## Superintendent's Corner

Chuck Hughes, Superintendent



Sometimes people ask me "when is the busiest time of year for a Superintendent?" I usually respond from January through September. The district begins planning for the next school year in January and doesn't take time to slow down a little until around October or November. This work includes scheduling students, staffing buildings, gearing up for

and completing building projects (bond, sinking fund, or capital improvements), ordering supplies and equipment, completing the budget process to close out one year and move into another, etc. All this work is done to ensure that the new year starts with a smooth transition for all involved.

As we move into the new semester, I am asking parents to be cognizant of their children's attendance record. The district is charged with ensuring that students attend school regularly and that we address chronic absence issues. Chronic absence is defined as missing fifteen (15) or more instructional days of school. This issue is important because students who miss this many days of instruction tend to perform at a lower achievement level than students who do not miss school. Parents should be receiving communication from the building administration regarding attendance concerns. In some cases, the district is obligated to report attendance concerns to the county truancy officer. Please help us ensure that your child has the best educational experience possible by attending school regularly.

I wish the best for each of our seniors who are immersed in all the exciting senior activities which will culminate in graduation on June 9th, 2023. Upon graduation, our students will have opportunities to grow beyond their JK-12 experience with the foundation that has been laid during their time with us. I ask that parents keep students focused on the outcome of graduation and remember that guidance is sometimes needed. Together we remain proud and supportive of each Hartland Eagle.

# Kindergarten Enrollment for 2023-24 Online enrollment available beginning February 1st, 2023 via the website hartlandschools.us



A Kindergarten Orientation will be held on Saturday, February 18th, 2023 from 10 AM to 11:30 AM at the HESSC, 9525 Highland Road (former high school on M-59). The orientation will provide parents an opportunity to hear from kindergarten teachers and principals about a "typical" school day and the curriculum. In addition, central office administrators, transportation, student nutrition personnel and the school nurse will be on hand. Parents are welcome to bring their child(ren).

The online process allows for the following  $\underline{\textbf{required}}$  documents to be uploaded:

- Birth certificate
- Immunization records with proof of DTP, Polio, MMR, Hepatitis B and Chicken Pox vaccines (or proof of having illness) and a vision screening
- Proof of residency using one of the following: certificate of occupancy, purchase agreement, builder's permit, rent receipt or agreement, mortgage statement/receipt, voter registration card, utility bill or driver's license

Children are eligible for enrollment in kindergarten in August 2023 if they will have their fifth (5th) birthday on or before September 1st, 2023. A child who turns five after September 1st and before December 1st, 2023 may enroll if parent/legal guardian signs a waiver that is supported by the school district.

A full-day Junior Kindergarten program may be offered. A minimum number of students are required for the program to be made available. Parents may need to provide transportation in order to participate. The age requirements for Junior Kindergarten are the same as for the regular Kindergarten program. # School Bus Safety Running Late to the Bus

**Should my students cross the road before the bus arrives:** All students loading/unloading the bus are required to wait on the same side of the road that they reside on, a minimum of 10 feet off the roadway, and be clearly visible to the bus driver through their front windshield. The bus driver needs to see the student and the student needs to see the bus driver. Students crossing the road must cross in front of the bus and wait for the bus driver to display the safety signal.

What to do if your student misses the bus: Parents should never try to catch up with the bus. Never assume that the bus driver knows that you are following the bus. Your student approaching from the rear of bus puts your student inside the Danger Zone without the driver knowing. You really only have two options at that point: drive your student to school or call transportation to make possible arrangements to take your student to another bus stop. Communication and keeping your student out of the Danger Zone are most important things we can do.

The first snowfall of the season helped Chemistry students with their study of thermal energy.





### 1. Who will raise your children if you can't?

The odds are in your favor here, but there is a chance that something could happen to you and your spouse. If that happens, who will raise your children? Will anyone step up? Will there be a fight among your families about who raises them? You can avoid all of this trauma for your children by naming a guardian in your will. 


