Congratulations to all our schools for being recognized for outstanding student achievement. The newly established Michigan School Accountability Overview was created with the goal of identifying and supporting struggling schools. There are 4 categories that a school can fall into:

Comprehensive Support Improvement (CSI): The school must engage in partnership agreements with consultants to provide resources to help the school make gains.

Board of Education Happenings

Additional Targeted Supports (ATS): The school will receive state supported assistance and the school will be monitored.

Targeted Supports Improvement (TSI): The school will receive local support and become eligible for state provided support. The school determines their improvement plan and time frame.

Universal: The school meets all targets with no additional supports needed.

Every school building in HCS has been placed in the UNIVERSAL category.

The Michigan Department of Education also recently released grades for student achievement. All HCS school buildings received the highest possible marks.

I received my teaching certification and bachelor's degree from Michigan State University with a major in French and a minor in English. I also have a Master's in Teaching from Marygrove College.

My first teaching job in Hartland was at Farms, in 1998, when it was the Middle School and housed grades 6-8. The following year, Hartland Middle School at Ore Creek opened, and I taught 7th grade English in that building until 2006. During that time, I was part of the curriculum development and school improvement teams, was the 7th grade cheerleading coach, and sponsored the Optimists' oratorical contest. I am currently the English and French teacher at Legacy Alternative High School, where I have been for the past ten years.

Beyond teaching, I have also been actively involved in the district as a parent, volunteering as a PTO board member and classroom helper


when my children went to Round, serving as a Girl Scout leader for 5 years, being part of the District Parent Advisory Committee, and enjoying many events as my children attended Hartland schools. My family moved from Detroit to Hartland when my dad retired from the Detroit Police force. Traveling 23N to his new job, he saw a house for sale in this area. My mom told him that she wouldn't step one foot past 59, which is how we ended up in Hartland! I began school in Hartland in 1988 as a ninth grader. The building I teach in now is where I attended high school and where I met my husband of 25 years, Jess, who is the art teacher at Round Elementary. My children are also Hartland graduates: Claudia in 2021 and Jonathon in 2023. Outside of the classroom, I love reading, spending time with family and friends (and my dog), taking walks, paddle boarding, cheering for the Spartans, and visiting Claudia at CMU.

Kindergarten Enrollment for 2024-25

A Kindergarten Orientation will be held on Saturday, February 3rd, 2024 from 10 to 11:30 AM at the HESSC, 9525 Highland Road (former high school on M-59). The orientation will provide parents an opportunity to hear from kindergarten teachers about a "typical" school day and the kindergarten curriculum. In addition, administrators will be on hand to talk about school safety, bus transportation, school attendance areas, student nutrition, Latchkey, Junior Kindergarten, and answer all questions. The Hartland Lions Club will be sponsoring a free vision screen (Project KIDsight) and a school bus will be on sight for your child to experience.

Parents may begin the online pre-enrollment process beginning February 1st. The following documents are required and may be uploaded as part of the online process:

- Birth certificate- a copy for school records
- Immunization records with proof of DTP, Polio, MMR, Hepatitis B, Chicken Pox vaccines (or proof of having illness), and vision screening, plus copy of same for school records
- Proof of residency using one of the following: certificate of occupancy, purchase agreement, builder's permit, rent receipt or agreement, mortgage statement/receipt, voter registration card, utility bill, driver's license

Children are eligible to enroll in kindergarten if they will have their fifth (5th) birthday on or before September 1, 2024. A child who turns five after September 1st and before December 1, 2024 may enroll if parent/legal guardian signs a waiver that is supported by the school district. (Waiver is included in the online pre-enrollment documents.)

A full-day Junior Kindergarten program may be offered. A minimum number of students are required for the program to be made available. Parents may need to provide transportation in order to participate. The age requirement for Junior Kindergarten is the same as the traditional Kindergarten program. 

Celebrating 21st Century Academic Achievement

Hartland Virtual Academy offers students a flexible option to complete their education. Students can take care of school work from a location and time of their choosing. Like their in-person counterparts, our students have the same rigorous curriculum demands provided in the Michigan academic standards. In addition to this, our students have to navigate their learning asynchronously. This requires a lot of self-direction and independence.

Virtual learning helps students build skills that will benefit them when they join the workforce after graduation. They need to know how to communicate effectively via email when they reach out to their instructors. They have to problem-solve when things aren't working as planned. Because they don't have a class schedule or passing times to regulate their day, they need to be able to manage their workload and their time. They need to recognize when they are legitimately stuck and feel confident enough to advocate for themselves.

Communication, problem-solving, self-management and the ability to advocate are robust skills every adult needs to be successful in their career paths. It is also why we are extremely proud of our virtual eagles that capitalize on these skills while excelling in their learning. We congratulate them on their outstanding academic performance.
