With the graduation season upon us, I am honored to support the Livingston Community Prevention Project, Parents as Partners in Prevention, The Hartland Coalition, Project Success, Livingston County Community Alliance, and the Office of the Prosecuting Attorney in an effort to educate parents on the power of modeling positive choices for our graduates.



I humbly request that parents support that providing alcohol to minors is against the law. Help me to ensure that no tragedies confront the community due to poor adult choices. I ask you to recognize the great responsibilities that come with celebrating the accomplishments of our graduates.

In just a few more days school will be out for the summer. The school year has flown by so quickly! I have been blessed with a wonderful team of educators and a supportive community, and am very thankful for the opportunity to guide the district forward and to meet your needs during the year.

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Sinking Fund Proposal Passes:

I want to take a moment to thank the Hartland Community for approving the Building and Site Sinking Fund proposal on May 2, 2017. While the ballot was confusing asking for a tax increase, the end result will be a "zero" net increase.

The Board of Education will discuss reducing the current debt levy tax rate in June, and will reduce it by the same 0.5 mill increase approved by the election. Thank you again for taking the time to understand the proposal and for supporting the district's effort to repair and upgrade facilities and technology. This will ensure that our students are offered a safe and enriching educational experience as we seek to remain a premier school district of choice.

Hartland High School Recognized by Two National Publications:

Congratulations to the students and staff at Hartland High School. The school was recently honored with recognition as a Top 50 Michigan High School by U.S. News and World Reports. The annual "America's Best High Schools" list was released in April. The high school was also honored by the Washington Post as part of their "America's Most Challenging High Schools" list. Hartland High School was ranked 29th in the state. In each of the past four years, the high school has moved up on this list. I believe that these honors are the result of a K-12 collaborative effort to ensure that the district sets high expectations for our students and provides ample opportunities for students to engage in character-building activities. Our vision is centered on "A community of learners shaping successful tomorrows." This vision guides all of our work and interactions with students. Teachers often share with me how impressed they are with the skills that students bring forward from grade to grade.

The District Saves Significant Dollars on Teacher Evaluation Tool:

Did you know that district staff and administration have been implementing a new teacher evaluation system designed over a two-year period and implemented this year? Instead of spending a large amount of money on purchasing one of four ready-to-use evaluation tools recommended by the State of Michigan, the district developed its own evaluation tool at a substantial cost savings. The legislators created legal expectations and guidelines, which the district used to develop this tool. I believe that we are the only school district in the state to develop a local tool, per the Michigan Department of Education. This took many hours of research, conversation, and training to accomplish. I am proud to say, one more example of how the district works hard to use our resources in a fiscally responsible way.

17/18 Transportation Forms REMINDER

All current Transportation Forms (Alternate Destination, Joint Custody, School of Choice, and Legacy forms) will expire on June 20, 2017. New 2017/2018 Transportation Forms are to be submitted to the Transportation Office before July 1, 2017 to request a bus assignment other than the home address.

New forms are required each year by July 1st to incorporate your request into our routes. If forms are not submitted: In-district students will be automatically be assigned to the closest bus stop to their home address. Non-resident students will not receive a bus assignment.

Late transportation changes may not be possible for the start of school and will not be considered until the week of September 18, 2017.

Registration for the 2017-18 school year starts June 5th. To guarantee a spot on the transfer bus, register by July 1st.

We offer care for children who attend the Round, Village and Creekside, Lakes Elementary and Farms Intermediate School. The children who attend the Lakes or Farms Schools may enroll at the School Street center, or take advantage of the schoolage program at the Lakes Elementary School.



Both center locations are open 6:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.

Both programs offer gym activities, arts and crafts, and outside play. When you are signed up for the Before and After School Care, you also have the option of attending on the "No School" days or Snow days! Our center is almost always open!

Before & After School Child Care Only

Full Time enrollment (5 days a week) is \$9.00 a session

Part Time enrollment (2-4 days a week) is \$11.00 a session

The minimum enrollment is 2 sessions a week for a charge of \$22 for the week.





Example- A student needs to attend 5 –AM sessions and 1 –P.M. session. The charge would be \$45 for the A.M. and \$11 for the P.M. session, for a total charge for the week of \$56.

You must notify the office if your child/children will be absent from the Before & After school program. Your regular weekly tuition will be charged unless the Center is closed. If your Before & After School child attends on a No School Day, Snow Day, etc., your tuition for the day will be \$35.



IS YOUR CHILD READY FOR KINDERGARTEN OR 1ST GRADE?

Can they sit still, listen, follow directions and get along with others?

While teaching 100's of preschoolers and kindergarteners over the last 14 years we have discovered one critical key to success for not only school but for the rest of their lives

Here is the key: <u>Your child's first day in school is **HUGE**!</u> It will pretty much dictate how they do for the rest of their academic career! If your child is ahead of her peers she will stay ahead and love school. Kids that start off behind their peers almost never catch up and like school less.

Along with falling behind they can sometimes get inaccurately "labeled" as unable to focus, hyperactive or extremely shy. We have wonderful teachers in our elementary schools but partially because of the overwhelming academic curriculum they do not have the time or resources to teach the needed basic behavioral skills to your child. Young children really need to have these skills **BEFORE** they start kindergarten.

As a result we are seeing more kids struggle through kindergarten. We have talented hard working kindergarten teachers in our community but increasingly they are needing to just give their students the benefit of the doubt and pass them on to first grade hoping they succeed.

The missing skills we are talking about are centered around "Self-Regulation".

Self-regulation is the ability to monitor and manage emotions, thoughts, and behaviors. It's what helps children focus their attention on learning when they might be distracted by others, upset by a problem, or excited about an upcoming event.

When humans are first born they have little control of their reaction to their emotions and feelings. When they are hungry or uncomfortable they cry. As they get older they need to be able to regulate their response and not just react to their emotions. For example, when they get mad they cannot just hit

others. Or, when they are playing with others they may need to share when they do not want to. They may have to focus and listen while being distracted.

These skills are not just required for success in young children. Later they help teens and adults resolve conflict, problem solve, think independently, participate and get along with others.

So how do you help your child? Just copy what we do. At our school we like to use the term "accelerating their lives". We want our students to experience things at five years old that most kids do not experience until they are in high school. A good example of this is public speaking. While our students practice speaking and performing in front of a group at an early age, many kid's first experience is that speech class in high school!

Children learn by "doing" and repetition. So here is what you can do. Intentionally look for experiences that practice self-regulating skills. Things like having to listen to instructors and coaches. Handling distractions. Placed in emotional situations like getting frustrated or making a mistake. Expose them to stress, failure and hardship regularly. Working with partners and on a team. Get them involved with making decisions and making choices. Place them in situations where they have to help others and eventually in leadership positions.

Anyways I hope this helps. Like I always tell our parents "You only get one chance to start kindergarten!"

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

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
