Over the past few years you may have heard about the movement to create common educational standards throughout the United States. The Hartland Consolidated School District is in the process of determining what our curriculum will look like under the Common Core State Standards for English Language Arts (ELA) and Mathematics (Math) as compared to the Michigan Grade Level Content Expectations (GLCE's) and High School Content Expectations (HSCE's). More importantly, we are in the process of trying to ensure that our curricula address the content and skills necessary for every Hartland Consolidated School District graduate to be "college and career ready." The end result will be a rigorous curriculum for all students.

As we move this work forward, we want to keep you informed and help you better understand the impact that this shift in standards will have on your children.
