The support we can provide our students and staff is evident in the positive rankings shared below. NICHE Best in Michigan 2022 Rankings

Each year NICHE rates school districts in Michigan. This year our Teachers, Academics and College Prep all earned an "A" grade. The Hartland School District is rated the 8th safest school district out of 578 districts in this category and our athletic program is rated 14th out of 571. Our overall ranking is 34th out of 556, placing us in the top 6% of school districts in the State of Michigan. Kindergarten Enrollment for 2022-23 Online enrollment via hartlandschools.us has started!



The online process allows for the following required documents to be uploaded:

- · Birth certificate-a copy for school records.
- Immunization records with proof of DTP, Polio, MMR, Hepatitis B, Chicken Pox vaccines (or proof of having illness), and a vision screening, plus copy of same for school records.
- Proof of residency using one of the following: certificate of occupancy, purchase agreement, builder's permit, rent receipt or agreement, mortgage statement/receipt, voter registration card, utility bill or driver's license.

Children are eligible for enrollment in Kindergarten in August 2022 if they will have their 5th birthday on or before September 1st, 2022. A child who turns five after September 1st and before December 1st, 2022 may enroll if parent/legal guardian signs a waiver that is supported by the school district.

A full-day Junior Kindergarten program may be offered. A minimum number of students are required for the program to be made available. Parent may need to provide transportation in order to participate. The age requirements for Junior Kindergarten are the same as for the regular Kindergarten program.


Running Late to the Bus

To continue to provide the safest possible transportation for your child we'd like to share the required protocol when running late to the bus in the morning.

It is required that you should either:

- Call Transportation at 810-626-2175 so they can communicate with the driver, and determine a stop location where you can meet the bus
- Transport your student to school.

Following is an excerpt from the Student/Parent Handbook, Bus Responsibilities of Parents: "To ascertain and insure that their children arrive at the bus stop 5 minutes prior to the bus arrival in the morning. Once the alternating lights are deactivated on the bus, they may not be reactivated and it is the parents' responsibility to transport their student to school, not another bus stop. Students or parents should never try to catch the bus once the lights have been cancelled."

3 Most Common Mistakes

IS YOUR CHILD A PERFECTIONIST?

Instead...teach them how to be perfect.

"I am always PERFECT...at the END!"

You might be a little shocked by this but—<u>Don't turn them into perfectionists!</u>

This is very difficult to do. It is all our fault. In today's world we push our kids too hard too early and expect them to be perfect. We tell them we do not expect them to be perfect but yet we do not let them make mistakes or get things wrong. It may age me a little but when I was a kindergartner all I had to do was drink milk, take naps and play. Today if a kindergartner does not already know how to read, spell their name and count, they are behind. Not too long ago child development experts called the ages seven and below the "pre-academic" stage of life.

Too early in children's lives they cease being allowed to make mistakes. When they are in school their score or grade is docked with each mistake. When they miss the ball when batting in T-ball or miss catching a ball everyone goes "oh" and "ah", or worse yet, laughs. **Wanting to be perfect is good,** but being a perfectionist is not. This is where the roots of shyness can be found.

What are some signs that your child is developing into a perfectionist? If your child hesitates before doing most things. If they say "I can't" even before they try. If your child wants to quit the first time something gets hard. If they do not want to turn in their homework because they are afraid it is not perfect. If they say "I am not ready yet" or "Can I watch first?" If they want to guit something



when they feel they do not get good enough fast enough. As they get older they typically suffer from high levels of anxiety and fear. The key at this stage is to reward "effort" and not "results."

Action Tip: Again the first thing to do is just NOTICE. Just become much more aware of their behaviors that reinforce perfectionism. Then initially start by recognizing, praising and rewarding effort over results. Here is one of the most powerful concepts I have

learned about success—"Do not expect to be perfect at the start...spend your time and energy being perfect at the END!"

Did you know that when the Apollo spacecraft headed for the moon they were off course almost the entire time? They would have to change course and correct all along the way. But in the end they would land within a few hundred yards from the targeted landing spot! That would be like us throw a rock 50 yards and getting it in a small bucket! If NASA and the Astronauts were perfectionists they would have never left the ground. They only concentrated on being perfect at the end. Perfectionists rarely start anything and quit at the first sign of failure. So teach and reward your child for being a quick, strong starter and that the only thing that really counts is their success at the "end!" The best way is to model it for them.






