There is much that goes into preparing for meetings such as the homework that both the board and administration must do to ensure that all parties have the information necessary to confidently make decisions. seem to be "rubber stamping," however, the fact is that the work done between board meetings ensures that the elected officials are prepared to make decisions when the time comes to vote on a resolution before them. Therefore, you usually see items under discussion one month then as an action item the following month. This provides time for the process to occur that ensures thoughtful and deliberate decision making. It is essential that there are "no surprises" that catch the board, superintendent or administration off guard. All must be committed to building positive relationships to move the district forward.

## School Bus Safety Running Late to the Bus

DANGER ZONE

To continue to provide the safest possible transportation for your child we'd like to share the required protocol when running late to the bus in the morning.

It is required that you should either:

Call Transportation at 810-626-2175 so they can communicate with the driver, and determine a stop location where you can meet the bus

• Or, transport your student to school

Communication with the bus driver is critical in this situation. The "danger zone" surrounding the bus should never be entered without the driver expecting it. There is just too much at risk to leave anything up to assumption.

#### Following is an excerpt from the Student/Parent Handbook:

#### Bus Responsibilities of Parents

"To ascertain and insure that their children arrive at the bus stop 5 minutes prior to the bus arrival in the morning. Once the alternating lights are deactivated on the bus, they may not be reactivated and it is the parents' responsibility to transport their student to school, not another bus stop. Students or parents should never try to catch the bus once the lights have been canceled."






