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Superintendent's Corner

Here comes Thanksgiving. I am always grateful to have this special day set aside to spend time with family and friends. It is essential that we take the time to reflect on how wonderful it is to live, work, and play with those we love, and to acknowledge the things we are thankful for having and experiencing.

Each year I share the process used when determining if the district should have a "snow day" or not. Much goes into this decision. Please take some time to read the District Snow Day Procedures found in this Community Life edition and maybe sign-up to follow HCS on Twitter @hartlandschools. If you wish to be one of the first to be notified, Twitter is the place to be. Periodically I post important information on our Twitter account. You might also create a bookmark for our main website at www.hartlandschools.us where we try to post this information as quickly as possible.

I would like to once again thank our parents and community for your continued support as we navigate yet another difficult and challenging school year. Without your support we would not be able to continue moving forward in the education of our children.

District Snow Day Procedures

With winter approaching, you may wish to set aside the following "snow day" process:

Step 1: Superintendent and Director of Operations & Transportation pay attention to weather condition predictions for the following morning. If bad weather is not predicted, end process and sleep well. If bad weather is predicted go to Step 2.

Step 2: The Superintendent and Director of Operations arrange for bus and vehicle drivers to drive the roads around Hartland starting at about 3:30 AM to assess conditions. The Superintendent and Director of Operations start communicating with each other, along with surrounding district transportation directors and superintendents, possibly the County Road Commission, and local law enforcement to assess road conditions with safety in mind. There is an effort to decide by 5:30 AM. If roads are deemed too poor to travel, go to Step 3. If roads are deemed okay to travel, go to Step 6.

Step 3: The Superintendent makes the call to have a "Snow Day" and communicates with the Director of Community Education to determine if the Child Care Center should remain open for business. Go to Step 4.

Step 4: Once a snow day has been called and the question of child care operations has been agreed upon, the Superintendent will contact the administrative team to inform the local radio station (WHMI), Detroit area television stations, **Facebook** (@hartlandconsolidatedschools), **Twitter** (join @Hartlandschools to get the fastest notice), the **district website** www.hartlandschools.us, and send out phone calls and text messages to announce that the district has called a snow day. All district events are cancelled and buildings are closed for the morning.

Step 5: Between 11 AM and 12 PM on the snow day, the Superintendent, Director of Operations, Athletic Director, Director of Community Education and High School Principal determine what, if any, events will be open for the afternoon at the High School and Educational Support Service Center. All other buildings (not including the Child Care Center) are shut down until the following morning without exception to give our employees an opportunity to clear sidewalks, driveways, and parking lots in preparation to reopen the following day.

Step 6: The Superintendent and other staff think twice about answering the phones to avoid debate about whether the decision was a good one or bad one. These calls are usually 50/50.

Board of Education Updates

We want to thank the community for supporting our efforts at providing the best educational environment possible for our students. The 2020 Bond projects will continue over the next few years. You will see work begin on the Auxiliary Stadium sometime soon and will see the Robotics Center going up if you drive to the back of the Hartland Educational Support Service Center (north of the Senior Center). Our Elementary Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM) centers are up and running in each building. We understand that this new essential has been received well by the students.

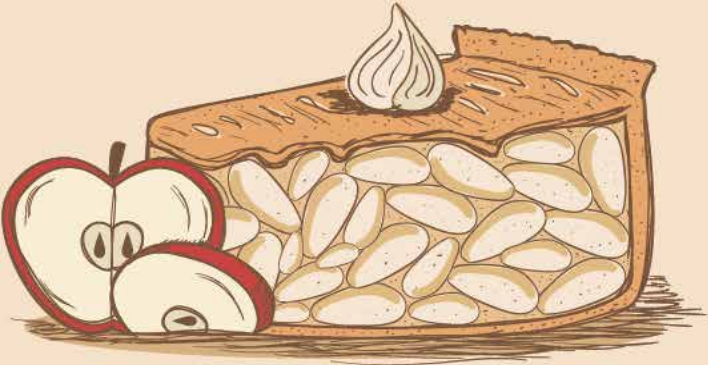

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School Bus Safety

DANGER ZONES AROUND THE SCHOOL BUS

- The “Danger Zone” is the area surrounding the bus where it’s difficult to see children in the bus mirrors.
- The “Danger Zone” is also 20 feet in front, 10 feet behind and 10 feet on each side of the school bus.

LOADING/UNLOADING SAFELY

- STAY on your own side of the road – 10 feet from the roadway, in a single row.
- WAIT until the bus has come to a complete stop, the red overhead lights are activated, and the DRIVER DISPLAYS THE YELLOW SAFETY SIGNAL.
- When crossing the road, CHECK traffic both ways – then check again and walk 10 feet in front of the bus.
- NEVER stop to pick-up anything on the ground.

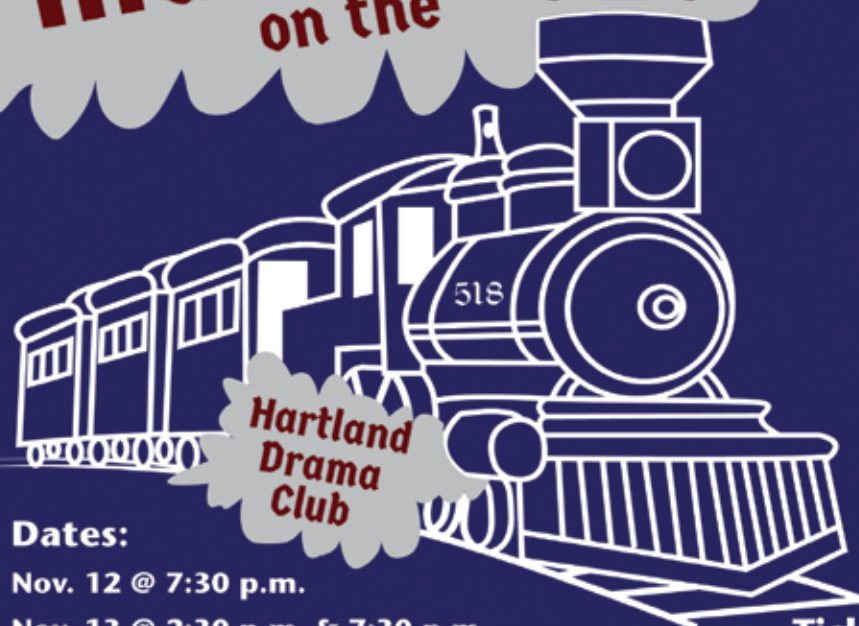

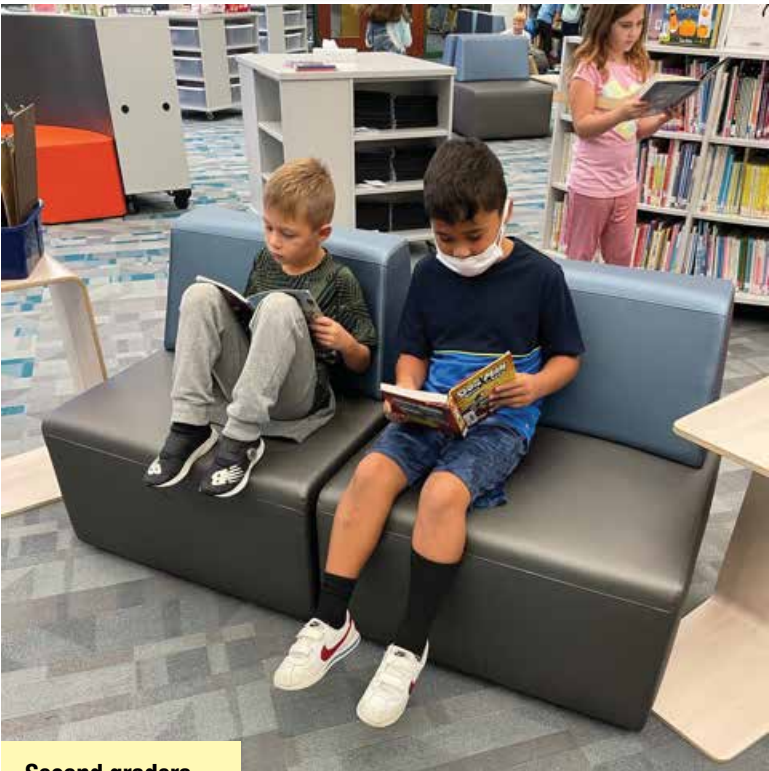

Sensory activities are a huge component in our preschool classrooms on a daily basis! There is so much to be gained from sensory play! To a lot of parents it might just seem like messy play that causes a lot of cleanup--but the benefits are more than worth it. A simple sensory activity is proven to help stimulate social and emotional development; fine motor skills, language development and even cognitive development. Allowing your child time to play with sensory activities doesn't always have to be messy painting and slime (although those are fun, too!). Next time, try a tub or two of playdough with a couple tools, a small bin of sand or rice with puzzle pieces or plastic animals hidden inside, or even "washing" toys with a sponge and some soapy water. They are activities that you will find every day in our preschool classrooms, and we encourage you to try them at home to see even greater benefits for your little ones!

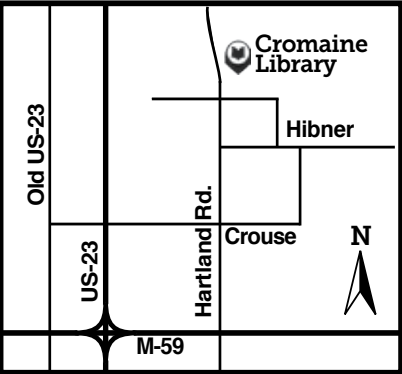

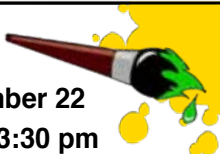

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WHY GRADES ARE IMPORTANT

(Find out why grades are an indicator of your child’s future)

As parents we all want our kids to get good grades in school, right?

But why?

I am Sam Larioza, a father of two awesome kids and owner of Ohana Karate. Over the last 16 years we have helped hundreds of parents in our community raise their children. Many have underestimated the importance of their kid’s grades in school.

Here is the secret: **How a child performs in school sets in place the habits, attitudes and character traits they will carry into young adulthood and have for the rest of their lives!**

Parents find this story helpful in understanding this concept: **“There are 3 types of people in this world”**

So, which group is your child in? You are probably thinking “This is all fine and good but what can you do?:

Here is the key: **We are all products of our life experiences!** And right now your child’s biggest life experience is coming from school! They spend 7 hours a day, 5 days a week there! Every single decision and act they do at school develops their attitudes and most of all their **HABITS!**

I am running out of space, but here are 3 tips our parents use:

1. **“Open the envelope.”** You need to open the letter containing their report card and know their grade in every single class. Better yet, go online and know their grades all the time and let them know that you do!
2. **“Never, ever miss a parent-teacher conference.”** Parents will skip the conference because they know their kids are doing “okay” or they have more important things to do. Never, ever miss one. Ever!
3. **“Make grades important to you.”** Grades must be important to you. Both #1 and #2 do this but you need to take one step further. Don’t nag your child but talk about school and grades all the time.

Grades are important to us! We talk about school and grades all the time. We require every student to turn their report cards in to us. If you need any more tips or help with your child’s performance in school give me a call or email. You do not need to be a student at our karate school. We just want to help every child in our community. It makes all of us better!

End of Community Council?

After 85 years of serving the community, Hartland Area Community Council (HACC) is struggling to attract sufficient volunteers to continue operations. Even prior to Covid, finding volunteers for community projects was difficult. Community Council provides leadership for and/or sponsors projects such as the Memorial Day Parade, street banners, Christmas decorations in the village and holiday wreaths for veterans’ graves in the cemetery. Only five volunteers attended our meeting in early October 2021 at Ore Creek school.

First suggested back in 1935 by J. Robert Crouse as part of the overall Hartland Area Project, HACC has been responsible for many area improvements such as BBQ’s, benches, tables and playground equipment in Epley Park. In 2002, HACC initiated a Neighborhood Watch program with signage in the settlement area. In 2003 a Walkability study was initiated, leading to the three-way stop, with plantings, at Maple and Avon, as well as the crosswalk striping in the village area (and now a Township initiative improving walkability along M-59, Hartland Road and other areas). HACC hosted the first meeting of the Hartland Consolidated Schools, Crounse Library and Hartland Township representatives to encourage these groups to work together to enrich Hartland for its residents. This group with the addition of the Hartland Area Chamber of Commerce is now known as Partners in Progress.

As Community Council struggles to continue operations, two additional meetings have been scheduled for this year, Monday November 1st and Monday December 6th, 2021. Both meetings are scheduled to begin at 6:30 PM and will be held in the Media Center of Hartland Middle School at Ore Creek. If you think Community Council should continue its operations and services to the community, attend these meeting to show your support and encouragement; the ongoing support of about 25 volunteers is necessary. This may be the last chance to continue the great work of Community Council’s projects including the Memorial Day Parade.

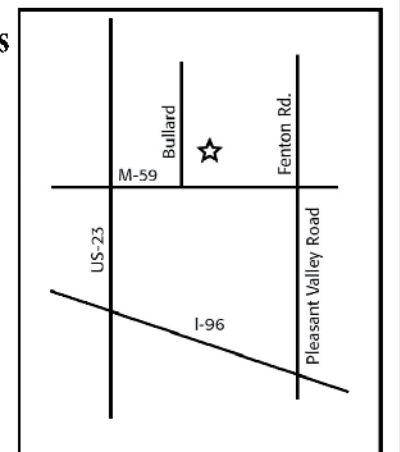
