Kindergarten Enrollment for 2023-24

Online enrollment open via the website www.hartlandschools.us

The online enrollment process allows for the following **required** documents to be uploaded:

- Birth certificate
- Immunization records with proof of DTP, Polio, MMR, Hepatitis B and Chicken Pox vaccines (or proof of having illness) and a vision screening
- Proof of residency using one of the following: certificate of occupancy, purchase agreement, builder's permit, rent receipt or agreement, mortgage statement/receipt, voter registration card, utility bill or driver's license

Children are eligible for enrollment in kindergarten in August 2023 if they will have their fifth (5th) birthday on or before September 1st, 2023. A child who turns five after September 1st and before December 1st, 2023 may enroll if parent/legal guardian signs a waiver that is supported by the school district.

A full-day Junior Kindergarten program may be offered. A minimum number of students are required for the program to be made available. Parents may need to provide transportation in order to participate. The age requirements for Junior Kindergarten are the same as for the regular Kindergarten program. Annual Busing Form Deadline
Is June 15, 2023

Our office is open and staff will be available to accept forms and answer any questions you may have throughout the entire summer. Summer hours are 7:30 AM to 3:30 PM.

All busing forms are destroyed at the end of each school year, and new forms are required annually by June 15th to be assured of a seat on the proper bus. Each year your student will be assigned to your home address unless a new form is submitted.

Who needs a busing form?

- Students who are using a stop **other than their home stop** for morning or afternoon, or both morning and afternoon (Alternate Destination form).
- School of Choice students (School of Choice form).
- Students whose parents live in separate homes within the district (Joint Custody form).

If your student rides to-and-from school to the stop location nearest to your home, no form is needed.

All forms can be found at www.hartlandschools.us/Departments/Transportation/Forms. Postcards will be mailed home a week before school starts with each student's bus information. If you have any questions, please give our office a call at 810.626.2175.

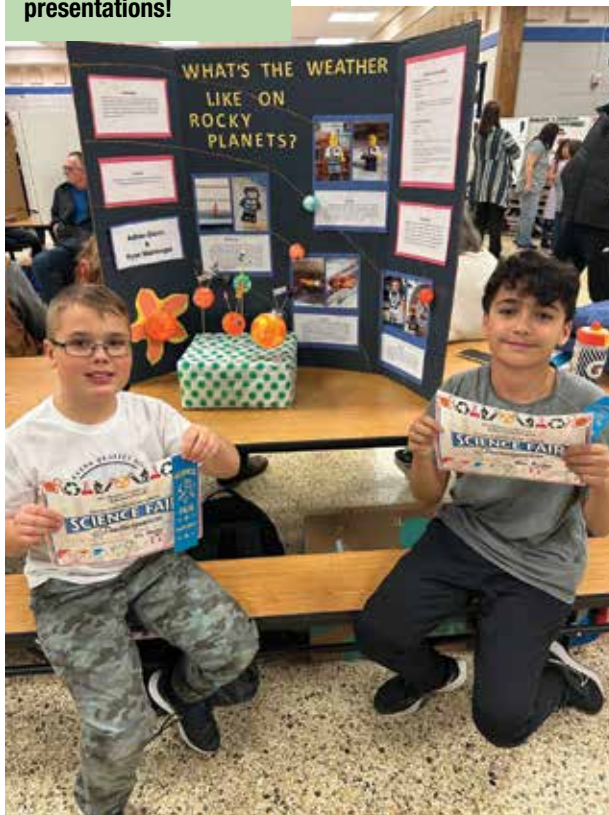

Execute a Power of Attorney - A power of attorney is a legal document that usually goes into effect when the principal can no longer make decisions for themselves and lasts until they pass away. There are two commonly used powers of attorney: the non-durable power of attorney, which deals with finances, and the medical power of attorney. The financial power of attorney designates an individual as agent to make financial decisions on behalf of the principal, who can no longer do so for themselves. This document can provide direction on what accounts a power of attorney can access and how they may be used.

A medical power of attorney grants the agent the same powers the principal would have had if they were still competent to make decisions about their healthcare for themselves.

Having these documents executed before someone begins to decline mentally makes the process easier because there does not need to be court intervention.

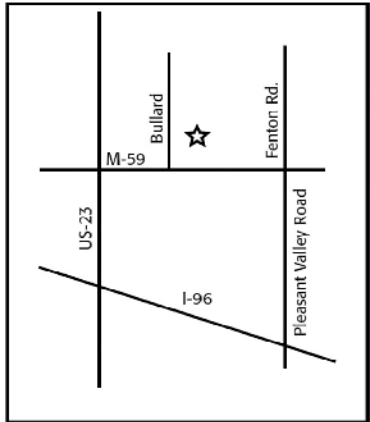
