The 2020 Bond projects are steadily being completed. Our Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math centers at each elementary school are being thoroughly embraced by our students. The Hartland Robotic Center is now home to our innovative and creative high school and middle school teams. The band program has many new instruments and the Hartland Auxiliary Stadium has been hosting extracurricular and recreational activities since late August. Additional projects that are less visible have been completed; such as technology updates, security updates, water and sewer line replacements, HVAC unit replacements, freezers added, new flooring and windows, Senior Center upgrades, etc. Soon the district will begin accepting and reviewing bids for the collaboration centers at Farms, the Middle School, and the High School and additional projects which will be completed during the summer of 2023.


