We are pleased to announce that our efforts to keep school in session last year has shown positive results. Our students (93% of all eligible standardized test takers) outperformed state and county averages across the board. While we

anticipated that the percentages of proficiency would drop, and they did, we are pleased with the fact that our children demonstrated their growth as they did. We want to thank our students, parents, community, and staff for embracing the challenges and ensuring that students were always put first. As a community we must continue to work through our differences for the education of our children.

I attended Western Michigan University where I received my Bachelor of Science in Elementary Education with a secondary focus on math and science. Later, I attended Madonna University where I received my Master's in teaching Autism Spectrum Disorder to ensure I was meeting the needs of all students.

I live with my family in Milford. My husband, Kyle, and I have two kids, James (9) and Noelle (5). Both of my children began their education by attending Hartland Schools 3 and 4-yearold preschool programs. Hartland Preschool provided my children with a solid foundation to begin their elementary education. We also have two dogs. Lucy is a German Shorthair/ Irish Setter that we adopted 11 years ago after a Hartland staff member sent an email looking to find homes for her puppies. Our most recent addition is Gracie, a Potcake who came from Turks and Caicos. She was rescued from a dumpster by Potcake Place Rescue, where Kyle and I later met her on vacation. She was later transported by a private courier to New York where we drove to pick her up. I'm grateful to have a full house and there is rarely a lack of excitement.

My most memorable moments are when students come back to visit me. I've always believed that each day is a new day, and to never hold on to mistakes. Every day was a fresh start for my students, and I never gave up on them. Because of this, I've made some great connections with students. The best experience was when a student came back and said that he never really liked math until my class and because of that he was now in school to become an aerospace engineer. You just never know when the right connection can completely change someone's life.

My first year of teaching was at a charter school and I barely made it through the year. Afterward, I believed the teaching field was not for me. However, the following fall, I was asked to fill in for a long-term sub position at the middle school and fell in love with teaching again. I found that it wasn't the teaching field that was not right for me, but that I needed to find the right district. As soon as you start working at Hartland Schools you become part of a family, and I couldn't imagine another district treating me so well.

I truly believe that Hartland Schools provides our staff and students with a safe learning environment where growth and learning are endless. I am thankful for the opportunity to work for Hartland Schools.







- ☑ Rita, age 11, used to be confident...ready to take on the world. But after starting middle school, she seems like a different person—hesitant and unsure of herself.






