

New bike repair station at Settlers Park! Ever since he was a young boy, Aidan Weaver has liked scouting and bike riding. So

Ever since ne was a young boy, Aldan weaver has liked scouting and bike riding. So when it came time to develop a proposal for his Eagle Scout project, he knew that he wanted to do something bicycle related. He discussed ideas with his youth group leader at church, Tom Hermann, who is a member of Motor City Mountain Biking Association and has been instrumental in creating the challenging mountain bike trails at Settlers Park in Hartland. Together they decided that the park would benefit from a bicycle repair station.

Aidan, a senior at Hartland High School, presented his proposal to Hartland Township for approval of the project and a land use permit. He then began a bottle and can

drive in order to raise the necessary funds for the project. After several months, he was able to raise enough through the drive and from donations from family and friends to purchase the unit and the necessary supplies to install it.

Aidan led his team of fellow scouts and friends on two separate days—first to install the concrete base and then to install the unit. The bicycle repair station will allow riders at Settlers Park access to the tools needed to, among other things, inflate a flat tire, tighten components, or adjust brakes on their bicycles. The station is located near the bike racks and pavilion at the park, and Aidan hopes that it will be of great use to everyone who visits.

Winter Bus Safety Tips

With the winter months upon us it is always good to review bus stop safety tips to ensure a safe and pleasant trip to school.

At the Bus Stop:

- Allow extra time in the morning to get to your bus on time.
- Wear bright clothing so the bus driver and other motorists can see you in the early morning and late evening.
- Stand a minimum of 10' away from the roadway at the bus stops. Buses and vehicles need extra room to stop when there is snow and ice.
- Dress properly. Winter clothing, hats, mittens and boots will help keep you warm.

Waiting at the Bus Stop:

- Don't play in the snow/ice, or throw snowballs while waiting for the bus.
- Don't push or shove while loading the bus, and always use the handrail.

Boarding and Exiting:

- Accompany your student whenever possible.
- The area at the bus stop may not be maintained for the weather. Icy conditions increase the risk of sliding into the street or getting hurt.
- **Running Late in the Morning:**
 - Never try to catch the bus at another stop with your vehicle if your students miss their pick-up. Take them all the way to school or call the Transportation office. Communication with the bus driver is critical in this situation. The bus driver may not see late students running to board while in the danger zone.

We had some fun Halloween celebrations at Lakes on Oct. 29!







First semester is ending swiftly. Some families are wondering how best to help their MS or HS students with wrapping up course requirements?

Try any of the following. All of the strategies can be implemented immediately, and can help a strong student see more success or a struggling student, not only make progress in a course, but help future semesters with lifelong approaches to learning.

Teach multiple ways to prioritize your student's goal.

Your student's goal: Find an organizational strategy that works best for your student's needs and/or skills.

- Example: Projects can be organized by due date, time needed to complete, or how difficult the subject is for the student.
- There is always a tendency for someone to suggest the organization strategy that works best for that adult. Remember if the method is not showing success, or the student struggles will the suggestion, he or she could benefit from a different approach for designing.

Teach your child how to chunk their goal.

Your student's goal: Keep looming deadlines, or the feelings of being overwhelmed, from happening.

Example: Break research papers, novels, semester projects, etc into more manageable chunks. The tasks become more reasonable when they are tackled in tinier pieces.

 Often teenagers just see "too many" or "too large" of assignments to even know where to begin. Feeling overwhelmed can lead students to stifled productivity. Sometimes asking if they know "where even to begin" or "how to make the task" smaller, parents can determine if their student struggles with how to chunk.

Ask about the plan of attack for your student's goal.

Your student's goal: Have a plan to end the semester with the grades/credit they want.

- Example: It seems logical that a teenager would know how and when to complete and submit school work; however this is not always the case.
- Ask for an explanation of his or her plan. Ask for weekly check-ins. Consider making a comparison between your check-ins and "real life" or career situations like foremen, supervisors, or project managers checking with their workers for efficiency and to ensure the job is completed on time.




