Kindergarten Enrollment for 2022-23 Online enrollment available beginning February 2022 via the website hartlandschools.us



A Kindergarten Orientation will be held on Saturday, February 5, 2022, from 10 to 11:30 AM at the Hartland Educational Support Service Center building at 9525 E. Highland Road.

The online process allows for the following required documents to be uploaded:

- Birth certificate—a copy for school records.
- Immunization records with proof of DTP, Polio, MMR, Hepatitis B, Chicken Pox vaccines (or proof of having illness), and a vision screening, plus copy of same for school records.
- Proof of residency using one of the following: certificate of occupancy, purchase agreement, builder's
 permit, rent receipt or agreement, mortgage statement/receipt, voter registration card, utility bill or
 driver's license.

Children are eligible for enrollment in Kindergarten in August 2022 if they will have their 5th birthday on or before September 1st, 2022. A child who turns five after September 1st and before December 1st, 2022 may enroll if parent/legal guardian signs a waiver that is supported by the school district.

A full-day Junior Kindergarten program may be offered. A minimum number of students are required for the program to be made available. Parent may need to provide transportation in order to participate. The age requirements for Junior Kindergarten are the same as for the regular Kindergarten program.

Are you unintentionally crippling your child?

We have amazing educators in our county. Recently, I exchanged a series of emails with a local elementary school teacher on the topic of children today. In one of his emails, he said "parents are afraid to let their kids do things on their own which has crippled them emotionally." I wanted to share my response below:

Dear Mr.

I totally agree! It became clear to me a long time ago—We really do not teach karate here

One of the things I spend a crazy amount of time on is helping "train" young parents. They cannot help it. They just do not know any better. I often try to help them understand how they (using your words) "cripple" their children emotionally by giving them a few examples. I ask—"Do you ever remember your mother setting up 'play dates" when you were young?" I also point to the "everyone getting a trophy" and the College Admissions Scandal.

So, what is the solution? I think we have to go back to the root cause of why we are in this mess in the first place. (And I think it is getting worse.) It is because of the "limiting emotional experiences" many children see every day since birth because of "lawnmower" and "snow-plow" parenting. Adding on to this is the more recent isolation, fear and stress of the Covid pandemic. But at this dojo we actually see a group of kids who do not seem to have the same emotional deficiencies and weaknesses—children of very large families! We have had many large Finnish and homeschooled families with five or more kids. Why is it they do not have the same emotional weaknesses? Their children seem to have all the SEL skills and strength in abundance!

So back to the solution. The premise of our thinking is that we have to "undo" the limiting emotional experiences of children by giving them positive intense emotional counter-experiences.



I think this is very hard to do just intellectually but easy to do emotionally. I will give you one of many examples of how we are able to do this in our classes at the dojo. I intentionally teach our students (starting in 1st grade) way too much material way too fast so that they cannot possibly learn it. I do this because I want to set up a situation and experience where they struggle and fail all the time, creating an intentional "failure rich" environment. I like to use the saying to our parents "I am not teaching your child to perfection, I am teaching them to fail." When you get knocked down and get right back up YOU GET STRONGER.

So, the kids who have been with us for a while are very use to this. This is a "normal" emotional state and good stressor at the dojo. They actually get so strong emotionally I have to constantly work hard to come up with innovative ways to make them struggle. I will throw a last minute twist or completely new technique at them just before the test and yell "You have two minutes to figure it out!" One thing I love doing to first time testing students is have their more experienced classmate go first and do something in the test the new students have never been taught before. They suddenly realize on their own they have to learn it on the spot just by listening and observing. You should see the look on their faces when they realize they have to do something they have never learned in mere minutes.

This stress is on purpose. This is the "good" emotional stress they need much more of but their parents are unknowingly shielding and protecting them from. It is amazing to watch kids not only get back up after failing but get back up even more determined and motivated. This develops confidence, courage, independence and resourcefulness. They become unstoppable. The look in their eyes is powerful and awe inspiring.

Sorry this email is getting so long, but we cannot help but get very passionate about this cause.






