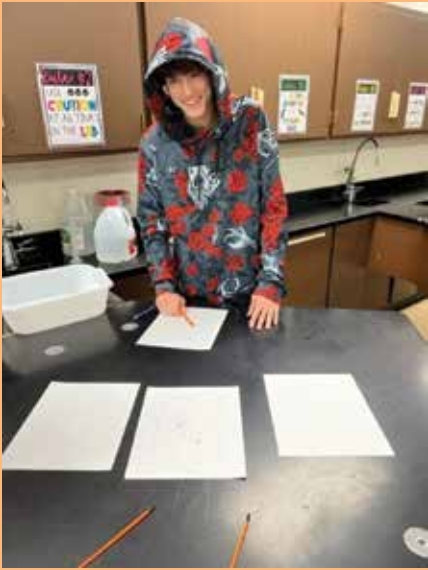
Experimenting in Science

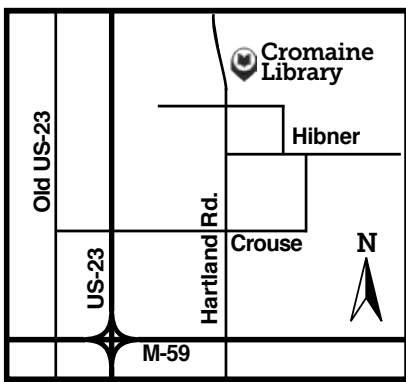

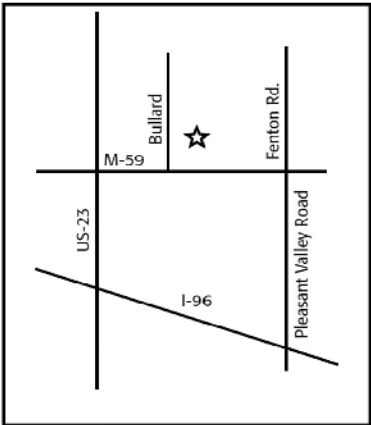
