This year the district crafted a new Parent Perception Survey. We wanted to assess the state of our schools as we have heard from a few voices that the district is not meeting the needs of the community's parents. I am sharing some of the results below as they pertain to what we have heard.

- Q: Based on your experience with this school, what letter Grade would you give it?
- A: 91% of parents give their school an A or B.
- Q: The school treats my student with respect.
- A: 95% of parents Strongly Agree or Agree.
- Q: The school is an inviting and welcoming place for my student to learn.
- A: 90% of parents Strongly Agree or Agree.
- Q: The school is a safe place for my child.
- A: 87% of parents Strongly Agree or Agree.
- Q: I value my school's effort at teaching my student(s) social-emotional skills.
- A: 91% of JK-4 parents Strongly Agree or Agree, 82% of 5-8 parents Strongly Agree or Agree), and 76% of 9-12 parents Strongly Agree or Agree.
- Q: The school has adults that care about my student.
- A: 92% of parents Strongly Agree or Agree.
- Q: My student has experienced racial/ethnic conflict among students in this school.
- A: 4% of JK-4 parents Strongly Agree or Agree, 9.6% of 5-8 parents Strongly Agree or Agree, and 14.8% of 9-12 parents Strongly Agree or Agree.

Each school will review their individual survey data and develop improvement plans which will be supported by the district. A current district goal is to continue evaluating all policies, procedures, or practices to ensure that every student and adult has an opportunity to fully engage in all that the district has to offer. Policies, procedures and practices cannot be a detriment to the success of children and staff. We will continue to focus on early and consistent intervention where needed. I wish to thank the 1,537 families that responded to the 2021-22 Parent Perception Survey. Your input is invaluable to the continued success of the Hartland Schools.



Kindergarten Enrollment for 2022-23 Online enrollment via hartlandschools.us has started!



The online process allows for the following required documents to be uploaded:

- · Birth certificate-a copy for school records.
- Immunization records with proof of DTP, Polio, MMR, Hepatitis B, Chicken Pox vaccines (or proof of having illness), and a vision screening, plus copy of same for school records.
- Proof of residency using one of the following: certificate of occupancy, purchase agreement, builder's permit, rent receipt or agreement, mortgage statement/receipt, voter registration card, utility bill or driver's license.

Children are eligible for enrollment in Kindergarten in August 2022 if they will have their 5th birthday on or before September 1st, 2022. A child who turns five after September 1st and before December 1st, 2022 may enroll if parent/legal guardian signs a waiver that is supported by the school district.

A full-day Junior Kindergarten program may be offered. A minimum number of students are required for the program to be made available. Parent may need to provide transportation in order to participate. The age requirements for Junior Kindergarten are the same as for the regular Kindergarten program.



All transportation forms (Alternate Destination, Joint Custody, School of Choice, and Legacy forms) will expire at the end of the 21/22 school year. The deadline for submitting forms to the Transportation Office to request a bus assignment other than the home address is June 15, 2022. Late transportation requests will not be considered until after the first 2 weeks of school.

We are very excited about our "BookNook." It changes and becomes more special every day. Do stop by with your family and check us out.


