







Tara Yoerg, a Hartland Graduate, has worked for Hartland Schools for

16 years. She has been teaching Preschool for 8 years. Tara has a Bachelor's in Education with her teaching certification from East ern. Her two boys loved attending Hartland Childcare.





Our three year old class focuses on social skills and beginning relationship building. Through mostly play based situations, children begin to understand concepts of sharing, interacting in a large group and following teacher directed activities and instructions. We introduce basic social school concepts such as standing in line, hand washing, eating snack at school, sitting in a group for stories and songs, and waiting for his or her turn. Children learn about the world around them in weekly themes and concepts. Through the use of crafts, projects, games and smart board activities, children learn with fun!

Our four year old class continues to focus on social skills and building relationships. We work on kindergarten readiness skills; standing in line, hand washing, eating lunch, sitting in a group for stories and songs, and waiting for his or her turn. We practice fine motor activities; cutting, writing, drawing, painting, play doh, etc. Large motor activities include dancing, gym, playground, and Education Through Music. As with our 3 year old class, children learn with fun while making crafts, projects, playing games and smart board activities. We use programs including Zoo Phonics, Handwriting Without Tears and Second Step.

**Zoo Phonics** is a method developed to help children become strong readers and spellers using a "phono" (hearing), "oral" (speaking), "visual"(seeing), "kinesthetic" (moving), and "tactile" (touching)- whole brain approach.

**Handwriting Without Tears** (HWT) is an easy way to teach pre-printing and printing. It uses multi- sensory techniques and consistent habits for letter formation to help teach handwriting to all students.

**Second Step** is a social emotional early learning program that teaches skills to help children learn, manage feelings, make friends, and solve problems.

Education Through Music is a program that utilizes song and intentional movement to develop language, socialization, confidence and joy through singing and play.

Livingston County as a whole is one of the most progressive, and forward thinking counties in the State of Michigan! Many people do not have a clue what their FD members do day in, and day out, until their services are needed.

I am proud to have served alongside them all, and proud to have called the Hartland Deerfield Fire Authority my home. Please remember to check your smoke alarms monthly, and always have two ways out! If you need help with smoke alarms, or coming up with a custom fire escape plan for you or your family, PLEASE call us....We are here for you!

# TEACHING YOUR CHILD TO WORK HARD

How to develop a strong work ethic in an entitled instant gratification world?

Parents, do you ever have a difficult time getting your child to do homework? Is it a challenge to get them to do even the simplest chores around the house or just to pick up after themselves? Is it becoming increasingly difficult to get them to stop playing videos games or to put down that tablet/smartphone?

So how do you develop a strong work ethic and drive to work hard in your child? Isn't this really a key for success later in life?

Much of it comes down to one thing - **DISCIPLINE**. It is an over-used and misunderstood word. Parents say to me all the time "Sensei, my child needs to be more disciplined!" But what is discipline? Simply, discipline is the ability to "do what you do not want to do"!

A good example is your fitness and health. We all know what we need to do to be fit and healthy right? Exercise regularly and eat right. Simple, isn't it? But how hard is this to do? Some people exercise and eat well with ease while others struggle from the start. Why? They are "disciplined" people. But how did they get that way? All they did was start and continue a <a href="https://habtit.com/habtit.co

So back to your child. How do you develop discipline and a hard work ethic/habit in your child?

<u>First, start EARLY!</u> Like anything else, the sooner you develop a habit the better. It is much easier to start with a good habit than change a bad one later. Remember, a person develops most of

the habits they will have for the rest of their lives between the ages of 0 and 7!

Second, start with the SMALL STUFF! You start this habit by making your child "do things they do not want to do" BUT start small! Small things done consistently over time is the secret to success at anything! So instead of making them bungee jump or clean the whole house, make them eat foods they do not like. Make them get up as soon are their alarm clock goes off. Make them go to bed at an exact time. Make them stop playing a video game or get them to do a simple task the first time they are asked.

Third, be both consistent and patient! Why do most parent let their kids slide out of doing something they do not want to do? Because it is easier. It is easier than laying down the law and holding fast. But this extra work put in at the start pays off when they are teens and adults.

But what does this all mean in the future? A teen who grows up and finishes college with a degree in four years instead of one that changes majors a dozen times then drops out with thousands in student loans. A child that develops into an employee any boss would love. (They are the ones who always have great jobs and later turn into the boss!). A child who goes on to be an amazing spouse and parent because instead of giving up on the slightest difficulty or discomfort they work hard and persevere.

People who are disciplined and always work hard make life seem so easy!


