#### **SUPERTINTENDENT'S REPORT HAPPENINGS AT ROUND ELEMENTARY**

Mr. Hughes introduced Principal Hottum to talk about happenings at Round Elementary. Mrs. Hottum introduced teachers Ms. Rutherford, Ms. Spiker, Ms. Kucharski, Ms. Saunders, Ms. Ronzi, and Mrs. Way. A PowerPoint presentation was shown as staff talked about the importance of supporting kids at home and over the summer with reading.

#### **ANNUAL BREAKFAST HEARING**

Mr. Hughes then introduced the Director of Student Nutrition Lisa Archey and Assistant Superintendent Scott Bacon, who conducted the annual Breakfast Hearing. Mr. Bacon noted that the requirement for mandatory breakfast programming is that 20% of a building's population qualifies for free & reduced lunch. The district does offer breakfast at Legacy High School, as its population meets the 20% requirement, and also at HHS, HMS, and Farms. The last three don't meet the percentage required, however all three buildings already have kitchen staff in place and have a high level of

participation. The program at these buildings pays for itself, with a small profit. Next year breakfast will also be offered at Village and Round. The program will cost the district approximately \$6,000/year at each of these elementary buildings.

### **MAEO OUTSTANDING ADVOCATE AWARD PRESENTATION**

Michelle Otis introduced Deb Baughman, president of MAEO, who presented the Outstanding Advocate Award to Sue Silver for her many years of dedication to the Alternative Education program.

### **NEW DISTRICT VIDEO**

Scott VanEpps talked about the revised video created for the website and then played the video for everyone in attendance. Mr. VanEpps thanked everyone who participated in making the video.

### **GRADUATION**

Mr. Hughes reminded everyone that the Legacy graduation is May 30<sup>th</sup> at the HESSC and the High School graduation is June 8<sup>th</sup> at EMU Convocation Center.

### **MITES AWARDS PRESENTATION**

Mr. Assenmacher presented the annual state competition awards to students.

### **CALL TO PUBLIC**

Kim Evans talked about how the MEA has asked school districts to hold walk-ins to support public education during the month of May. Kim invited the school board and administrators to join teachers during the walk-in before school on Wednesday.

RE: 2018 Computer Replacement Recommendation from 2010 Bond

Dr. Mr. Hughes,

According to our computer replacement schedule, the Summer of 2018 is when we are to replace student computers at Hartland High School. The student devices in that location have been in place for 8 years, therefore, the high school is in need of this planned replacement. I have spoken with high school administration and both they and I have been in communication teachers to ensure that the devices we are looking to purchase will be a good fit for each of the student computer locations throughout that building.

As we replace student computers at the high school, we will be pulling the old computers and combining parts of them to make computers that are better than devices located elsewhere in the district. The remaining pieces and oldest equipment that we truly no longer have any use for will be recycled through our annual recycling project.

All devices purchased will be done so off the 2018 REMC SPOT Bid or the 2018 REMC Bid. We have been using the REMC and REMC SPOT Bid annually since 2014 for at least some of our summer technology acquisitions. Each year, REMC sends out an RFP for many standard configurations of computers including Chromeboxes, Chromebooks, PC laptops and desktops, and Apple laptops and desktops. The buying power of all REMC schools brings the prices of this equipment down significantly and provides common school configurations of equipment that is consistent with that we are looking to procure.

Based upon district needs and the evaluation of products on the REMC and REMC SPOT Bid, I would like to present the following to be approved by the Board of Education:

## **2018 Summer Computer Purchase**

**Student Desktops, Monitors, Chromeboxes, Chromebooks, Chromebook Carts**

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**TOTAL: \$420,314.70**

RE: 2018 Classroom Audio Bid Summary and Recommendation to be paid from Sinking Fund

Dr. Mr. Hughes,

Bid documents were issued for Classroom Audio systems on May 4, 2018 with the intent of replacing classroom audio equipment at Round Elementary School. The equipment that will be removed at Round Elementary will be used to replace failing classroom audio equipment in other classrooms throughout the district as needed. Bids were received on May 25, 2018 and opened publically at 10:00 a.m. Bids were tabulated and evaluated and post bid interviews were scheduled for Friday, June 1, 2018 with three vendors representing three different products. Members of the HCS Technology Team were present at the post bid interviews.

In the RFP, we asked for bids on classroom audio systems that use infrared (IR) technology, however, more recent advances in classroom audio are using a different method of transmission of audio known as DECT (Digital Enhanced Cordless Telecommunications). The advantage of DECT systems is that there are no dropouts when the classroom teacher or students are using the microphones. This technology has been used in cordless telephones for many years and has been used in classroom audio solutions with some manufacturers for about three years. Our recommendation to the Board of Education will be an alternate from one of the bid proposals which provides the DECT technology. The cost of the infrared system is the same as the cost of the DECT system (from this manufacturer), however, since we asked for an IR solution in the RFP, the base bid provided was for an infrared system in addition chose to bid a DECT solution as an alternate.

Based upon the evaluation of the district technology staff, we present the following to be awarded by the Board of Education:

## **Why We Are Not Recommending the Lowest Two Bidders**

The lowest bidder proposed a product from a manufacturer we currently using in several of our buildings. We have not been happy with that product. We have had to replace many microphones, charging stations, and amplifiers over the 6 years this equipment has been installed at Hartland Schools. Due to our dissatisfaction with the product proposed by the lowest bidder, the technology team did not feel comfortable recommending that product.

The second lowest bidder was low by \$2,452.00 and proposed an infrared solution. A common complaint the technology team hears throughout the district is how the current systems (infrared) exhibit "drops" in the audio from the person using the microphone. This dropping of signal is due to the nature of infrared technology where the signal from the microphone bounces around the room until it comes in contact with the sensor in the ceiling or on the speakers. If the user walks to a location where the signal from the microphone does not bounce in such a way that it comes in contact with an infrared sensor, the audio signal "drops" until the end-user moves in such a way that the signal is received by a sensor. When we evaluated the products, the team felt that Audio Enhancement was the best overall solution for Hartland Schools.

Upon approval by the Board of Education, HCS will issue a PO to the approved bidder for procurement and installation during the Summer of 2018.
