#### **Farms Intermediate School**

Farms is in the beginning stages of implementing The Stock Market Game on-line education program. This program is used in thousands of classrooms nationwide to help teach math, social studies, business, economics, and language skills while focusing on the importance of long-term savings and investment. Students in grades 4 through 12 participate in a state-wide competition and manage a simulated investment portfolio during the school year. Each portfolio has a hypothetical \$100,000.00 for students to invest in stocks, mutual funds and bonds. Over 500 students will be competing in the first school-wide Farms Cup Challenge. Throughout the fall, students have been practicing making trades and learning about stocks. Students have been viewing recorded webinars both at school and at home. The informational videos were created by Mr. Anderson, 6<sup>th</sup> grade math teacher. The Farms Cup Challenge will officially begin on February 18th and continue for 10 weeks. Students will be expected to research companies and make trades both at home and at school. The top ten students who earn the most money during the challenge will be rewarded with gift bags donated by LOC Credit Union, Ballard Benefit Works, Inc., and Edward Jones of Hartland, which are also helping to sponsor this program.
