I would like to wish everyone a safe and peaceful holiday season. As the first semester comes to an end, please remember to learn from our past and create goals for improving our future. I am proud of our staff, students, parents, and community for the endless pursuit of excellence. I believe that we all want what is best for our children, and together we can work to find balance in how we approach the education of the children in Hartland. I am blessed to work in the Hartland Consolidated School District.

2020 Bond Update:

Next summer, multiple facilities will experience upgrades. The high school athletic complex (main stadium, soccer, baseball, and softball) will see much needed improvements. The main stadium will have artificial turf and a new track installed. The soccer stadium will receive a new press box. The softball and baseball fields will see the addition of a restroom facility, press boxes, bleachers, and storage facilities. The high school will experience construction in the media /collaboration center, an elevator refurbishment, and much more. The middle school and intermediate schools will have their collaboration centers renovated. Multiple buildings will see upgrades in the HVAC and control systems to ensure that the environments are conducive to learning. Finally, the high school will see parking lot upgrades in the bus, pool and main staff parking lots along with a reconfiguration of the drop-off and pick-up lane. Winter Bus Safety Tips

With the winter months upon us it is always good to review bus stop safety tips to ensure a safe and pleasant trip to school.

At the Bus Stop:

- Allow extra time in the morning to get to your bus on time.
- Wear bright clothing so the bus driver and other motorists can see you in the early morning and late evening.
- Stand a minimum of 10' away from the roadway at the bus stops. Buses and vehicles need extra room to stop when there is snow and ice.
- Dress properly. Winter clothing, hats, mittens and boots will help keep you warm.

Waiting at the Bus Stop:

- Don't play in the snow/ice, or throw snowballs while waiting for the bus.
- Don't push or shove while loading the bus, and always use the handrail.

Boarding and Exiting:

- Accompany your student whenever possible.
- The area at the bus stop may not be maintained for the weather. Icy conditions increase the risk of sliding into the street or getting hurt.

Running Late in the Morning:

- Never try to catch the bus at another stop with your vehicle if your students miss their pick-up. Take them all the way to school or call the Transportation office. Communication with the bus driver is critical in this situation. The bus driver may not see late students running to board while in the danger zone.
