November 2023 Person Of The Month: Teri Wozny



I have a bachelor's degree from Oakland University with a major in English and a minor in Sociology, and a master's degree from Madonna University in Educational Leadership.

This is my 13th year teaching at Hartland High School. Mr. Hughes interviewed me two days before my wedding in 2010, and then called during my honeymoon to invite me back for a 2nd interview! It was such an exciting time, and also the first time I had ever been to Hartland. Over

the years, I have taught English 9–12 (10 is my favorite), sociology, and most recently the cadet teaching program, which has become my passion.

If you see my family, 9 times out of 10 we will be going to or coming from a Hartland event. Not only do Mr. Wozny and I both teach at the high school, but we both also coach and volunteer a lot of our time in the community with youth sports. We have 3 children who are very active in community events as well. Paige is in 6th grade at Farms, Frankie is a 3rd grader at Creekside and Sloan is in junior kindergarten

there as well. After teaching in Hartland for a few years, we moved into the district knowing this was where we wanted to raise our family.

One memorable HCS time was being one of the 2020 class sponsors. We had to get VERY creative when it came to most things due to the pandemic. Graduation was in drive-thru form, and the distribution of caps, gowns, and yearbooks took place with the administrative team and class sponsors driving around on a bus for 3 days delivering to every single senior (in and out of district). It was a treacherous adventure, but in the end, we did the best we could for our kids, as we always do.

Why am I still here? Oh, I have only just begun. I am not even close to being done with this career. I am just where I want to be, doing just what I want to be doing. I love this community, I love these schools, I love these kids, I love my colleagues, and I love teaching.

Hartland teachers care. I have the privilege of visiting all the buildings in the district to observe my cadet teachers, and wow, our teachers are incredible! Every classroom I visit has students being loved, interacting with their peers, learning and having fun! There is laughter, there are hugs, there is structure and there is support—so much support. You can literally see the learning taking place, and it takes on so many different forms. Every school amazes me with the unique ways they incorporate interventions to meet students where they are, and it makes me proud to be a Hartland Eagle.
