing, shotgun sports, and archery.

Today, there are more than 200 students in the district that tryout for the elementary, middle school, and high school archery teams each year. These teams have won 23 State Titles in ten years and have the World Record High Score for a female archer. They have had archers win Nationals, Worlds, and make the USA All-Star Team every year for the past five years.

"The best part of my job is seeing a student who looks at me and knows that I truly care about them," Jellison said. "It is not just a student/teacher connection. They become family to me as soon as they walk into my classroom. Of course I want them to learn my curriculum and be prepared for the high school, but in the big picture, life can get in the way at times and they just need to know someone cares more about them then how they are doing on an assessment or in a class."

Get Connected to Hartland's Parent Portal!

The parent portal provides each parent access to his or her child's student data including attendance, academic records, progress reports, lunch account, and more.

Each parent may request his or her own PIN and password to access the portal.

Here is how to get yours:

- 1. Send an email to pc@hartlandschools.us, preferably from the email account you
- provided Hartland Schools upon registration of your child.
- 2. In the subject line, type Parent Portal PIN & password request.
- 3. List all your children currently enrolled in Hartland Schools, by their legal name.
- 4. After each child's name, indicate the building in which he or she is enrolled.5. Be sure to indicate your legal name as the parent making the request.
- 6. Send the email.

A personal PIN and password will be emailed to you within 1 or 2 school days. We recommend you keep the PIN and password in a safe place. You have the ability to change your password but if you do forget it, you can always email and request a password reset.

Have You Submitted Your Transportation Forms for the 16/17 School Year

All existing Transportation Forms (Alternate Destination, Joint Custody, School of Choice, and Legacy forms) will expire on June 20, 2016. New Transportation forms for the 2016/2017 school year must be submitted and received by July 1, 2016 to request a bus assignment other than the home address.

All forms are destroyed at the end of the school year. New forms are required each year by July 1st to incorporate your request into our routes. If new forms are not submitted, all in-district students will be assigned to the stop closest to their home.

After July 1st, non-resident students that do not have a new form submitted will not receive a bus assignment, and cannot be assigned a bus for the first two weeks of school.





IS YOUR CHILD READY FOR KINDERGARTEN?






