The Hartland School Board is committed to providing an engaging and safe environment for every child. In the past year, we have added school safety personnel in the form of two Livingston County Sheriff Deputies or School Resource Officers and four School Safety Officers to monitor our school buildings and build relationships with students and staff. We have been working to address all school safety recommendations made to us through a third-party school safety assessment company and continue to collaborate with the Hartland Deerfield Fire Authority to monitor school safety drills and procedures. Secure entries and the new background check software ensures that individuals entering our buildings during the school day are screened before access is granted. We are proud of this work as we focus on the safety of students and staff.





Transportation Information for the 2024–2025 School Year

It's time to start thinking about busing for the new school year. For your convenience, forms are now being accepted to ensure room on every bus to accommodate your transportation needs for the first day of school.

All transportation forms (Alternate Destination, Joint Custody, and School of Choice forms) will expire at the end of the 23/24 school year. If new forms are not submitted, in-district students will automatically be assigned to the closest bus stop to their home address and non-resident students will not receive a bus assignment.

The deadline for submitting forms to the Transportation Office to request a bus assignment other than the home address is June 15, 2024. Late transportation requests will not be considered until after the first two weeks of school.

The Transportation and Central Office staff will be available throughout the summer months if you should have any questions or need assistance.
