Kindergarten Enrollment for 2022-23 Online enrollment via hartlandschools.us has started!



The online process allows for the following required documents to be uploaded:

- Birth certificate-a copy for school records.
- Immunization records with proof of DTP, Polio, MMR, Hepatitis B, Chicken Pox vaccines (or proof of having illness), and a vision screening, plus copy of same for school records.
- Proof of residency using one of the following: certificate of occupancy, purchase agreement, builder's permit, rent receipt or agreement, mortgage statement/receipt, voter registration card, utility bill or driver's license.

Children are eligible for enrollment in Kindergarten in August 2022 if they will have their 5th birthday on or before September 1st, 2022. A child who turns five after September 1st and before December 1st, 2022 may enroll if parent/legal guardian signs a waiver that is supported by the school district.

A full-day Junior Kindergarten program may be offered. A minimum number of students are required for the program to be made available. Parent may need to provide transportation in order to participate. The age requirements for Junior Kindergarten are the same as for the regular Kindergarten program.

Annual Busing Form Deadline Is June 15, 2022

Our office is open and staff will be available to accept forms and answer any questions you may have throughout the entire summer. Summer hours are 7:30 AM to 3:30 PM.

All busing forms are destroyed at the end of each school year, and new forms are required annually by June 15th to be assured of a seat on the proper bus. Each year your student will be assigned to your home address unless a new form is submitted.

Who needs a busing form?

- Students who are using a stop **other than their home stop** for morning or afternoon, or both morning and afternoon (Alternate Destination form).
- · School of Choice students (School of Choice form).
- Students whose parents live in separate homes within the district (Joint Custody form).

If your student rides to-and-from school to the stop location nearest to your home, no form is needed.

All forms can be found at www.hartlandschools.us/Departments/Transportation/Forms. Postcards will be mailed home a week before school starts with each student's bus information. If you have any questions, please give our office a call.

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





We have had an amazing school at Round Elementary!




I would like to thank the teachers, administrators, and other school employees for their commitment to our students and families. I have been amazed by our collective strength and dedication to our families and students.

Please let me know if you need anything. We have many community support services available. We are here to help.





WHY GRADES ARE IMPORTANT

(Find out why grades are an indicator of your child's future)

As parents we all want our kids to get good grades in school, right?

But why?





you should leave your IRA to your Trust with the Secure Act

Preparing for retirement and thinking about your financial means is very important and is something that you should decide upon as well invest in at your earliest convenience. In recent months, a new bill was passed that helps everybody find a way to financially save for their retirement and future without needing any extra support in the future. This is called the SECURE Act.

What is the SECURE Act?

The Setting Every Community Up for Retirement Enhancement (SECURE) Act was signed into law by President Trump on December 22, 2019. It has a lot of focus surrounding financial ownership and investment for the future and being able to sustain a lifestyle that you have grown accustomed to. It also covers the grey area that may have been highlighted when it comes to your IRA. Much more significantly, SECURE eliminates the 'stretch' provision for IRAs inherited by most non spouse beneficiaries. Under the prior rules, if a non spouse IRA beneficiary for example a child or grandchild was named, the beneficiary could take distributions from the inherited IRA over their life expectancy. This helps in terms of tax implications.

Things to note

You cannot put your IRA in a trust while you are living. You can, however, name a trust as the beneficiary of your IRA and then also be able to dictate how the assets are to be handled after your death. Whatever you decide, it applies to all types of IRAs, including traditional, Roth, SEP, and SIMPLE IRAs. If you establish a trust as part of your estate plan and want to include your IRA assets, it is important to consider the characteristics of an IRA and tax consequences associated with certain transactions.

The three reasons why you should leave your IRA to your trust

Here are three reasons why it could be worthwhile and beneficial for you to leave your IRA to your trust. These include:

Contro

The main reason to go with a trust as your IRA beneficiary is control. A trust allows control from the grave over IRA funds. In some situations, there are smart reasons to seek control. This is especially noted if the intended beneficial are children or a disabled person. A trust will give you the control of the IRA funds for their benefit long after you have gone.

If the beneficiary is a minor

Another major reason would be if the intended beneficiary you have is going to be a minor. Minors are not able to make tax elections like IRA distribution decisions or direct investment choices.

If you get married again

A trust can be a good choice in second marriages where you want to control the ultimate disposition of your IRA in terms of who has the funds. You may want to leave your spouse the annual IRA income, but after your spouse's death you may want to make sure that the IRA goes to your children which might have been conceived during your first marriage.

Hopefully this has given you more clarity on leaving an IRA to your trust and using the SECURE act for your benefit.





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
