Important Notice to Parents: Armed Forces

Recruiter Access to Students and Student Recruiting Information

The "No Child Left Behind Act of 2001" passed certain new requirements with respect to Armed Forces Recruiter Access to Students and Student Recruiting Information:

- Duty to Provide Information to Military Recruiters. Unless the parent otherwise requests, the District must provide upon request by military recruiters access to high school student's names, addresses and telephone listings.
- Consent. Either the high school student or the parent of the student may request that the student's name, address and telephone listing not be released without prior parental consent. Schools are required to notify parents of this option to make a request and shall comply with the request. This is the required notification and the Opt-Out Form is below.
- Access to Students. Each district shall provide military recruiters the same access to high school students as is provided generally to higher education institutions, community colleges, and prospective employers.

To the parents/guardians of children attending Hartland Consolidated Schools:

As a part of registering your child at Hartland for the 2021-22 school year, you need to acknowledge/affirm/designate information related to the following:

- Accurate up-to-date emergency contact information for you.
- Concussion awareness.
- Health Alerts including Consent for Disclosure of Immunization Information to Local and State Health Departments.
- In-district field trip participation.
- District Technology Information including the District Acceptable Use Policy.
- Parent Release relating to photographs or other electronic images of special events/happenings throughout the district that include your child's picture and/or name.
- Appropriate grade Student Handbook has been read and understood.
- Directory Information see Board Policy 8330 and FERPA Regulations. (FERPA Regulations can be found on Page 22 of this issue.)



Welcome Back from Hartland Transportation!

The 2021/2022 school year is quickly approaching, and we are looking forward to another great year! As always, we strive to make your child's bus ride a positive part of their educational experience. Here are a few important informational points for review:

- Your student must be waiting at the bus stop 5 minutes prior to the scheduled arrival of the bus. Once the alternating lights of the bus are deactivated, the bus driver cannot legally reactivate them and it is then the parent's responsibility to transport their student to school.
- Students and Parents should never try to catch the bus once the lights have been canceled. Please do not go to another bus stop without contacting the Transportation Office; the bus driver must be notified.
- If possible, your house number should be visible from the traveled roadway; mailbox numbers are acceptable but should be large enough and clearly visible on both sides.
- The expected behavior of the student rider is found in the Parent-Student Handbook. We encourage parents to review these responsibilities with their children to ensure their privilege of riding is not lost. The handbook can be found by going to the district website at www.hartlandschools.us, then clicking on Parents & Students, and then Handbooks
- Postcards will be mailed home a week before school starts with your student's bus information. The computerized postcard will only list one stop address but your student should wait on the same side of the road they reside on until the bus is in place with red lights activated and the bus driver crosses them.
- Students should never cross the road prior to the arrival of the bus.



Understanding and Supporting Kindergarten Reading By Monique Alberts, Hartland Schools Literacy Instructional Coach

Often when I meet parents who have a soon-to-be Kindergartner, they ask, "How do I know they are ready for Kindergarten? And what can I do to help at home?" The feeling of excitement for this new adventure and the worry over doing what's best for your child is a common feeling parents share. I am sure you have a lot of questions about reading, so I would like to offer some ideas to support you and your child for the upcoming school year.

- Read for enjoyment throughout the day. If your child loves a book, read it again and again.
- Talk to your child about the different parts of a book. Have conversations around the front and back, title and author, the difference between a letter, a word and punctuation.
- Play with letters and letter sounds. Write them in sand, paint them, sing them, draw them on the sidewalk or in the bathtub.
- Find time for your child to build some independence with reading and writing. Allow them to read or draw on their own. They can create a story by drawing pictures or look "read" through a stack of books
- Allow your child to practice telling stories. Make up stories together. What happens at the beginning, in the middle, or at the end. Or retell a part of your day before going to bed.
- Have your child draw, cut, and paste. Allow them to use those fine motor skills and imaginations. Have them tell you about their picture, they can even try to label the first letter of some of the things they draw.

Over the course of Kindergarten, your child will grow leaps and bounds as both a reader and writer. The teacher will continue to focus on skills such

- Letter recognition for both upper and lower case letters.
- Letter sounds.
- Making a one-to-one match when reading left to right from justright texts.
- Attending to books for longer periods of time (reading stamina).
- Using reading strategies taught during reading workshop.
- Attending to writing for longer periods of time (writing stamina).
- Generating ideas, drawing, and attempting to label pictures with letters and sounds.
- Reading high frequency words in books.
- Writing high frequency words in their own stories.

The home to school connection is critically important to your child's success. We believe that in order for a child to have a successful educational experience, everyone must work together as a team, starting in Kindergarten. Your support at home is appreciated and valued. Thank you for trusting us to be part of your family and congratulations as you embark on this new educational journey

Is your child ready for bullying?



What you can do at home.

Before the start of every school year in the month of August, we prepare our students for bullying. But this is much more than just fending off the playground bully. It is more about teaching children the assertiveness and social skills of establishing strong, healthy and positive relationships for the rest of their life. You can do the same at home.

- 1. Entitlement and Responsibility. Start by helping your child understand they are absolutely entitled to being treated by everyone with kindness and respect. No one has the right to hurt you, be mean to you, or cause you go to school in fear. But equally important, along with this entitlement comes your responsibility to actively take it and stand up for your rights. No one else will do this for you (and parents, you do not want them too)!
- 2. Identify it. While we mainly think of the playground bully, there is much more to it. School bullying is just one way others can treat you in a mean, abusive or controlling manner. It may start with boys calling you names, or girls excluding you. Later it may be your teen boy/girlfriend always wanting to know where you are, what you are doing and who you are texting. Even later it may be your boss harassing you, or your spouse demeaning or hurting you.
- Support and Model. Often parents are the last to know. Make sure your child can and will come to you when they are being hurt or picked on. How? First, learn to listen to your child without judging them or immediately trying to "fix" everything. Learn to just listen. This will pay off huge when they are teens. Second, believe them and take immediate action no matter how small. Next, make sure you are

modeling kind and respectful behavior at home. How do the siblings treat each other? How do mom and dad treat each other? How does "Uncle Joe" treat your kids?

- Skills and Toolkit. It does not work to say "Well just don't let them hurt you!" or "Just hit them really hard once!" Would you ever ask someone to do a job without the right tools and skills? It is never the victim's fault but - we get what we tolerate. If we allow or accept mean treatment, unfortunately there are many people who will take advantage of it. Actively take charge of all your relationships. You need to say and establish from the very start – "This is how I am going to treat you, and this is how I expect you to treat me!" (*Unfortunately, I do not have room in this article for the simple "Four Step" process we teach, but many of the Hartland students have already been taught this skill set. If you want a copy of the Four Steps just email me from our website below!)
- 5. Practice, Practice, Practice. Just like any self-defense technique, you may know and understand what to do, but now you have to practice applying it. This is the essential step that brings it all together! We repeat the "words" and body language of the Four Steps every day and ask the parents to do the same at home. We role play scenarios in class. We train the parents. We ask students to share actual real-life examples and their success stories.

Can you imagine your child not just getting through elementary and middle school bully-free but having only healthy, empowering relationship later in high school, college, at work and when they have a family?





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Notification of Rights Under FERPA

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) affords parents and students over 18 years of age ("eligible students") certain rights with respect to the student's education records. They are:

- 1) The right to inspect and review the student's education records within 45 days of the day the District receives a request for access.
 - a. Parents or eligible students should submit to the school principal [or appropriate school official] a written request that identifies the record(s) they wish to inspect. The principal will make arrangements for access and notify the parent or eligible student of the time and place where the records may be inspected.
- 2) The right to request the amendment of the student's education records that the parent or eligible student believes are inaccurate or misleading.
 - a. Parents or eligible students may ask Hartland Consolidated School District to amend a record that they believe is inaccurate or misleading. They should write the school principal, clearly identify the part of the record they want changed, and specify why it is inaccurate or misleading.
 - b. If the District decides not to amend the record as requested by the parent or eligidal ble student, the District will notify the parent or eligible student of the decision and advise them of their right to a hearing regarding the request for amendment.
 Additional information regarding the hearing procedures will be provided to the parent or eligible student when notified of the right to a hearing.
- The right to consent to disclosures of personally identifiable information contained in the student's education records, except to the extent that FERPA authorizes disclosure without consent.
 - a. One exception which permits disclosure without consent is disclosure to school officials with legitimate educational interests. A school official is a person employed by the District as an administrator, supervisor, instructor, or support staff member (including health or medical staff and law enforcement unit personnel); a person serving on the School Board; a person or company with whom the District has contracted to perform a special task (such as an attorney, auditor, medical consul tant, or therapist); or a parent or student serving on an official committee, such as a disciplinary or grievance committee, or assisting another school official in performing his or her tasks.

- b. A school official has a legitimate educational interest if the official needs to review an education record in order to fulfill his or her professional responsibility.
- c. Upon request, the District discloses education records without consent to officials of another school district in which a student seeks or intends to enroll. [NOTE: FERPA requires a school district to make a reasonable attempt to notify the student of the records request unless it states in its annual notification that it intends to forward records on request.]
- 4) The right to file a complaint with the U.S. Department of Education concerning alleged failures by the District to comply with the requirements of FERPA. The name and address of the Office that administers FERPA is: Family Policy Compliance Office; U.S. Department of Education; 600 Independence Avenue, SW; Washington, DC 20202-4605

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 provides that the following "directory information" may be released upon request: student's name, date of birth, phone number, address and/or email, parent name(s), school of attendance, school photographs or videos of students participating in school activities, events or programs, picture(s), video(s), publication of student picture(s), personally identifiable artwork, school activity group(s), participation in officially recognized activities and sports, height and weight if member of an athletic team, dates of attendance, date of graduation, awards received, honor rolls, scholarships, telephone numbers for inclusion in school of PTO directories.

In order to comply with this legislation, the district requests that parents, emancipated minors and those students 18 years of age and over, who do NOT wish release of this information, mail or personally submit an Opt-Out form to the building principal or Assistant Superintendent of Personnel and Student Services, Hartland Consolidated Schools, 9525 E Highland Road, Howell, MI 48843 by October 1st of the new school year. Opt-Out Forms are available in each school office and at Central Office upon request.

List of common uses for disclosing names, photographs and other "directory information:" School newsletter, teacher newsletter, PTO newsletter, school website, social media (Facebook, Twitter, and other mediums), video kiosk, bulletin boards, school yearbook, athletic programs, graduation program, playbill (drama production), student-of-the-month recognition, clubs and extra-curricular programs.

HCS ASBESTOS HAZARD EMERGENCY RESPONSE ACT (AHERA) 2021 NOTIFICATION

The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) requires that each year, district workers and building occupants receive notification about asbestos activities such as response actions and inspections. The purpose of this correspondence is to meet those requirements and familiarize you with the asbestos related activities that have been conducted in Hartland Consolidated Schools during the last year.

MANAGEMENT PLANS: In 1988, Hartland Consolidated Schools contracted with Trust Thermal Systems, to conduct inspections for asbestos containing material (ACM) within all district owned buildings. These Management Plans are available for review in

the administrative office of each building. An electronic copy of each building management plan is also located in the Maintenance and Operations office.

SURVEILLANCE ACTIVITIES: The AHERA regulation requires surveillance of the condition of ACM every six months and Reinspections every three years. The Three-Year Reinspection within each of our buildings was conducted in December of 2018. The next Reinspection will be conducted in November of 2021. The last periodic surveillance was conducted in May of 2019. All of these surveillance activities will be included as part of the building's Management Plans.

ASBESTOS ABATEMENT: During the past year there were minor abatement at various buildings in the district. All documentation regarding past and future asbestos abatement projects are available to be viewed electronically, for access please contact the designated person at the Maintenance and Operations Office. Air tests will be conducted throughout all phases of the future asbestos removal projects at each building. The air samples will be collected and analyzed in accordance with all regulatory agency requirements.

Advisory To All Parents Regarding Integrated Pest Management

Hartland Consolidated Schools has adopted an Integrated Pest Management program. Inherent with this are the District's efforts to reduce pesticide use as much as possible. While it may occasionally be necessary to apply a pesticide, these will only be used as a last resort. This program does not rely on routine pesticide applications to resolve problems. We use various techniques such as habitat alteration, sanitation, mechanical means, exclusion, etc. to prevent pest from becoming a problem. You will receive advanced notice of the application of a pesticide, other than bait or gel formulations at your child's school. This advance notice of the application will be given 48 hours before the application. The law requires us to do this notification by using two methods. The first method required by the law is the

posting at the primary entrances to your child's school. The entrances that will be posted are those entrances that have a sidewalk that leads directly to a parking lot. The second method we are going to use is the posting in a common area located by the main office of the school. Parents are also entitled to receive this notice by first-class United States mail postmarked at least 3 days before the application. If you would like to be notified by mail or e-mail please contact the Operations Department at (810) 626-2185. Please give the office your name, mailing address and what school your child attends. In an emergency (for example, bees nest), pesticides may be applied without prior notice, but you will be provided notice following any such application. You may review our IPM program or pesticide application

records for your child's school by calling or e-mailing Matt Marino the District's Director of Operations at (810) 626-2185 e-mail at mattmarino@ hartlandschools.us. This number or e-mail may also be used when school is not in regular session.
