Kindergarten Enrollment for 2024-25



A Kindergarten Orientation will be held on Saturday, February 3rd, 2024 from 10 AM to 11:30 AM at the HESSC, 9525 Highland Road (former high school on M-59). The orientation will provide parents an opportunity to hear from kindergarten teachers about a “typical” school day and the kindergarten curriculum. In addition, administrators will be on hand to talk about school safety, bus transportation, school attendance areas, student nutrition, Junior Kindergarten, and answer all questions. The Hartland Lions Club will be sponsoring a free vision screen (Project KIDSight) and a school bus will be on sight for your child to experience.

The online process allows for the following **required** documents to be uploaded:

- Birth certificate—a copy got school records
- Immunization records with proof of DTP, Polio, MMR, Hepatitis B and Chicken Pox vaccines (or proof of having illness) and a vision screening, plus a copy of the same for school records
- Proof of residency using one of the following: certificate of occupancy, purchase agreement, builder’s permit, rent receipt or agreement, mortgage statement/receipt, voter registration card, utility bill or driver’s license

Children are eligible to enroll in kindergarten if they will have their fifth (5th) birthday on or before September 1st, 2024. A child who turns five after September 1st and before December 1st, 2024 may enroll if parent/legal guardian signs a waiver that is supported by the school district. (The waiver is included in the online pre-enrollment documents.)

A full-day Junior Kindergarten program **may** be offered. A minimum number of students are required for the program to be made available. Parents may need to provide transportation in order to participate. The age requirement for Junior Kindergarten is the same as the traditional Kindergarten program. 


Mr. Storey's students learned about enzymes and temperature during a fun experiment.

Environmental Science students studied how ecosystems function, and then created their examples to observe the cycles in the classroom.




Our senior English class tested the validity of their argumentative essay thesis statements.

Kindness Club facilitated a bread drive to support Gleaners Food Bank.






**Winter Bus Safety Tips**

With the winter months upon us it is always good to review bus stop safety tips to ensure a safe and pleasant trip to school.

**At the Bus Stop:**

- Allow extra time in the morning to get to your bus on time.
- Wear bright clothing so the bus driver and other motorists can see you in the early morning and late evening.
- Stand a minimum of 10' away from the roadway at the bus stops. Buses and vehicles need extra room to stop when there is snow and ice.
- Dress properly. Winter clothing, hats, mittens and boots will help keep you warm.

**Waiting at the Bus Stop:**

- Don't play in the snow/ice, or throw snowballs while waiting for the bus.
- Don't push or shove while loading the bus, and always use the handrail.


**Boarding and Exiting:**

- Accompany your student whenever possible.
- The area at the bus stop may not be maintained for the weather. Icy conditions increase the risk of sliding into the street or getting hurt.

**Running Late in the Morning:**

- Never try to catch the bus at another stop with your vehicle if your students miss their pick-up. Take them all the way to school or call the Transportation office. Communication with the bus driver is critical in this situation. The bus driver may not see late students running to board while in the danger zone.






