I graduated from Central Michigan University in 2012 with a bachelor's degree in Elementary Education, Special Education with an emphasis in Cognitive Impairments, and a minor in Reading in the Elementary Grades. In 2016, I earned a master's degree in reading from Marygrove College. I

started at Farms Intermediate School in January of 2014 as the Extended Resource Room Teacher. In 2023, I transitioned to teaching in the Resource Room.

I have attended county-wide Autism trainings with emphasis on facilitating and implementing Peer-to-Peer programs, implementation and transition planning for students, using universal supports for students with Autism Spectrum Disorder, and using assessment tools to support learning and teaching.

I am a member of the Response to Intervention Team. This team focuses on providing and implementing interventions to help students succeed in the general education setting. I have also been a member of the Instructional Consultation Team with the intention of working shoulder to shoulder with colleagues to make the instructional match for all students. I am also a member of the Free and Appropriate Education and Least Restrictive Environment committees to promote inclusion of students with special needs in the general education setting.

Kindergarten Enrollment for 2024-25



A Kindergarten Orientation will be held on Saturday, February 3rd, 2024 from 10 to 11:30 AM at the HESSC, 9525 Highland Road (former high school on M-59). The orientation will provide parents an opportunity to hear from kindergarten teachers about a “typical” school day and the kindergarten curriculum. In addition, administrators will be on hand to talk about school safety, bus transportation, school attendance areas, student nutrition, Junior Kindergarten, and answer all questions. The Hartland Lions Club will be sponsoring a free vision screen (Project KIDSight) and a school bus will be on sight for your child to experience.

- Parents may begin the online pre-enrollment process beginning February 1st. The following documents are required and may be uploaded as part of the online process:
- Birth certificate- a copy for school records
 - Immunization records with proof of DTP, Polio, MMR, Hepatitis B, Chicken Pox vaccines (or proof of having illness), and vision screening, plus copy of same for school records
 - Proof of residency using one of the following: certificate of occupancy, purchase agreement, builder’s permit, rent receipt or agreement, mortgage statement/receipt, voter registration card, utility bill, driver’s license

Children are eligible to enroll in kindergarten if they will have their fifth (5th) birthday on or before September 1, 2024. A child who turns five after September 1st and before December 1, 2024 may enroll if parent/legal guardian signs a waiver that is supported by the school district. (Waiver is included in the online pre-enrollment documents.)

A full-day Junior Kindergarten program may be offered. A minimum number of students are required for the program to be made available. Parents may need to provide transportation in order to participate. The age requirement for Junior Kindergarten is the same as the traditional Kindergarten program. 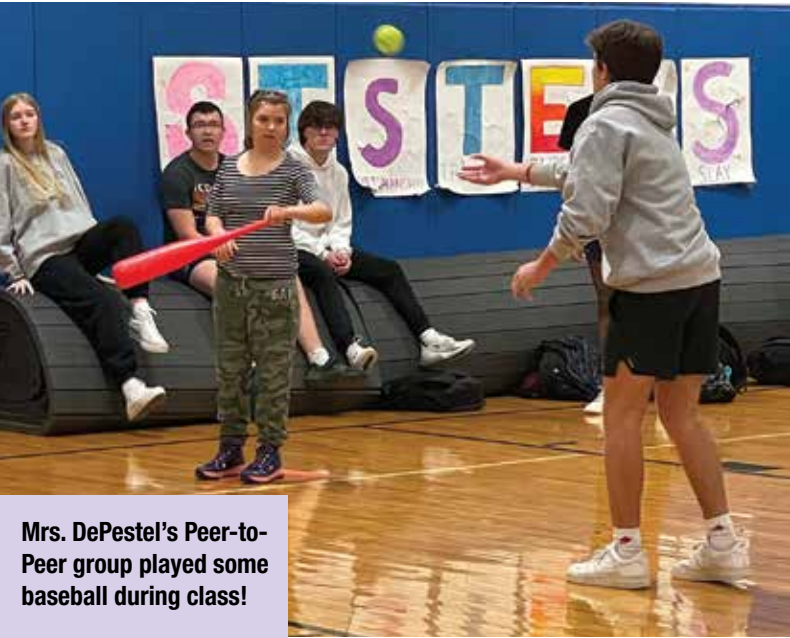

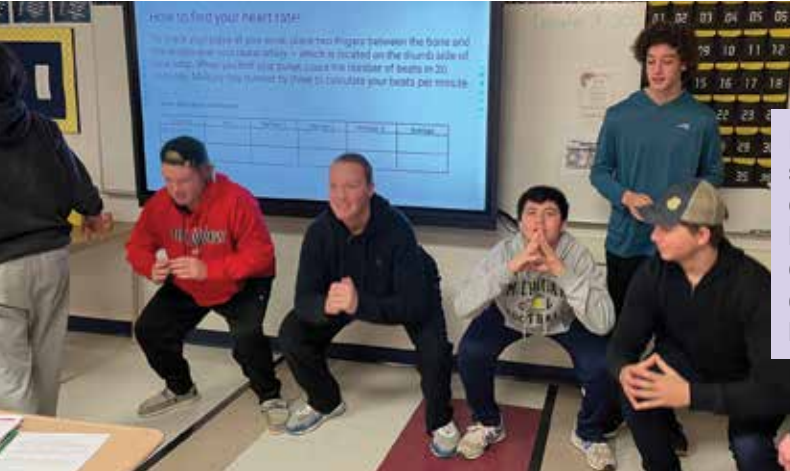
A couple of our Cadet Teachers worked on making doors for their students at Village.

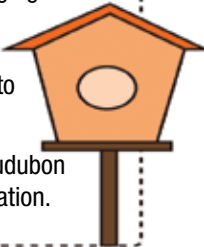
Hartland Audubon Nature Club

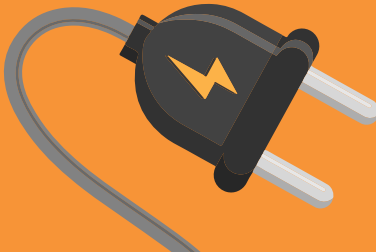

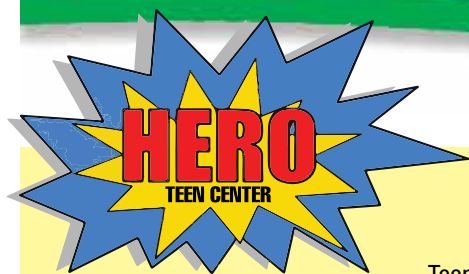

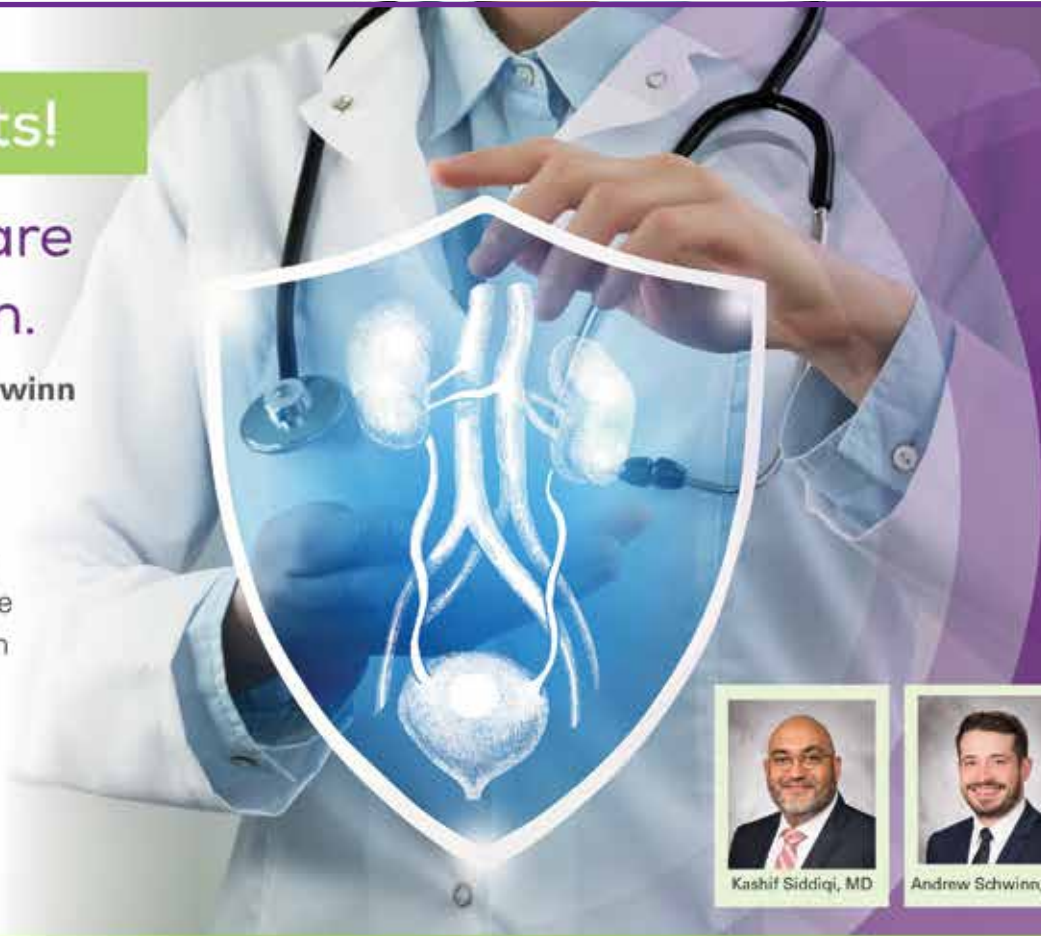
