# Hartland Schools Person of the Month

#### Pam Iden

Pam Iden is a World Language Teacher at Hartland High School and has been employed with the district for 18 years, but as you will see from her story, her roots in Hartland are MUCH longer than that! Pam earned a BA in Linguistics at University of Michigan-Flint, her Michigan Teacher Certification from Oakland University, and Masters in the Art of Teaching from Marygrove College. She has also studied extensively abroad: Alliance Française, Paris – French Language and Culture



Proficiency, and Institut für Europäische Studien, Vienna – German Language and Culture Proficieny. Please take a moment to read Pam's very interesting life story and her strong ties to Hartland and Livingston County.

Like many of the HCS staff, I went to school here. In fact my entire family, all eight Narhi children attended Hartland Schools, K-12. Though my dad, David Narhi, passed away eight years ago, my mom, Donna Narhi, still lives in our farm house in the very northwest corner of the district. My oldest sister Cindy, graduated in 1975. My youngest sister, Monica, graduated in 1995. There are pictures of Monica hanging in the Performing Arts Center lobby depicting her as "Cosette" in the play Les Miserable, among other productions. A more current picture of her is hanging in the main hallway of the high school. Above the memorial plaque to the fallen soldiers from our district, is a picture of her piloting a Black Hawk Medivac helicopter in Afghanistan. She is still proudly serving our country as a CW3 Army Medivac Pilot. My brother, Andy and wife Sandy, live in the district near my mom. My nieces, Audrey and Sophie Narhi, are in the 8th grade at Hartland Middle School. My brother, Tim Narhi, does not live in the district, but often holds auctions in the area. He and his wife, Kim, have owned their auctioneer business for 30 years. On my husband's side of the family, my niece and nephew, Georgia and Jack Iden, graduated from Hartland and are now both at universities, MSU and Grand Valley respectively. I could go on...but I think you get the idea; my family and I are greatly invested in this county and school district.

A very gratifying time for me in my career at Hartland happened about four years ago. Two of my former German students, Ryan Iseppi and Michael Herrick (Tara Bosley's younger brother), graduated from the University of Michigan with German minors and were recipients of Fulbright Scholarships. They both went to Germany on their Fulbright Scholarships – Mike for Urban Planning and Ryan to teach English at a German High School. I was happy that they had continued with German and was proud that the overall education we provided prepared them for such accomplishments. I have heard similar success stories from Hartland graduates over the years. I am grateful to the students who come back or write to let us know we made positive impacts on their lives. A little validation goes a long way.

I did not expect to teach in this district. It was Mike Scheib, my childhood neighbor and best friend, who informed me that Jan Cooley needed help. Her husband, Greg, was diagnosed with a brain tumor. I took a long term substitute position in French in the Spring of 1998 to allow Jan to spend the mornings with her husband.

At the end of that school year Larry Eichler retired and I was offered a part-time teaching position in German. I accepted and in the years that followed I have taught both French and German. For the past four years, I have taught only German. I teach German 1,2,3,4 and 5. The addition of eighth graders to German I in the past seven years precipitated the addition of German 5. ... # **School Bus Safety**

#### DANGER ZONES AROUND THE SCHOOL BUS

- The "Danger Zone" is the area surrounding the bus where it's difficult to see children in the bus mirrors
- 20 feet in front, 10 feet behind and 10 feet on each side of the school

#### LOADING / UNLOADING SAFELY

- STAY on your own side of the road 10 feet from the roadway, in a single row
- WAIT until the bus has come to a complete stop, the red overhead lights are activated, and the DRIVER DISPLAYS THE YELLOW SAFETY SIGNAL
- When crossing the road, CHECK traffic both ways /then check again and walk 10 feet in front of the bus
- NEVER stop to pick up anything on the ground.







The speakers overall intentions were to provide our students with new tools for becoming a force for change. It was an incredibly inspirational afternoon felt by all!

#### It's about something much more important...

Most parents come to us thinking their child will learn karate like the movies and TV. But, they are surprised by what they discover!

While we do teach great self-defense and fitness what this is really all about is teaching children the life-skills, habits, attitudes and most importantly the character traits they need to be high achieving, successful and happy children. Kids can only learn by "doing" so we create a unique highly structured, disciplined and intense environment where they can have life changing positive experiences. We also feel it is critical to surround our children with a "village" of amazing teachers, mentor and peers.

But don't take my word for it:

"Emma was always very reluctant to try new things and didn't adapt to change very well...when we signed Emma up for "karate class" at Ohana Karate, we had no idea the wonderful program we were enrolling her into. As expected, Emma was very shy and hesitant to join in with her class. Truth be told, the first several weeks her daddy and I did more karate with her class than she did. But Sensei was great. He kept encouraging her and telling her what a good job she was doing. Sensei helped us work out a plan for Emma to introduce her to challenging situations in a safe environment to build her courage and confidence. I am pleased to say that in 6 months, she has gone from crying during class, wanting to sit on our laps, wanting us to go out on the mat with her to, enthusiastically participating

in tournaments and even volunteering to demonstrate in class. I was so proud at her last tournament of her confidence. She didn't hesitate once.

The bonus I didn't realize that came with karate at Ohana Karate was the change I have seen in Emma's behavior. Through their Character Development Program, we have seen changes in ways we couldn't have imagined. The other day at dinner, she was already sitting down and I got up and got a napkin for her and I. Without any prompting she said, "Thank you Mommy for getting me a napkin". It may seem like a small thing but to go from constantly reminding her, "What do you say?" to having her show full and complete gratitude..it is amazing.
